## **Current List of Lenox School Memorabilia (As of April 2011)**

**1. Purpose.** To provide an Inventory list of the current Lenox School Memorabilia Collection for LSAA members, both for general informational purposes and so that you may review it and determine whether or not you have additional items that you may desire to donate as part of the Collection.

**2. Accuracy of the Information.** As explained below, thanks to Scott Reynolds '66, there's an accurate description of most of the items on hand. Additionally, all of the textile items have recently been inventoried and so their descriptions and quantities are accurate. Over the past several years, members have donated additional items and these have been added to the current Inventory as well. We've also added some items from the LSAA. In several instances, I have had access to memorabilia documents that members want to retain. In these cases I have made copies of them and included the copies in the Collection. However, I'm not completely comfortable that the number of extra copies of the Pen and Scrolls and particularly the Yearbooks are still accurate. Finally, there are many additional photographs, many of them originals from Pen and Scrolls and Yearbooks. All of the items in the Collection will be reinventoried and this Inventory updated by November 2011.

**3. Original Inventory and the Item Numbering System.** An original thorough Inventory of the Lenox School Memorabilia Collection was conducted by Scott Reynolds '66, while the material was in the possession of Edward Miller '66. This original inventory indicated in which of several boxes each specific item was stored and this information was subsequently used to develop a numbering system for each individual item. Over time and numerous Reunion memorabilia displays, the items were repacked into different boxes and so the numbering system lost its meaning. It was also found that there were many textile items (pennants, clothing, patches) in the Collection that were not on the original inventory. Most likely they had been on a separate inventory that had gotten separated from the Collection. Consequently, we have omitted any numbering system.

**4. Current Organization of the Inventory.** This current Inventory is organized into a more "user-friendly" and descriptive format so that you can quickly find the category that you're interested in and understand the material that we have on hand. I've also included some Lenox Memorabilia that is owned by others and kept at their locations. Finally I've provided a description of the various containers that the Collection is currently stored in. Currently, 33 items are on display at Shakespeare & Company's Founders Theater (Gymnasium) and 13 items are on display at their Bernstein Theatre (Sports Center).

**5. The Collection in the Future.** In the future, we'll work on improving the quality and organization of the stored Collection. Additionally, key historical documents, as indicated below, will be scanned, so that they're available on the LSAA website for viewing and as a backup means of storage. One day, perhaps all the Pen and Scrolls and Yearbooks will be scanned as well. We will also attempt to take pictures of all the other items, as well as creating a virtual memorabilia display so that you can view what's on display at the two theaters mentioned above. Finally, we'll attempt to catalog the many digital photographs that have been collected from various sources.

### **6. Content Overview of the Current Memorabilia Collection.**

**a. Our Intent.** I've broken down the current Collection, quickly categorized it, and provided some figures that will help you to better visualize what's on hand and work with some realistic figures. The various categories of items are provided below.

**b. Summary, By Category, of What's On Hand.** There are 695 items, including duplicates. If all duplicate copies of items (160) are eliminated, there are 535 items left. If you separate out the Pen and Scrolls, both Lenox and LSAA, and Yearbooks there are 327 remaining items.

**c. The Most Historically Significant Memorabilia Items.** Some members have asked that the truly historical memorabilia items be indicated and that special care be taken to store them and thus ensure their survival. It's hard to do this because the very nature of the Collection is to maintain one of a kind items and any such decisions become rather arbitrary. However, I've indicated my assessment of the most historically significant items with an asterisk next to it in the Inventory below. These items (137) will receive priority in the documentation and storage process, but our hope is that all items in the Collection will receive the same quality care.
