Garrett Hack to do a Weekend Seminar in October

Garrett Hack builds contemporary interpretations of Federal and other classic American styles on his farm in Thetford Center, Vermont. A furniture maker for over two decades, Garrett originally trained at Boston University's program in Artisanry. He is the author of *The Handplane Book*, (Taunton Press, 1997) and *Classic Handtools* (Taunton Press, 1999). His articles appear frequently in *Fine Woodworking*.

Here is the program schedule:

Friday, Oct. 20: Garrett will be our presenter for our monthly membership meeting at 7:30 pm in Cary High School cafeteria. He will speak on furniture design and share some of his woodworking experiences. Questions will be welcome.

Saturday, Oct. 21: A hands-on seminar on tuning, sharpening, and using hand tools, with emphasis on the hand plane. Bring your plane and any other hand tools, like chisels and saws and your sharpening stones, whatever. Also bring your questions and "problem tools". I will supply the glass plate, sandpaper, Corian plate, and diamond paste. These supplies will be yours to keep.

The seminar, which will be held in the Cary High School shop, will start at 9:00 am and end about 3:00 pm, and is limited to 20 participants. The cost, including the materials, will be \$35.00 for members.

Sunday, Oct. 22: A seminar on inlay using wood, silver, and shell. Garrett will supply the materials and we will make a small scratch stock. Also, he will demonstrate and explain bending, laminating, and working with curves. This seminar, also held in Cary High School shop, will start at 9:00 am and end about 3:00 pm, and is limited to 20 participants. The Sunday seminar cost is \$25.00. If you register for both the Sat. and Sun. seminars, the total cost will be only \$55.00.

The comments that you gave me on the survey taken at last month's meeting were used in planning these seminars. I have been on the phone with Garrett several times planning these programs for you. He and I are excited about his visit, and I am sure it will be interesting and educational. If at all possible, I would recommend that you participate in all three sessions, since there will certainly be some carryover. Bring your bag lunch to the seminars and have more time to work and talk.

To register, send or give me a check for \$35, \$25, or \$55. Garrett and I agreed on a limit of 20 participants, so registration is limited to the first 20 who register and pay.


