Ultimate Chicken Burritos

Arrange a DIY burrito bar complete with shredded chicken, rice, beans, cheese and avocado, and let your family build their ultimate wraps



Ingredients

Mojo Sauce:

- ...4 garlic cloves
- ...2 serrano chilies, seeds removed
- ...1 large handful fresh cilantro leaves
- ...Juice 2 limes
- ...Juice 1 orange
- ...1/2 cup extra-virgin olive oil
- ...Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
- ...8 large flour tortillas
- ...1 (3 to 4 pound) whole roasted chicken, shredded
- ...Yellow Rice, recipe follows
- ...Spicy Black Beans, recipe follows
- ...2 avocados chopped
- ...l cup grated queso blanco or Monterey jack cheese
- ...Sour cream, for garnish
- ...Cilantro leaves, for garnish
- ...Lime wedges, for garnish

Directions

Make the Mojo Sauce: Put the garlic, chilies, cilantro, lime juice, orange juice, and olive oil into a blender and process until smooth. Taste and adjust seasoning with salt and pepper.

To make the burritos: Warm the tortillas for 30 seconds in a dry skillet or on the grill until pliable. Place some chicken down the center of a tortilla and top with rice and beans, avocado, grated cheese, and Mojo Sauce. Roll up the burrito and serve topped with a generous drizzle of sour cream; garnish with cilantro leaves and a squeeze of lime juice.
