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SURF PATROLS AND LIFESAVING



Time is flying when you're having fun

It seems only a short while ago when I thought how long 5 months will be before we start a new season and – all of a sudden – there it is! On 25 September the new patrol season is going to kick off!

What a busy 5 months it has been since the end of the 2015-16 season with the comprehensive Winter Program of Maintenance and Repairs now complete. It included;

Repairs to our No. 2 IRB, the SSV (Side-by-Side Vehicle, not ATV anymore), a few rescue boards, Servicing of IRB engines, SSV, radios, Oxys, etc. Replacement of some equipment, e.g. a few signs and flags.

That all doesn't sound too much, but when you consider we had to do that while transitioning from a sizable club house into two 20ft containers this has been pushing the boundaries quite a few times.

The great result of all that work was that the club passed the gear and equipment inspection last weekend with flying colours. Patrol season, here we come and a big "Thank You" to everyone who helped, including our valued partners Hi Tech Marine and Practic Automotive.

Our first patrol on 25 September will be the "season induction" for Patrol Captains and Vice Captains. Your attendance is particularly important this year as we will face a lot of changes to our operations due to the fact that we will be operating in quite improvised conditions.

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SURF SPORTS



Some great results at the recent **NSW & Australian Pool Rescue Championships** in July & August at Ryde Aquatic Centre & Southport Queensland. At **State** the team of 14 athletes (U12 Holly Holmesby, Emily Gordon, U13 Isabella Ravino, Jade Timbrell U14 Zara Sharman, Kaimana Fittock, Bronte Sweeny, Georgia Green, Jade Swann U17 Timothy Gordon, Sheree Farrell, Natasha Burke , Kelsey Cresswell U19 Alexandra Smiroldo) won **38 medals (details of results on our website)**. Our relays performed strongly over the two days with our U12-13, U14-U15, U17-U19 collected medals in each discipline. The club finished 3rd in the Open Point-Score & 6th in the Youth Point-Score. Massive thank you to Scott Gordon who was the Chief Pool Setter for the event, he was in the water for the two days of competition. Thanks also to Neil Robertson from Bellambi SLSC who assisted as one of our rostered pool setters. To the mum's that each took on roles as time keepers in our allocated time slots, a big thank you. Team Manager & Coach Keith Caldwell said, " The whole team performed outstandingly over the two days. The performances were better than expected with 24 clubs contested the championships with large numbers in the younger age groups. Our team made up of 13 girls & 1 boy did the club proud, pool rescue is a good discipline to teach the kids some skills involving rescue techniques and this only makes them better lifesavers for the future. It is all about speed, skill, technique in a great range of events. Jade Swann recently joined us from another northern beaches surf club and now she has picked up her first state medal in surf life saving, how good is that to see for a young girl in team events. We have a strong history in pool rescue, it is a pathway to higher representative honours and the future is looking bright."

At Aussies over 3 days of racing by our team of 5 girls (Alexandria Smiroldo, Kelsey Cresswell, Kaimana Fittock, Zara Sharman & Holly Holmesby) picking up 1GOLD, 2 SILVER & 3 BRONZE medals along the way. Massive congratulations to Holly Holmesby who collected a full set of medals, plus Alex picking up a silver & Kaimana getting 2 bronze medals. The girls achieved 9 top 10 placing & heaps of personal best times, you can't ask for much more. Kelsey ended up swimming in a relay for NSW & Alex represented VIC at these championships both as draft athletes. Well done girls.

Congratulations to Alexandria Smiroldo who has been selected in a NSW Development Pool Rescue Team that will tour NZ competing in Auckland at the New Zealand Pool Rescue Championships from 6-10 October 2016.

Congratulations to Jeremy Woodford, Balin Munro and Max Ottaway who have been selected to attend the SLS NSW 2016 Junior Development Academy (U12-U14s) to be held during the school holidays at Sydney Academy of Sport Narrabeen.

Club Clothing/Uniforms will be available on Registration Days, with limited storage facilities this season the Uniform Shop will then only be open 8-9am Sundays and not purchased in bulk but as per items required. Arrangements can also be made with Uniform Coordinator Belinda Elliot via email to bullinippers@gmail.com Prepaid orders for Hooded Towels will also be taken on Registration Days and due back end of October.

Upcoming Education Course information can be found on **page 4 in this newsletter**. Please note Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) award will be conducted within Nippers Sunday sessions this season. Education Officer Renee Sharman can give further details or provide information on other courses available.

Update on Renovations: As many are aware our Clubhouse is under construction this summer so there will be some disruption to regular activities. With good organisation & clear communication it is hoped that there will be minimal inconvenience caused however the Committee does ask for patience & understanding from families this season. With that in mind some points to consider are:

- There will be limited parking—maybe leave the car at home where possible.
- Sunday Nippers will be setup on the grassed area front of Ruby’s car park away from the surf club construction site.
- There will be Marshalling & BBQ Tents on site instead of Clubhouse.
- Club boards will be designated to rostered age groups each week due to difficulty with storage.
- Club uniforms will not be kept onsite so arrangements need to be made with the Uniform Coordinator
- The only Change Rooms/Toilets available to Club members are the public facility below Bulli Beach Cafe.
- Any assistance with setup/pack up on Sundays would be greatly appreciated.

Though there may be some changes the Surf Club is heading in a very positive direction and although it will take some time the end product will be worth the wait. There are many volunteers working hard to provide a service and facility that will reward its members on all levels.

Surf Sports competitors An important reminder —proficiencies need to be completed asap to be eligible for participation in the upcoming Sydney Water Surf Series to be held: Saturday 29th October (Warilla) Saturday 12th November (W’gong City) Saturday 26th November (TBA) Saturday 3rd December (Shellharbour). Board Training has returned to Bulli Beach 8am Sundays. Midweek sessions have also started 4.30pm Tuesdays and Fridays. Participants to bring their own board or the one they signed out at the end of last season. If anyone else is interested & requires a board they need to contact Shawn van Duin as all gear is now in storage. It is compulsory to sign on & wearing a hi vis rash vest at training. **Water Safety** personnel need also comply & wearing hi vis orange attire. Please note that **Coaches** will also assess individual ability & members need to have completed their Surf Proficiency to be eligible to take part in this activity.

Beach Coaching will once again go ahead with day/date yet TBC. With current competitive numbers the Club is also in desperate need for qualified

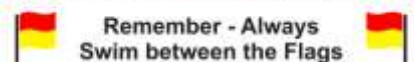
