Ben leads over twenty furniture construction classes a year at his school, and his students turn out a wide variety of projects to include traditional chairs, tables, chests and beds.

In his presentation Ben will include planning for the project all the way through actual construction and finishing. While Ben's school uses some modern power equipment, they also concentrate heavily on the use of traditional woodworking tools and equipment. This will be both an interesting as well as useful presentation as we start thinking about all those projects around the house that we need to start work on.

Woodworking Tip

If you want to get rid of the green color present in some Poplar, just brush on a muriatic acid/water solution in a 1:4 mixture. The color changes to one that resembles a rosy cherry colored board. I've applied oil finish over this and got good results. Be sure to pay attention to the handling precautions on the muriatic acid container.
