2007 events commenced with a formal dinner for visiting Vice Chancellor Prof Alison Richard, who was accompanied by her husband Prof Bob Dewar and a number of other University and College senior officals. The dinner was held in MacLaurin Hall, Sydney University, and 220 Cambridge alumni and guests attended. Professor Richard is the 344th Vice-Chancellor of the University of Cambridge and is the first woman to hold the position full-time.

The money will be used for endowments to support the educational and research excellence for which Cambridge is so well known throughout the World. WINTER FEAST 2006

The 2006 Winter Feast was held at The Royal Sydney Golf Club on Thursday 21 September, by courtesy of former Chairman, Robert Wilson, who also acted as Master of Ceremonies for the function.

The date suggested the theme The Night of the Equinox. When it was realised that Stravinsky's famous ballet celebrated a Russian pagan festival and caused a riot when first performed in Paris in 1913, guests arrived to the more sedate strains of Vivaldi's Four Seasons. The theme was reflected in different bright coloured spring flowers on each table topped by a juxtaposed sun and moon.

120 guests enjoyed champagne and canapés over increasingly animated conversation, before proceeding to their tables named after some of Cambridge's most famous and infamous pubs. The venue was quite splendid, with great food and wine and impeccable service that set a relaxing transition-to-spring mood.

All this set the scene for the highlight of the evening: informative and entertaining talks by art gurus Joanna and Edmund Capon. Joanna spoke of her role as Honorary Curator of Art at the Children's Hospital at Westmead in developing the art collection at the hospital, and its purpose in supporting the treatment, recovery and wellbeing of the hospital's patients and their families and the hospital staff. She gave us extraordinary insights into the issues she has dealt with in a program that is unique worldwide and sets a leading global benchmark.

Long term Director of the Art Gallery of New South Wales and husband of Joanna, Edmund followed with an amusing if not hilarious exposé of the Archibald Prize. He spoke of the prize's origin and history, its nature and why it has endured when no other similar competition has done so anywhere in the world primarily because of its evergreen contemporary nature, how it importantly reflects Australian history through the ages, and of course the controversy that so often embroils it. Reflecting his other passion, Edmund made a number of disparaging remarks about so-called football codes that do not use a round ball!

After a short period of audience questions to Joanna and Edmund that allowed them to amplify some of the points they had necessarily only touched upon, guests enjoyed the customary provocatively funny vote of thanks from Vice Chairman, Christopher Dawson, and a short wrap up from Chairman, Ian Ross.

A NIGHT WITH THE STARS AT SYDNEY OBSERVATORY

On 8 November a sell out 40 members gathered at Sydney Obseravtory to do a little star gazing. Some had gathered earlier at the Lord Nelson Hotel for a light meal and a pre- observatory drink. Committee Member **Carole Jackson** organised eminent astronomer and broadcater Prof Fred Watson to talk with us about "Astronomers Behaving Badly". Fred entertained us with examples and at the same time we learned many facts about our universe.

Fred is a consumate presenter on things astronomical and all present enjoyed his wit and deep knowledge. The group toured the telescopes but due to cloud cover we were unable to gaze at the stars. The Observatory satff gave us an in-depth explanation of the whole facilty and the various exhibits on display. A further highlight was the 3D space theatre experience. One could not help but feel like an insignificant speck of dust as we took a simulated space ride, speeding through the billions of galaxies making up our universe

No wonder this marvellous choir has won international prizes, including the Gold Medal in the mixed chorus division at the Takarazuka International Chamber Chorus contest, and the Grossman prize for the best choral sound, awarded by the conductor of the Vienna Boys' Choir.
