Built By Jack Bruno

Not much of a departure from what I usually do..... but I was inspired by some new products at my Local Hobby Shop. A long time ago I was drinking alone at Club 390 and was thinking about this vignette that centered around a Jagdpanther bogged down in a Farmer's Field. A week before this I made an order from an online shop in which I purchased 7 DRAGON/CYBERMODEL kits that all featured Magic Track. One of the kits I bought was the Mid-Production Panzer IV Ausf. J that included all the bells and trinkets for a Command Tank. What sealed the deal



was new products by JTT. The Dried Corn reminded me of the vision so over the coarse of four days I ran with it. The kit was built out of box, however, I added leftover FRUIL Track from a few previous projects. I threw in a Sherman Road wheel for good measure. Again, as my style, the entire tank was sprayed flat black. I added three different shades of dark yellow to give it depth and then sprayed VALLEJO "stencil" white. I focused the white on the center of the panel's and working outward. I wanted to show wear on the

edges away from the white so I also added some streaking Payne's Grey oil paint from WINDSOR-NEWTON with a small brush. I then glossed it over with future and gave it decals. When dry I glossed over the decals with a brush and then gave several oil washes. I also added many MIGMENTS sealed with Tamiya Thinner. I did use cotton panties to wipe off the film, after all, it is Christmas. With the Tank looking good I started work on the base. Finding one at Goodwill I mixed up



some Celluclay and added white glue for awesome stickiness......reminds me of a gal i used to date.....laying it out I build up some furrows and planted the ready made corn. After this was all dry I sprayed the ground and futured it as well. Another oil wash followed and there ya go ! Just to give it some color I added some rust Migments on the track armor. Hope Ya Like it and I hope all of you had a GREAT Holiday Season!!!! Who Loves Ya??? Why, Blue Belly ya Goose ;)







Modeling Contest

Possibly the most important aspect of any AMPS event is the Modeling Contest. As anyone who has been to the show knows, the AMPS judging system has led the way in terms of fairness and credibility. Judging is done by a group of four judges, who evaluate each entry - not by what is wrong with it, but by what is right with it! To ensure fairness, the lowest score of the four is removed, and the other three are added. There is no actual competition, the entrants are competing only against themselves using a defined schedule of values for comparison.

Experience levels are established to eliminate the intimidation factor often associated with some shows.

The AMPS Difference

Every year, people come from all over the world to experience what most consider to be the most fair and honest judging system available. As described above, AMPS judging is based on an open system, designed to reward the modeler for good work. To enable the modeler to present his most positive points to the judges, the system establishes five different classifications with which the modeler identifies himself, based on his own skill level. When the entry comes to be judged, it is reviewed to establish the skill level of the competitor and then judged accordingly.

The most common classifications are described as follows:

Junior - Specifically set up for the younger modeler, this class gives the modeler the best chance to grow in the hobby and experience the AMPS philosophy.

Basic - This group is set up for the beginner modeler, and those of us who are just getting back into modeling after a long layoff (i.e. school or family).

Intermediate - By far the largest group, it includes modelers of varying skill levels who do not regularly enter competition or do not regularly win or place.

Advanced - For the more skilled modeler, these modelers regularly win or place in local and regional competitions.

- 1. You do not have to be a member of IPMS/USA to compete. Models will be handled during judging, but the utmost care will be used to prevent any damage to models. IPMS/Phantom Phlashers do not accept or assume responsibility for loss or damage to models
- 2. Models will be judged for skill in construction, finish, realism, scope of effort, and accuracy. Any conflicts in judging will be resolved by the head judge. Judges' decisions are final.
- MODELS MUST BE THE SOLE WORK OF THE ENTRANT. Die-3. cast models are not allowed.
- Models should be entered in the appropriate category. Markings 4. will determine the category in which a model is entered. A model may not be entered in more than one category. It may, however considered for more than one special or theme award. Any guestion about the proper category for a model will be resolved by the head judge. Categories may be combined or split at the discretion of the head judge.
- 5. Models having received any award at any IPMS/USA National Convention or at a regional convention may not be entered into competition.
- A model does not necessarily have to place 1st in its category to qualify for a special or theme award but only first places models will be considered for best of awards.
- 7. Contestants must register all models prior to taking them into the contest display area. Complete all registration and entry forms and indicate any special or theme awards the model is eligible to compete for on the entry form. No registrations will be accepted after 12:00 pm. C.s.t.
- 8. Any modeler age 17 and under may compete in the junior categories. Juniors may also compete in any open category, but models so entered will not be considered for any "best junior" awards.
- Trophies will be awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each cate-9. gory. Some categories may also have awards for "out of the box" awards.
- 10. The general OOB approach is to build what came in the kit. There are some exceptions in order to allow for a more complete model: use of aftermarket decals; on aircraft, addition of rigging wires, non -photo-etched seatbelts and antennas: on military vehicles: antennas and closed sponsons; on ships, rigging and deck railings. Modelers must attach the kit instruction sheet to the entry form. Models entered without an attached kit instruction sheet will not be eligible for an out-of-the-box award.
- 11. Bases will be allowed in all categories and will not be considered in the judging except in the diorama categories. The model may include primary crew figures but the addition of any other figures or equipment outside or not attached to the model (e.g., support equipment, shell splashes, or buildings) will make the model a diorama, which must then be entered in the proper diorama category.
- two place awards in a category, but not all three. Out-of-the-Box Awards does not count towards the two possible awards (i.e., a modeler may win 1st, 3rd, and OOTB for example).
- 13. Oversized or special display requirements. Modelers entering pieces that exceed three feet in either width or length, or that require special power support or special placement, must notify the convention contest chairman at least one month in advance of the convention.
