

Table Saw Workshop Saturday January 25, 2002

TWA will be having a workshop on the table saw on January 25, 2003. We will be tuning up two different types of table saws. One will be a contractor's saw and the other will be a cabinet saw. We will cover blade alignment with the miter slot and fence, and reducing vibration. We will show how to make zero clearance inserts. We will cover making a cross cut sled (panel cutter for you "Normites"). Tips and techniques will be covered with an emphasis on safety.



Newsletter Drive

If you have not already been contacted, you will be soon! We are trying to convert all members with access to email to switch to the electronic version. Mailing a hardcopy of the newsletter costs \$12/year, at today's prices. Electronic receipt allows you to receive the newsletter earlier, in color and also receive a discount on your annual dues. It also enables you to receive periodic special notices that may expire before publication of the next newsletter. We currently have about 120 members receiving hardcopy. If 50% of those switched to email, we would save over \$700/year in direct costs alone. Please seriously consider switching to electronic receipt.

Concerned with printing or viewing the electronic newsletter? Some members experience occasional problems with viewing or printing the newsletter and as a result elect to change to hardcopy. In the event you experience such problems, ensure you have the most recent version of Adobe Reader installed on your machine. Adobe Reader is a FREE software program that allows you to read documents with a PDF extension. (Ex: Newsletter.PDF). The program may be downloaded from www.adobe.com. You should also ensure you have the most recent drivers for your printer. This is especially important if you have recently upgraded or significantly changed your computer, yet kept the same printer you had before. If all else fails, please send an email to trianglewoodworkers@yahoo.com describing your system, and the error message or problem you receive. I will do everything possible to help you to the best of my knowledge. We have in excess of 100 members currently receiving the newsletter electronically. Try it—you'll like it!
