Special Date and Special Meeting and Workshops this Month

Friday, January 16th meeting. Veneering -- Darryl Keil

Veneer is increasingly popular for the wide selection of wood species and figures it offers the furniture maker and for the design freedom it brings by diminishing the constraints of wood movement. As woodworkers, we need to acquire the skill to transform veneer from its raw state into beautiful, finished panels. As we proceed, you will learn about basic book matching, four-way matching and radial matching, and short-grain borders in straight and circular patterns. In addition, you will learn to know the tools and techniques involved in creating different types of inlay. The Friday meeting will introduce the subject and the workshops will allow you to start developing needed skills.

Darryl Keil is a leading expert on veneer work. He has made two excellent videotapes on the subject, *Working With Veneer* and *Working in a Vacuum*, and writes for *Fine Woodworking*. Darryl began making furniture in 1976 and was a pioneer in the application of vacuum pressing technology to woodworking. His company, Vacu-Pressing Systems, operates out of Brunswick, Maine. Sunday, January 18th workshop Veneering the Next Step. Darryl will continue four-way matching and proceed with inlay, short-grain borders, twelve-way matching. Techniques for making curved panels, as well as advanced vacuum bagging of shaped parts, will also be covered. Toys for Tots Program

For the year 2003, TWA provided 1508 toys to the Marines and 230 to Triangle Family Services. In addition, we have over 800 toys waiting for final sanding and finishing that we will use for the 2004 project. I feel that 2003 was a very successful year. The only weak area was the lack of publicity.

The following groups helped make the toys: TWA- Five workshops, two at Home Depot with at least 40 volunteers. In addition, some TWA members made toys at their own shop. I also had some volunteers help at my shop in addition to the TWA workshops.

Senior's group Millbrook Exchange Raleigh Parks) - Two workshops at the Millbrook Exchange Community Center. 12-18 volunteers.

APO Fraternity from NC State - One Saturday workshop with 6 volunteers.

Aldern Academy from Pittsboro/Siler City- Three Saturday workshops with 37 students and staff. (Note-This is about a 100 mile round trip.)

Enloe High School Students (Community Service hours) - Three Saturday workshops with about 10 students.

Wake Forest Boys and Girls Club - One Saturday workshop with 10 young people plus 1 advisor.

YMCA Indian Princess Tribe from Cary - Sunday workshop with 6 girls and 5 fathers.

Triangle Family Services Volunteers - Three Saturday workshops with 2 to 6 volunteers.

Grades 3 to 5 Christ Church Sunday school - Sunday workshop 33 students plus 6 adults.

I had other groups that were interested, but I ran out of Saturdays and Sundays.

Every toy was either painted or varnished. This requires extra work but is worth it. I will probably have a workshop in February or\and March for some of the groups that missed the fall workshops.

Drill Doctor— Special Price for TWA Members

For those of you with better memories than I, you probably recall Bruce Wrenn's endorsement of the Drill Doctor as a way to not only keep bits sharp, but also help lower the cost of our hobby. I was curious, but not until recently did I have the opportunity to try one. In this case it was a Drill Doctor, Model 400.

Resisting all normal male tendencies, I took the time to view the video and read the instructions. I had no problem setting up the bits for sharpening. My first attempt was an old dull 1/8th inch bit, that came out fine. After several others, I decided to see what it could really do. I took another broken-off bit, and put it in the machine. This time it took two attempts, but I now have a usable, if not, short bit.

Wood Source


TWA member Jim Wheeler submitted this find:
