**VICTOR REGNIER, FAIA**, is a teacher, researcher and architect who holds a joint professorship between the USC School of Architecture and Gerontology. Vice Dean of the USC School of Architecture, Regnier is a fellow in the American Institute of Architects, as well as the Gerontological Society, and

an ACSA Distinguished Professor. This very first SAGE Person of the Year honoree (1995) has published six books on housing for the elderly and received numerous awards for his work. Regnier’s research findings have been presented at more than 200 conferences and 60 university symposia. As an architect he has consulted on more than 400 building projects in 38 states, Canada, Germany and England.
