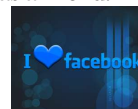

## Message from our Membership Chairman

### **Program:**

Our presenter was Jim Oleson: Bent tapered laminations (visit [jro-furnituremaker.com](http://jro-furnituremaker.com)), Jim has a 40 year history furniture making, even though his workshop remains a 2 car garage. Furniture initially linear then curved--one great curve deserves another or demands another!

Curves come from steam bending, stacked laminations, and torsion box form, Jere Osgood is a proponent of tapered bent laminations. See the Penland book of woodworking, in our library. Jim walked us through a slideshow of his quite amazing furniture. He also walked us through the advantages of the laminations.

Design process: ideas generated then a scale drawing is made. He has a couple useful tools for shaping, such as the drawing bow (Leigh Valley Tools). Need bending form then sled to cut leg. Use masonite on the bending form surface.

Laminates are cut on the bandsaw, and must be jointed and sanded prior to gluing. Jim uses urea formaldehyde powder bond. Use a mask when working with the powder. Many clamps are used to glue the laminates. Put the pieces between the block and the caul. For double tapered bent laminations cut the uniform laminates on the table saw.

Jim was very informative and inspiring.. One tip, use straight grained wood. Air dried wood is better for steam bending. Yellow glue is too plastic to use for this technique.

# Toys for Tots

## Status Report by Fred Ford

I am glad to report we have two more private workshops in full production. Alex Knittel and Jim Rhodes are both reporting they have their workshops supporting the children of the area again.

Alex and Jim are both long time supporters of the TWA Toys for Tots Program. Thanks Alex and Jim.

If you are planning to make a toy or more please let me know so that I can add you to my **status table**.

All other workshops are now fully staffed, however if you are deciding to reach out and help the increasing number of children in need and want to join a workshop call me and I will absolutely fit you in. Last month I reported we had 44 people filling 192 workshop days. This month we have 53 people filling 251 workshop days. This is a 31% increase, but there is still a little room if you want help out a child in need and have some fun at the same time.

We are now in the full production phase. There is much sawdust in the air. I hope we do not get raided by EPA.

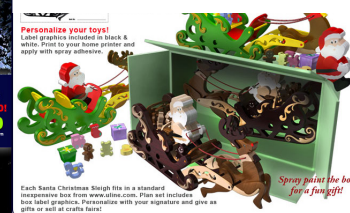
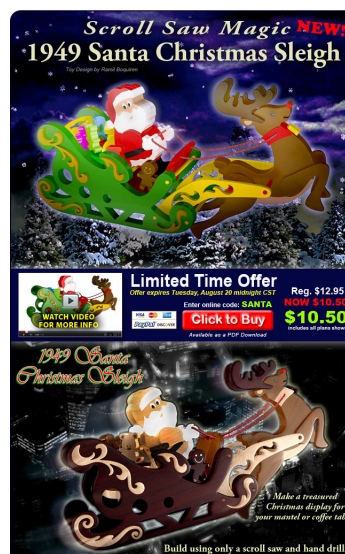

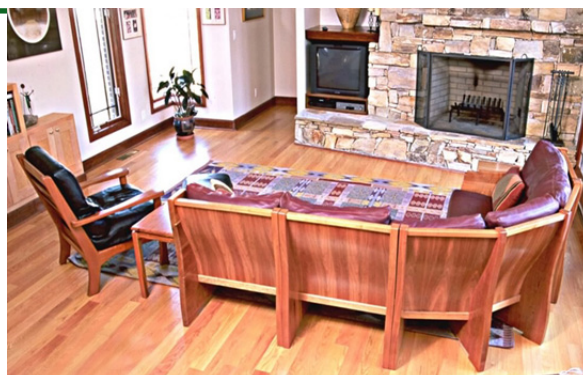
