Why Didn't Someone Think of That Before?


From Bruce Wrenn - We are all looking for simple solutions to problems. In the past couple of months I came across two items that stand out.

If you wear reading glasses in the shop to be able to see, you know it is a pain to put them on, mark your cut, take them off only to put on your safety glasses to make your cut. Then you must take off your safety glasses and put the reading glasses on again to see if you hit your mark! Wizzard Industries has solved your problems with their new Bifocal Safety Glasses. The go by the name "Shop Specs". They are safety glasses with a built in bifocal lens. They cost around \$20. Bifocal powers are +1.0, +1.5, +2.0, + 2.5 and +3.0. They are available at both the Woodcraft Store located at 6512 Glenwood Ave (919-781-1911) and The Woodworking Shop, located at 3141 Capital Blvd, (919-876-0707).

Have you ever dropped the arbor nut down in your table saw while trying to hold the washer next to the blade? Delta has solved your problem as they now make a combination arbor nut and washer. It is a one piece assembly. For right hand tilt saws it is part number 36-659, (both unisaw and contractors saws.) For left tilt saws, the part number is 36-360. Cost is about \$20.00. Once again available at both the Woodworking Shop and Woodcrafters.

2002 Auction Rules and Guidelines

The auction will be at Woodworking Shop, 3141 Capital Blvd., 0.9 mile north of the Beltline, Exit 11, with set-up starting at 6:00 pm, on Nov. 19.

The auction will be conducted by Phil Bright, a licensed professional auctioneer, and by Dick Snow, a computer expert who will record the auction proceedings on his laptop computer. They have conducted many auctions and are very knowledgeable woodworkers. We are fortunate to have their services. With the help of Phil and Dick, we have formulated the following rules and guidelines:

- 1. Each item or lot must have a potential value of at least \$10 or more. Any number of items can be combined to make a box lot. You may not bid on your own items.
- 2. Each member or guest can submit up to ten (10) items or lots.
- 3. A reserve of \$35 or more can be placed on up to two (2) lots. (A reserve is the minimum sale price you will accept for that lot. This should be used only for higher value items.
- 4. All lots will be sold as is, so the potential buyer should examine the items prior to the auction.
- 5. All lots should have some relation to woodworking: tools, materials, books, finished craft or furniture items.
- 6. There will be no premium charged. (the full sale price will go to the seller)
- 7. The purpose of the auction is to provide an opportunity for neglected items to find new homes where they will be loved, cared for, and used. The sellers and buyers will get great satisfaction and tranquility in making this adoption possible.
- 8. Some items will sell for more than you expect, and some will sell for less than you expect. Best results are obtained by submitting many items and the law of averages will be on your side.
- 9. It is strongly recommended that you pre-register your "sell items". This will help Dick Snow to get the items into his computer. Items will be sold in the order they are registered. Phil Bright tells us that the early items sell better and bring a better price. A preregistration form is included in this newsletter.

7:45 pm (approximately) Start of auction. If possible, try to pay for items purchased by check, but cash will be accepted.
