Minutes of Meeting October 16, 2007

The meeting was held at The Woodworking Shop Capital Blvd and was opened by president Fred Ford at 7.30. There were 37 members present and no new members or visitors were introduced.

Fred mentioned that there would be another Toys for Tots workshop on November 3 at Diane Eckland's shop at Creedmoor to finish up several items. Also Bill Anderson's workshop was this coming Saturday when jigsaw puzzles would be painted prior to cutting out. No artistic experience would be necessary and a local artist would be on hand for advice.

Rick Cornell told us that fellow member Hugh Fish had won the Blue Ribbon Best in Show prize at the State Fair for his tilt top regency tea table. We had the privilege of seeing this piece during the club's recent show and tell meeting. Members applauded Hugh for his achievement.

Bill Anderson told us about a class he would be offering on Novemer 27 on hand cut dovetails and planing techniques.

Charlie Main related some problems he experienced recently with a Grizzly dust collection system and recommended we wait for Grizzly to sort out their problems before using them.

Brian Wagner introduced our featured speaker, Chuck Spinelli, of J&S Tool Repair. This company, owned by Chuck and his father, has contracts with several tool manufacturers/suppliers for warranty repairs and the speaker concentrated mainly on compressors and associated pneumatic tools and on electrical supply systems for personal workshops.

Mr. Spinelli regaled us with many anecdotes relating to the incorrect installation and usage of compressors and tools as a means of highlighting the importance of proper

selection of compressor capacity for the duty envisaged and similarly with the selection of appropriate electrical cable size for our workshops and home installations. Especially important was the regular lubrication of pneumatic tools and he recommended the use of Marvel Mystery Oil as a repair shop secret.

Mr Spinelli (below) was thanked for an amusing and informative presentation and the meeting adjourned at 9.10.

2007 Auction Rules and Guidelines

The auction will be at The Woodworking Shop, 3141 Capital Blvd., 0.9 mile north of the Beltline, Exit 11, with set-up starting at 6:00 pm, on Nov. 20, 2007. The auction will be conducted by Phil Bright, a retired professional auctioneer, and by Dick Snow, a computer expert, who will record the auction proceedings on his laptop computer. They have conducted many auctions and are very knowledgeable woodworkers. We are fortunate to have their services. With the help of Phil and Dick, we have formulated the following rules and guidelines:

1. Each item or lot must have a potential value of at least \$10 or more. Any number of items can be combined to make a box lot. You may not bid on your own items.
2. A member can submit up to eight (8) items or lots.
3. A minimum bid (reserve) of \$35 or more can be placed on up to two (2) lots. (A reserve is the minimum sale price you will accept for that lot). This should be used only for higher value items that are expected to sell for at least \$35.
4. All lots will be sold as is, so the buyer should examine the items prior to the auction.

5. All lots should have some relation to woodworking: tools, materials, books, finished craft or furniture items.
6. There will be a 10% buyer's premium charged. The full sale price will go to the seller, but the buyer will be assessed an additional 10% that will go to the club to help defray costs associated with the auction and as a means to help generate funds for the club.
7. To make the auction manageable, there is a limit of 80 lots. If your registration does not make the cut, you will be notified to NOT bring your items.
8. All items must be registered with Dick Snow, and should be mailed by November 8. This will help you in your planning, and will allow Dick to have everything recorded in his computer and ready to go at the auction. Items will be numbered and sold in the order which they are received by Dick. Phil tells me that early items sell better and bring a better price.
9. Only current member of TWA are permitted to participate (buy or sell) in the auction.
10. Send your pre-registration form to Dick Snow (see form for details). It must be in his hands by November 14.
11. All auction items **MUST BE PRE-REGISTERED!** We use a computer generated inventory list that is printed prior to the meeting. We are unable to add items to it. Please help to make this an enjoyable experience for all!
12. If you have questions, call me, Ed Karolak, at 919-383-4233. The time schedule at the auction site will be the following:

If possible, try to pay for items purchased by check, however, cash will be accepted. No Credit cards.
