

We had a special treat at our last meeting.
We were introduced to Brad Stoddard. Brad had a unique history with P-3 Orion's. First serving on them in the Navy, mostly with the electrical components but learning all he could about the mechanical systems. Later he worked at Lockheed on the final ones assembled at Marietta for South Korea. There he learned more about how they ticked. Later when Shane Osborne's aircraft had to make the emergency landing a Hainan Island, and the Chinese would not allow the aircraft to fly out on it's own power, he was a natural to work with disassembly and transportation of the aircraft back to Georgia for rebuilding.

He came fully prepared with a slide show of photographs, a video of the moments before the collision, and even a piece of the wing kept as a memento. We learned a lot of the back story of the incident and lots of the human story of those involved.



The Military Vehicles Preservation Association was there with of all things the nose of a WACO glid-






er and this motorcycle done up as a captured BMW taken over by the SAS. The MG 42 had a system of propone that made noise when "fired"



Tom's Ride


Our own Tom Gaston took a ride on the B-17. He says he can mark that one off his bucket list! Mike Moore and David Beckman were there to see him off!




