MEMBERS CORNER


This month is the second in a series of interviews with some of our TWA members including a few pictures of their woodworking workshop and projects.

Below is a Question (Q) and Answer (A) with long time TWA member and TWA Treasurer, Hugh Fish.



A. My hometown is Clarence, NY, but I have lived in seven states since we left NY. My father was a contractor/carpenter and my mother was a bookkeeper. I grew up in a very poor family of six children. We grew our own food and each one of us had responsibilities for tending the garden and picking fruit and vegetables. I attended college in St. Petersburg, Florida. After college I joined the US Air Force where I learned electronics. I joined IBM after the USAF and worked my way up from a computer technician to a Brand Manager of Switching Products. I retired from IBM in 1996 after 30 years. I am a very active biker (bicycles) and marathoner which I still pursue aggressively.

Q. How long have you been interested in woodworking? **A.** 40 years



Q. What got you interested in working with wood? **A.** My father, being a carpenter, often took me to work with him where I gained appreciation for working with my hands. I bought several furniture kits before I had my own tools and

a shop. The kits were from Emperor Clock and Bartley. I still have all of those pieces; about ten in all.

Q. How would you describe your woodworking interests or speciality?

A. I build mostly Early American reproductions, often in the Shaker style and early New England furniture with John

Townsend as someone I admire and try to copy. I do some wood turning (bowls and platters) just for fun.






Q. What are your favorite woodworking projects?

A. I have built a corner chair, a Townsend highboy and a tilt-top table which are my favorites.

Q. What awards or special recognizations have your woodworking projects received?



Q. What or who has influenced your woodworking interests? **A.** My father and just a deep appreciation for Early American furniture.

Q. What woodworking publications do you most frequently refer to or read?

A. Fine Woodworking and Popular Woodworking.

Q. Describe your workshop: (Eg., Location, Size, Significant power tools, Important hand tools, Jigs frequently used, What is unique or unsual about your shop)

A. My workshop is an extension on the back of my garage. My homeowners association has rules against separate structures so I had to extend my garage to have a dedicated shop. It is the size of a single car garage; 24 x 12 feet. A well-equipped shop that contains a contractors saw, lathe, jointer, planer, wide belt sander, mortiser, oscillating spindle sander, band saw, drill press and a sharpening station. The dust collector is in my garage with a hole into the shop wall. Hand tools

are drills, hand sanders, belt sander, plate joiner, many routers, and a jig saw. All hand tools are DeWalt and Porter-Cable: all machines are Delta or Jet. I tend to make jigs as I need them so

Q. Why is membership in TWA important to you?


A. Each meeting I learn something new.
