April Meeting – Furniture Construction

Garrett Hack has been a furniture maker and one horse farmer in Thetford Center, Vermont since the late seventies. He specializes in making contemporary interpretations of Federal style furniture with an emphasis on delicate and graceful design, understated surface decorations and a complete dedication to superior joinery and craftsmanship. He is a Contributing Editor for Fine Woodworking Magazine, the author of The Handplane Book (Taunton Press, 1997) and Classic Hand Tools (Taunton Press, 1999) and teaches at a number of woodworking schools throughout the country.

Annual Dues Changing

February Executive Board Meeting

February's board meeting brought about several changes that will affect club members this year. To help offset increased operating costs, dues were raised and a seller's premium will be introduced at the club's annual tool auction.

Furthermore the board accepted a challenge to increase membership by nearly 25% to 250 members, over the upcoming year. A summary of the key changes from the meeting is as follows:

Sponsors Committee. Bill Anderson will assume the committee chair.

Program Committee. The Program Chair will continue to oversee all club workshops, activities and special workshops. Suggestions for programs will be welcomed as long as the "suggestor" is willing to provide the labor as well.

Memberhip Goals. TWA has set a goal of 250 members (up from about 192) to improve our bottom line. There were no concrete suggestions on how to achieve this goal, however.

Membership Dues. TWA dues will be increased to \$35 for all members effective July 2006.

Newsletter Discount. TWA will allow a \$5 discount on membership dues for those who receive the newsletter by email.

Auction. TWA will apply a 10% seller's premium to all items auctioned at the November meeting tool auction.

USDA Wood Properties Information

Every once and a while the government really DOES provide useful, free information for us common folk! Recently I was directed to the USDA website where information was provided concerning the properties of wood. It's intended audience was for Dry Kiln Operators. The document is titled: Dry Kiln Operator's Manual. Agric. Handbook AH-188. William T., ed. 1991.

Chapter number one contains information about how wood dries, includes a wood "biology" lesson including information on hardwoods, softwood, structural features of wood, how wood dries, shrinkage, various charts and graphs and even formulas to calculate shrinkage.


Repairing Router Chipout




When routing a profile along the edge of a board, what can you do when the bit chips out a large piece of wood? If you're lucky and can find the broken-off chip, you can glue it back in place. But more often than not, the chip has been splintered or sucked into your shop vacuum. My solution is like the trick an old greenskeeper uses on a nasty divot. First the "bad" section is actually enlarged out to the undamaged area. Then the area can be patched with a new piece to fit the hole.

Here are three easy steps for making this same kind of repair on a bad case of chipout.


1. Using a straight bit in the router table, rout a stopped rabbet along the damaged edge. This will remove the chipout and create a straight edge for accepting a filler strip.



2. Cut an oversize filler strip to fit into the rabbet. Round one end to match the curve of the rabbet (where the bit stopped). Then glue this filler strip in place and sand or plane the top surface flush.



3. Now the original profile can be routed in the filler strip. (Hopefully without chipout this time.)



If you use a filler strip that matches the color and grain pattern of the damaged wood, the repair will be practically invisible.




