April 18th – **Friday** **Design Process**

Garrett **H**ack is a contributing editor to *Fine Woodworking* magazine. He also builds furniture and works his farm in Vermont. He is the author of *The Handplane Book* (Taunton Press, 1997) and *Classic Hand Tools* (Taunton Press, 1999). TWA is happy to have Garrett return for another presentation and weekend workshop. He is one of America's foremost teachers of woodworking skills, teaching at schools and clubs around the country. He also has done numerous videos for FineWoodworking.com. In his Friday evening presentation, Garrett will talk about his design process. He will touch on what makes a design good – or bad. Visit his website at GarrettHack.com to learn more about this gifted furniture maker.

April 19th-20th – **Workshop** **Furniture Details: Decorative Edges and Faces**

This workshop will give you a chance to experiment with making and using decorative inlays that can be added to your next piece of furniture. You will also learn how to add details to edges and cuffs to legs. From Garrett's description: "Each day we will demonstrate a technique and make some of the necessary tools. We'll talk about ways to use each detail and variations that are possible. Most of the day will be yours to work on a sample board of decorative details. We will also work on edge details. The most important place we will start is with smoothing a surface to a polish right off the plane. This leads to chamfers and edge details — chamfers at different angles and ones that grow or shrink as they move around an edge, underbevels, molded edges, and if we have time, an inlaid edge."



The workshop will be held at Alan Campbell's workshop in Garner. Cost is \$75 for the weekend. This workshop is \$250 at the Lie-Nielsen facility, so take advantage of a great opportunity.

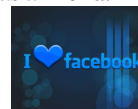

Meeting Minutes

March
2014

Diane Philyaw our president opened the meeting promptly. We had a number of visitors and welcomed several new members today.

Announcements:

Diane requested a volunteer to check the TWA e-mail 2-3 times a week. Bob Gabor volunteered to do this for the club.

Diane apologized for her tardiness in getting out the newsletter, but Bernie praised our newsletter, commenting that it is very professional.

Paul Rolfe announced that last weekend Klingspoor hosted the NC carving festival and considered it a successful event. The 2014 (Klingspoor) woodworking festival will be September 6th. There is no conflict with any other local events. Paul requested volunteers to help with the show (planning & executing). He also wants participation with entries from club members. Because there was not a show last year he has great hope's for local production this year! MANY categories. Our organization is also asked to help with the format of the brochures. Registration forms for the show will be available soon, after a committee meets to develop categories. TWA and NC Woodworker's are participants.

Paul also announced that the Woodworker's of NC gallery is closing. Any items in the gallery not sold or picked up by their owners by the time the gallery is closed will be auctioned off. This will be in the near future. Included in the sale are the large slabs (one Ginko is over 50 inches wide) of wood placed around the Klingspoor store.

Cecil Raynor announced that he has some planer blades for a DeWalt 375 13" planer to donate to the auction. Pete Bucky was not in attendance but will receive them later.

In another club business note some Pinewood Derby cub scouts sent us a check for \$100 for Toys for Tots, as a thank you for help from they received from TWA members.

Bernie Bogden brought in a kaleidoscope for repair.

Garret Hack is coming next month, see Jeff Leimberger if you are interested in his workshop. It will be 2 days (decorative details) and held at Allen Campbell's shop in Garner. Jeff will send a list of needed tools to all registered participants. (Need to bring #3 or #4 hand plane). **APRIL IS A FRIDAY MEETING.**

Mark Keglur is looking for subtenants for his shop that need a relatively small amount of space (400-800 sq. feet).

Program:

Kerry Hudson spoke to us about furniture production, he unveiled a few pieces to show us that were very sculptural.

Kerry is from Florida, and moved to Chapel Hill about 7 years ago. His shop space is on 54 (in White Cross) with some other artists. His education is in creative writing. He is currently producing pieces for galleries and museums, although he used to make quite a lot of larger pieces and traveled the circuit of weekend craft shows. He is interested in the creative processes. He started his slide show with one of the Monet canvasses of waterlillies. He is interested in exploring different media, and exhibited some of his pieces. They are always evolving. His commentary on the photographs of his pieces was entertaining, but you had to be there! Some of his pieces are based on the material he comes across randomly and some require planning in advance. He uses volcanic rock (used in landscaping) often. It would be beneficial to visit his website to view the variety of shapes he creates. He also has made a series of drums. Which people have turned into tables for their living rooms. One just can't hide his work away. He is proficient in chair production too. Some of his woods are exotic, he recommends bleaching Wenge on occasion with chlorox. (Stop the bath with vinegar). Bleached Holly looks like ivory. He makes his drawings on the computer using Illustrator-these can be printed out full sized. He has done some kinetic work too, creating stationary wall hangings and wall hangings that rotate on a bearing. Many of us found those to be fasinating. He is fond of using "found" items and tying them into his pieces.

His latest work is more sculptural, and will stand on it's own!

A skill like woodworking takes years and thousands of hours to become more than just proficient, but this man invested that time to be a certifiable master. His name is Randall Rosenthal and he has talent that can result in mind-bending illusions. The project in the gallery below all started with three pieces of white pine he glued together. What he turned that block of wood into is so cool. He glued the pieces of pine together as a base.



Once the adhesive cured, he was ready to begin carving the block.



He slowly whittled it down into an interesting shape.



By chipping away at the block of wood and hollowing out different sections, he was able to create the illusion that it was a box containing something.



He spent hours carefully carving the sides to give the illusion of corrugated cardboard.



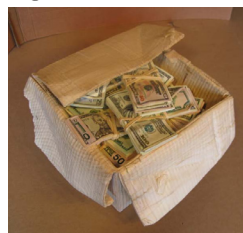
The effect was incredible.



He took a break from the hours of carving to begin adding paint to the piece. He carefully painted what was to be inside of the box: stacks of money.



Not only is Randall a gifted woodworker, but his painting skills are incredible as well. After being painstakingly careful painting the bills and their details, he began slowly adding color to the cardboard.



Since "cardboard" isn't something you can paint on in one sitting, he had to add light, washed out layers over and over.



He was able to carve something with so much depth and texture out of a simple block of wood. The finished product, 'Old Money', is incredibly realistic. A Japanese TV station interviewed Randall because of this incredible work. Old Money was such a hit, he is being commissioned to make a second box. The finished product, a real wood carving is an awesome illusion. No matter how long I stare at Old Money, it just looks like a cardboard box full of money.
