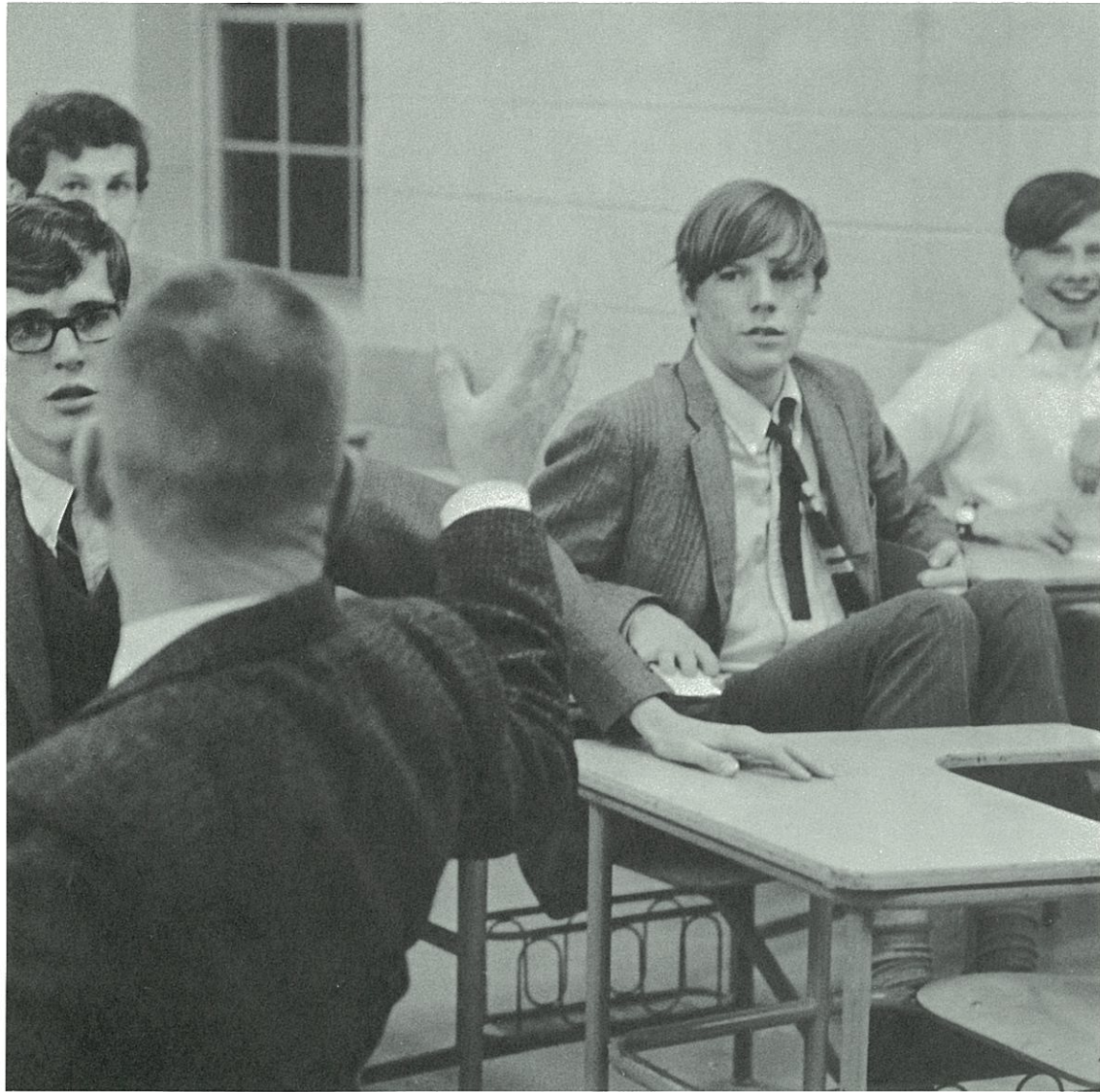
Bordentown/Lenox is a new school created in the fall of 1971 through the merger of two outstanding institutions – Bordentown Military Institute, Bordentown, New Jersey (founded in 1881) and Lenox School, Lenox, Massachusetts (founded in 1926).

It is the intent of the Board of Trustees, Headmaster and Staff that the new school, briefly described in this booklet, combine the best features of these two great schools, with continued emphasis on the spiritual, intellectual, physical, and social development of every student.

### Setting the "tone"

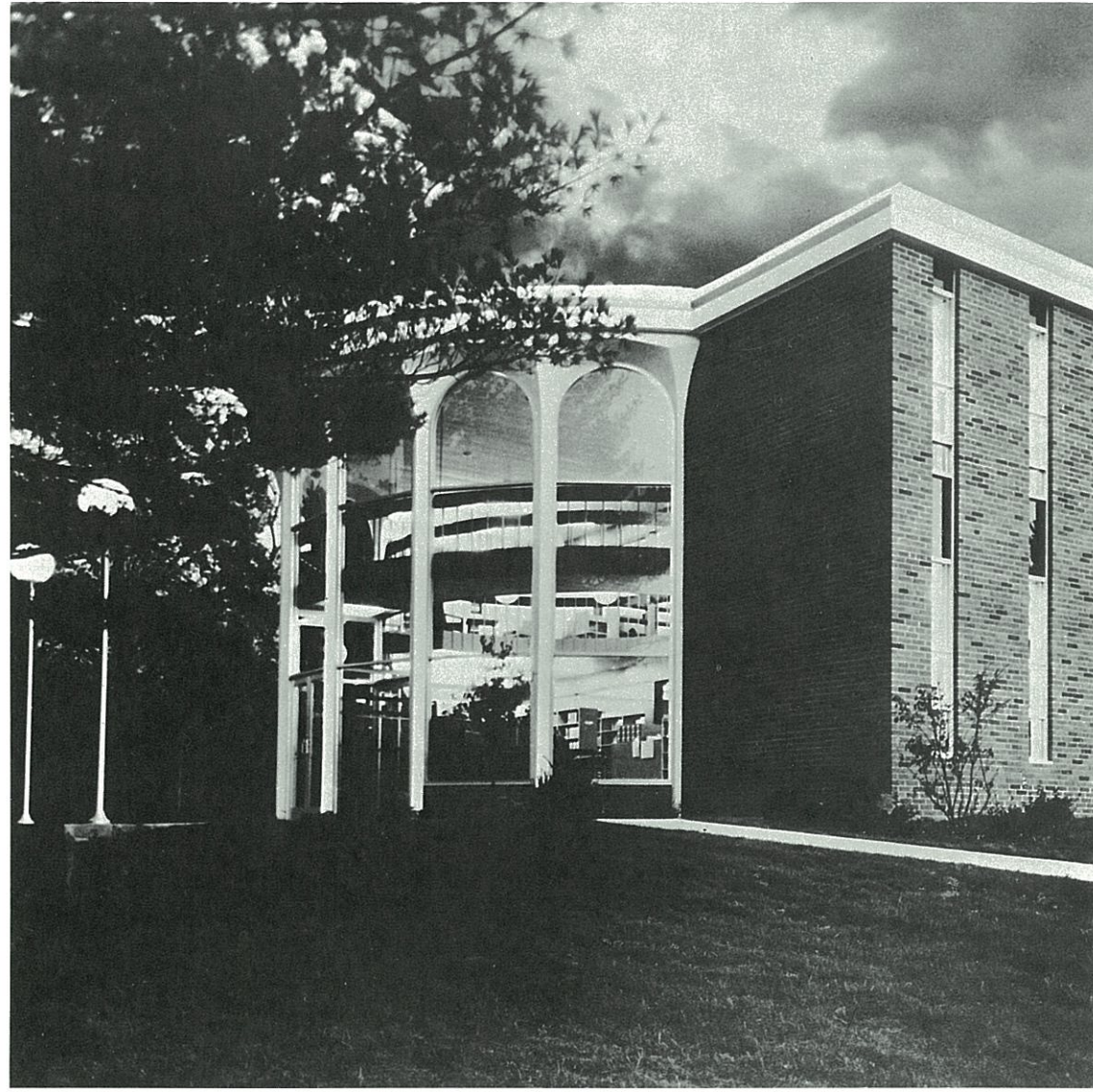
Bordentown/Lenox School is a community of people living, learning and growing together in an atmosphere of mutual trust and respect.

It is a small community, relaxed and personable in character, situated in the heart of Berkshire County, generally regarded as one of the most beautiful and exciting recreation areas in New England.

Bordentown/Lenox is more than a preparatory step to college. It is a most valuable "life experience" in and of itself. The student body is diverse. Every student is exposed to backgrounds, beliefs and customs which are sometimes quite foreign to his own.

Sensitivity to and concern for the individual spiritual development of its students constitutes the guiding force behind the Bordentown/Lenox program.

Faculty and students are encouraged to share their individual beliefs, views and customs with each other — leading to a deeper understanding of themselves as well as a more mature understanding of human relationships. The Bordentown/Lenox graduate is a wiser and more confident individual as a result of attending the School.



### A word about curriculum (coordinated with Foxhollow School for Girls)

Directed by a dedicated and enthusiastic faculty, the Bordentown/Lenox curriculum is designed to teach each student how to evaluate, relate and apply the facts he learns. The curriculum is broad and provides students with a variety of required and elective courses carefully integrated to make the process of learning enjoyable as well as effective.

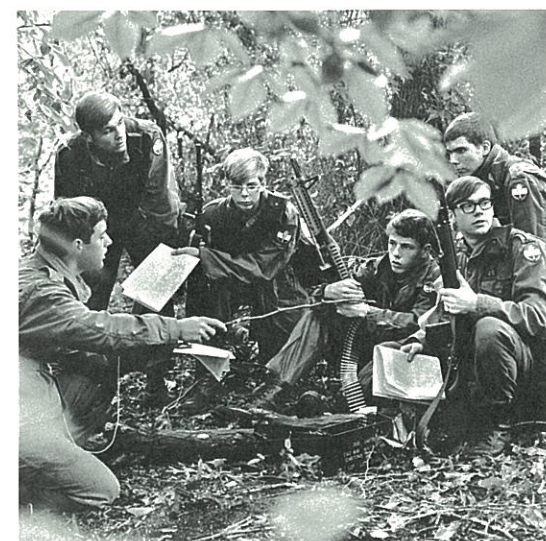
A developing program in dramatics, music, and art provides students with an opportunity to expand and refine their aesthetic inclinations as well as their ability to express themselves through a variety of media.

Our coordinated academic, social, and recreational programs with Foxhollow School for Girls (5 minutes away) bring boys and girls together on both campuses adding to the enrichment and normalcy of both student bodies.

In addition to well-equipped and comfortable classrooms, our modern 20,000-volume library provides an ideal center for study and research.

The Bordentown/Lenox campus is within easy reach of the educational, cultural and scientific resources of the Springfield-Williamstown-Albany area, an area which includes many other schools and a number of outstanding colleges.

In addition to being the summer home of the Boston Symphony Orchestra (Tanglewood), the Berkshire County area also boasts one of the highest concentrations of artists, writers, photographers and painters in the country. A number of these professionals visit the campus periodically to talk and work directly with our students.

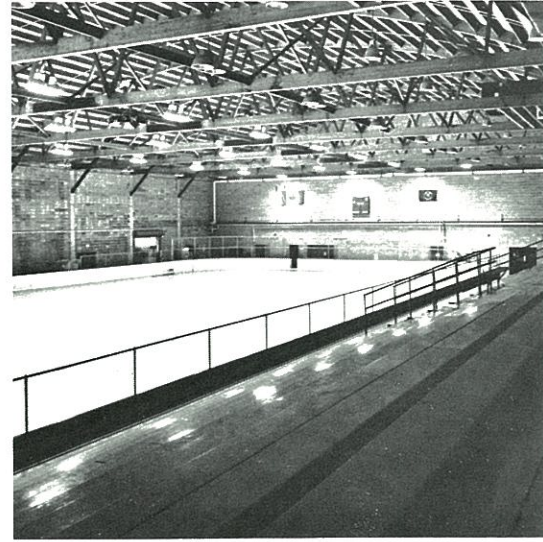


## The importance of athletics and our voluntary military programs

The Bordentown/Lenox athletic and voluntary military programs are designed to accomplish for the body what the academic program achieves for the mind – the expansion of the individual.

Be he a member of the football squad or drill team, the student learns the importance of giving of one's self (as athlete and person) to the success of the group. Learning the meaning of loyalty, commitment and the development of leadership capabilities are key by-products. Students lacking in athletic prowess and interest are encouraged to develop physically through a varied intramural program.

In addition to superb athletic fields, Bordentown/Lenox boasts a \$1.3 million dollar Sports Center unequalled by any school or college in the area. This facility houses an Olympic-size hockey rink as well as two full-sized basketball courts and space for squash and fencing facilities.



### For the "Outdoorsman"

The outdoor recreational opportunities at Bordentown/Lenox are almost infinite. The campus is surrounded by hills, lakes, streams and mountains constituting an "outdoor paradise" for students interested in skiing, canoeing, hiking, skating, fishing, cycling, riding, sailing and any number of other outdoor pursuits.

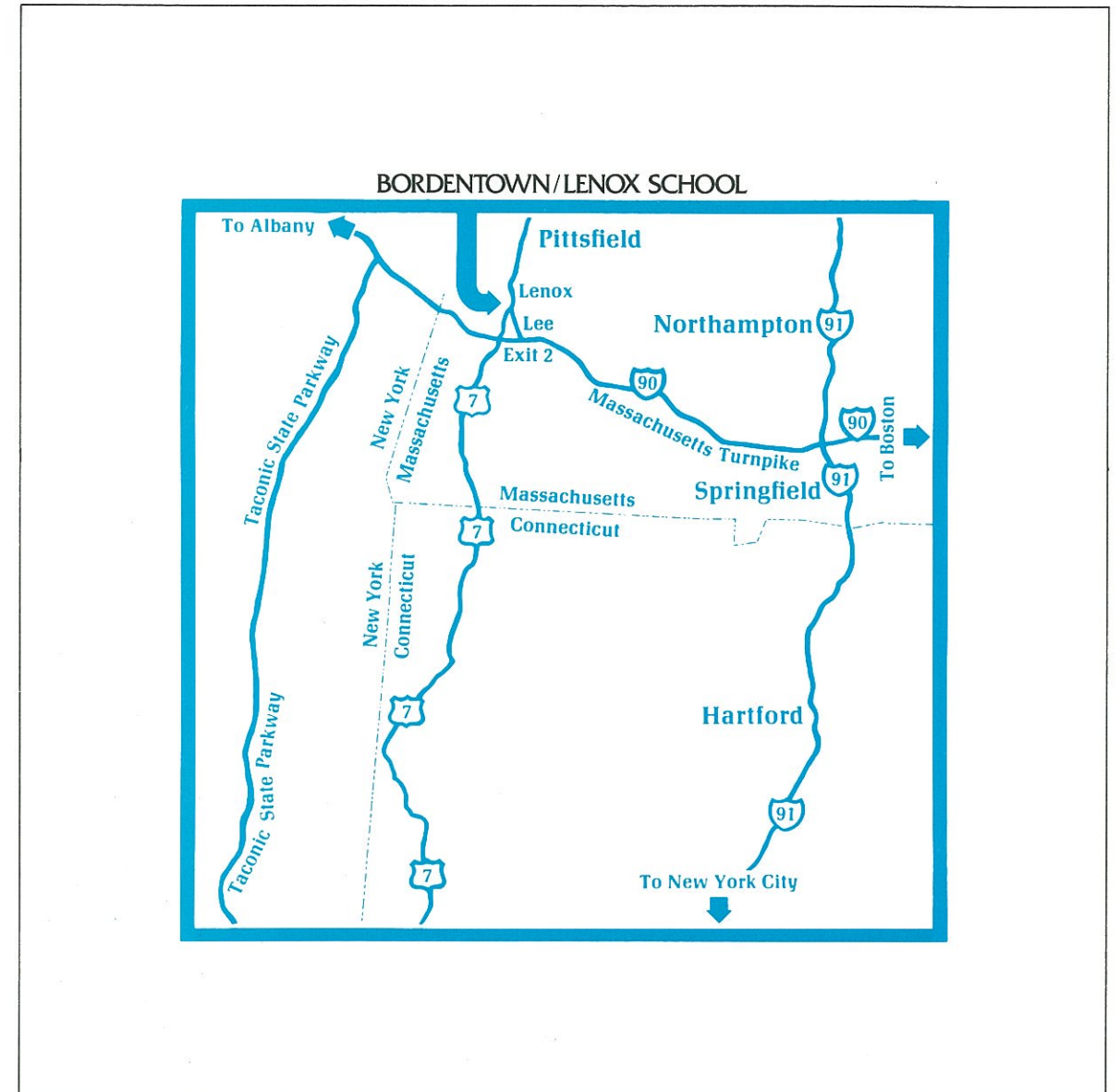
The area also provides an ideal setting for our popular "ranger" program which pits boy against nature under the skilled leadership of our staff.
