We raised enough money from the event to begin the remodel of our hangers and construction on a classroom, starting with the update of the electrical service.

Activity in the school hangars is ongoing. Students are working on replacing ribs in the stabilizer of a 172 Cessna as well as replacing the cam and lifters in the Cessna Cardinal's O360.

The Cherokee and the Citabria are flight ready, and we are looking forward to the arrival of a Champ donated for use by Art McLean and Rex Southerland. The latter may be put on floats by the end of the summer.

As we face the coming months, we are looking forward toward the goal He has set before us.

Trinity Aviation Academy held its first fundraiser on Feb. 11. The event attracted 120 dinner guests and featured both silent and live auctions.

Guest speaker Perry Pust, a recruiter for Mission Aviation Fellowship, spoke about his years as a veteran missionary pilot. Trinity board member Stan Gerlitz served as auctioneer for the evening.

Lorraine Gerlitz, chairwoman for the event, garnered praise for a job well done and a classy atmosphere. Fundraiser committee members included Marcus and Katie Erickson, Hope Henry and Jeannie Mulkey.

Director Dan Mulkey said the event raised approximately \$4,000, or nearly onethird of the \$15,000 needed for a planned classroom. FAA requires schools to have an operating classroom for its students to be eligible for financial aid.

Mulkey said proceeds from the fundraiser will allow the school to begin updating the electrical system in the classroom.
