#### **Specialty Plane Skills and Techniques**

Dates: June 7-8

Cost: \$160

Learn and use the many types of rabbet planes, router plane, shoulder, tongue and groove, dado, and molding planes to cut and fit joinery, modify existing profiles and to apply decorative edging on your workpiece. We will explore how to tune up, set up and sharpen these tools. Students who have taken the Bench Planes workshop will make a simple wall hung shelf from lumber dimensioned in that workshop.

#### **Handtool Sharpening**

Dates: July 19

Cost: \$80

Hands on experience with a range of sharpening media (waterstones, oil stones, sandpaper, etc) and techniques to sharpen planes blades, chisels, spokeshaves, curved bladed tools and other handtools. Bring your own tools or special problem tool to be sharpened.

#### **Sharpening Handsaws**

Dates: July 20

Cost: \$80

Hands on experience sharpening rip and cross cut handsaws. We will explore the anatomy and purposes of various types of handsaws, how to clean up and restore handsaws. We will look at various types of jigs and gauges useful for sharpening, and evaluate different types of sawsets.

#### **All About Grooved Joinery**

Dates: July 27

Cost: \$80

Learn the techniques to design and layout dados, rabbets, beads, and tongue and groove joinery using such handtools as handsaws, chisels, rabbet planes, matched tongue and groove planes, router planes, shoulder planes, molding planes and scratch stock.

## Item of Interest

### **Loose Screws?**

#### **Fix-em!!!**

Screws are a lot harder than wood and it doesn't take much vibration or stress for them to begin to work their way out of the wood.

Rather than replacing the screw with a larger one, try this. Insert a few tooth picks and a little glue into the hole. The tooth picks should help tighten up the hole and re-secure the screw.

In the picture we have put some glue in the stripped-out hole and inserted a few toothpick pieces. When the glue dried the lag screw was as tight as when it was new.

Note: In more severe cases you might need to re-drill the hole, tap in a glue-covered dowel, and then drill a new pilot hole in the dowel for the screw.





The annual Midwest Tool Collectors Association (MWTCA) meeting will be held at Ed Hobbs' Farm in Raleigh on Saturday July 26 2008. As in the past, all TWA members that are not MWTCA are invited to attend. Over 250 people attended in 2007.

For those of you who may not be aware, MWTCA is for more than just tool collectors. M-WTCA offers everyone who is interested in antique/traditional hand tools an opportunity to learn more about tools, to buy and sell tools and to interact with others that share this interest.

This year's meeting will begin officially, rain or shine, at 8 AM (some early birds will get here at day-break) with tool buying/selling/trading. We will have about 45 dealer tables set up under a tent and an equal number of people tailgating under the shade trees. You will be able to find a wide variety of antique and traditional tools for sale at reasonable prices. Coffee, donuts, water and soft drinks will be served in addition to lunch.

A program of interest will be held beginning at 10 AM. After the program, there will be a good old catered pig picken with all the fixings.

When lunch is over, there will be a tool auction open to everyone with tools brought that morning. Each tool must have at least a \$15 value. We typically have about 100 or so tools including many "user" grade tools. There is no buyer's premium.

Our policy for guests is to allow them to attend for \$15 for one time to see what goes on and to find out about the benefits of belonging to MWTCA. If you have attended as a guest before and wish to attend again as a guest you are welcome, however, you will be charged the full meeting cost of \$20. Also, please note that beginning this year there will be a \$5.00 late registration fee added for anyone that has not pre-registered.

To ensure we have adequate food, beverages and facilities, we are again requiring pre-registration. Please complete the form below and send it in so it is received by July 14. To get to the farm, take Exit 299 (Lake Wheeler Rd) off of I-40/440 in Raleigh. Go out of town. You will go about 2 miles and cross over Tryon Rd. Continue on Lake Wheeler Rd for  $\frac{3}{4}$  mile then turn left on Inwood Rd. Go  $\frac{3}{4}$  mile and farm is on left. Please park on the road.
