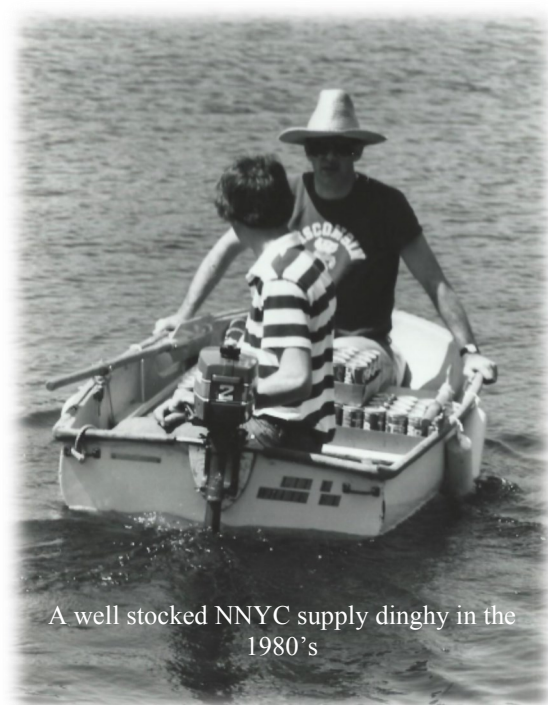

Here is some info from our friends at the ILYA about their Women/Girls Clinic June 19-20.

“The clinic is designed to empower girls and young women with confidence through the sport of sailing & support breast cancer research. This event is for women of all ages - 8-80. The areas of instruction include youth and scow sailing, race committee work, parenting a soon-to-be college sailor, how to watch a race and trailer backing. In addition, a service component has been included to allow our young women sailors to begin or add to a service record for college and high school students.”

Some features that make this event special are: opportunity to sail 6 C scow and 6 MC scows with owners or experienced crew, keynote speaker Mary Ann Ward (Melges 17 & 20 sailor from the Chicago Match Racing Center), and intergeneration instruction to appeal to women of all ages.
