TWA GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING—JULY 18, 2017

JIGS AND FIXTURES— MICHAEL PEELE

(meeting minutes: Janet Batker)

Terry introduced our speaker and member Michael Peele so he could share his tips regarding making woodworking efficient. Michael began woodworking in 1954, after receiving a Christmas gift of some tools. He was attracted to Industrial Arts in school. Jiggery and Such is the official title of the the talk, which leads to the question of whether what you are using is a jig, a fixture or a template. A jig guides a tool, a template is the piece you copy and a fixture holds the work! Sounds simple enough. Michael is a lazy perfectionist. Michael uses Sketch-up and Fusion 360 to make drawings of his furniture which can be printed either on large paper or on 8 1/2 x 11 paper after which you would tape the schematics together. He made a beautiful floating table out of white oak, the piece he used as his

fit on both sides of the piece. He uses a fixture to hold the legs, so the mortise is exactly where he wants it.

On the table, the bottom stretcher length is determined by the fit of the top. Michael is a master of using reference

example during the talk. He says to remember that wood has a mind of its own when you are making sawdust, and that he typically makes a prototype of each project first.

Mortises were used to join the table together, and in his opinion, slip tenons make building so easy. Slip tenon stocks are made in advance. Mortises are made with a router on a jig. The slip tenons

points in production and

this negates the need to measure everything to an exacting degree. He uses a fixture to place the stretchers and legs in order to route the mortise. He also used domino tenons at the top of the table, but had to make a fixture to line up the top with the stretchers. We all admired his handiwork. He did not really have a chance to get into finishing, leaving that for another time. We adjourned.
