Gregg Gridley Joins, John Brown Descendant

Another member of the pioneer Brown-Rouse family has joined our Society: Gregg Gridley. Mr. Gridley's grandfather is Charles Edwin Rouse, his great-grandfather is Charles Augustus Rouse (Sheriff of SB County in the 1890s), and his great-great-grandmother is Emma Brown, daughter of John Brown Sr. His cousin, Karin Hendrikson, also a member of the Rouse family (by marriage), joined last year after preparing a huge book of descendants of the ten children of John Brown Sr. This book has several generations of this prominent family detailed, including dozens of photographs, biographies, histories, diaries...just a remarkable piece of work. Karin generously donated a copy of this huge tome to our library.

Gregg showed up one Saturday in May with a box load of family treasures that he had inherited from his ancestors over the years. There were a number of school books with the names of Emma Brown and other family members; also John Brown's personal copy of the book John Doyle Lee wrote on the Mountain Meadows massacre, with Brown's signature on the inside cover. Among the other items of interest was a 1907 Directory of the City of San Bernardino. This last item he donated to the Society, and this now becomes the oldest original Directory in our library. We have a pretty good run of 1880s and 1890s directories, but they are copies.

During our discussions he mentioned that the Rouse family home was originally just down the street on D, located where Nena's Restaurant now is. Subsequently he donated an 11" x 17" photograph of the house, and it saddens one to know that a house of its beauty once graced our downtown but could not be saved. This house would have been right in keeping with the mansions in Redlands. Greg brought many other items either to donate or, in the case of photographs, to allow President Shaw to scan.

A few months ago somebody came to the Society asking about the Beachcomber's Resort out on Third Street, nearly all the way to Alabama Street. We didn't have anything on it. I don't remember how the subject came up, but Gregg said, "oh, yes, this was built and owned by my family" (built primarily by an in-law—Art Nelson). He brought photographs of the site including one large aerial view that was in a frame, the latter than which he allowed us to keep until Steve could scan it at home with his big scanner.

Gregg says he and Karin are going to visit an elderly aunt who lives in San Bernardino and get her to identify as many family photographs as possible. Some will never be identified, as this 85 year old is the last of her generation and doesn't remember everybody, but scores of relatives have been found and identified (by Karin and kin) for one of San Bernardino's (and the Pioneer Society's) founding families.

Feldheym Library Donation

Speaking of generous donations, we got a box of books given to us by our friends at the Feldheym Library. In talking to Millicent Price a while back, I mentioned that the California room had a couple of copies of a report on the 7th Street burials, and that the Heritage House Library did not have one. Shortly afterwards a pipe burst over the display where the report was kept, and the resultant downpour turned it to pulp. Fortunately the library had the backup copy. Millicent remembered the idea of providing some duplicates though, and offered to let the Heritage House have selected books. Ellen picked out a box of nice books, all but one on the city of San Bernardino. The one non-San Bernardino (City) book was Esther Boulton Black's *Rancho Cucamonga and Dona Merced*, a very desirable book even though the principal story does not place within the SB city limits. A couple of the books had Arda Haenszel's signature in them, which was a real treat for me.

Out West/Overland Monthly Journals Online

Here is a website I know you will want to bookmark. It has all of the issues of Out West/Overland Monthly from 1868 to 1900. I found it while looking for anything on William Greenwood Wright a few months ago.

Lee." That guy only died in 1877 at the age of 65. I know the polygamy thing was pretty powerful, but WOW, is this possible? I see many of the descendants hail from Apple Valley, where I live. I'm somewhat tempted to contact one and ask them what they think of their ancestor, or of being one of his descendants.

Architectural History

Steve Shaw began scanning photographs from the Donaldson report. You might remember that this report is a survey of the historic districts of San Bernardino. There are thousands of them. The report's photographer used a 35 mm camera, and he submitted the negatives from these photos. He provided the negatives and contact size photocopies, which are too small to see anything useful. Steve has now done about 10 % of the copying.

This brings up the subject of doing an architectural history of San Bernardino. We want to know what current structures are historic, of course, but we need the buildings that are gone, too. A lot of material already exists. Publications about S B sometimes discuss buildings, and our own SB Historical and Pioneer Society has done a lot of work along this line, particularly in the Odyssey. Arda Haenszel did some real historic gems with some of our buildings.

The history begins with the purchase of the rancho from the Lugos, and the Lugo buildings plus the Mormon buildings made up the story in the 1850s. Most were built of mud (adobe) or sticks (lumber). In 1867 there was a major fire, and much of the commercial part of town went up in flames. In 1867 Henry Goodcell, Sr., built the first brickyard in S. B., and one of his early customers was John Henry Stewart, who built the first brick building in town. Stewart's biography can be found here:

Here is the pertinent part of the bio as far as buildings:

In 1858 they moved to Petaluma, selling their property in Cloverdale, and in 1865 they exchanged their property in Petaluma for a block of land in San Bernardino, situated a little west of the business portion of the town, bounded by Second, Third, D and E streets. In 1867 Mr. Stewart erected the first brick building in San Bernardino, on the corner of Third and D streets, now known as the Meyerstein corner. In 1872 he built the three stores next west of that. In 1878 he erected another block of three stores. For some time previous to the accident which caused his death Mr. Stewart had contemplated building a fine hotel which should be a credit to the city; he had drawn the plans, and began the foundation for it on the site of the present Stewart Hotel, expecting to push forward the work in 1885. On February 14, of that year, he was thrown from his carriage, receiving a compound fracture of the thigh, too close to the body to admit of amputation. After eighteen weeks of untold suffering, death came to his relief, on June 22, 1885.

Reading that paragraph leads me to believe that Stewart owned the southwest corner of Third and D Streets, and, in fact, owned all the way over to the southeast corner of Third and E. His 1867 building appears to have been at the SW corner of 3rd and D, and that can be checked from the clue about it being the Meyerstein corner in 1889 (or thereabouts, when the *Illustrated History* was published). The two buildings adjacent to the west, built in 1872 and 1878, consisting of a total of six stores, must have taken up a good portion of the block. We probably have a picture somewhere that shows that area from different periods of time. Before I do any more research on Stewart's buildings, I ask that any reader of this newsletter who has knowledge of the Stewart buildings, please let me know what they have.

In addition to the three commercial buildings on Third St., he also did the planning and commenced with the construction (if "began the foundation" is taken literally), of the Stewart Hotel. We have many views of this building, and it is as famous for its spectacular fires as anything else. Earl Buie (see below) said that it burned three times, the last being in 1938.

Since Third and D Streets, and Third and E Streets were the main intersections throughout much of San Bernardino's history, it appears we have a good start on our history. The first thing is to collect what we already have and put it in an easily usable form.

Finally, I mentioned that I was working on repairing a couple of scrapbooks containing Buie columns, and that I was considering indexing them. Well, I did index one, and I think that is enough, at least for a while. Here it is:
