Life Application	1) Help children understand the importance of meeting with other believers. Find out whether there are children who don't go to church or 'youth' groups. See if you can arrange a lift for them (if that would help the parents). 2) Encourage them to meet with Christian friends at school - during break, and read a verse together and pray for each other.	Let children think of practical ways we can help and serve others. (Suggest ways that may not have been mentioned.) We can give to mission projects, visit someone who is sick, help someone who is struggling with schoolwork, be a friend to someone lonely, pray with someone who is sad etc.	1) Use this opportunity to explain the Gospel to the children and extend an invitation to those who would like to make a commitment. 2) Encourage children to tell others about Jesus. Teach them a simple way to share the Gospel.	1) Ask children if they are teased for believing in Jesus/going to church. Help them practice appropriate ways to respond. 2) Pray for those who are bullied and teased (and let other children pray for them too).	1) Help children understand that sometimes God's plan may include hardship, as it did for Paul and others. (But the rewards of remaining faithful are being stored up in heaven). 2) Encourage children to discover their talents and abilities and do their best in everything (Col 3:23-24).
