

9/11 Day of Service and Remembrance

Normont Elementary School (Harbor City, CA)

On Sunday, September 11, 2011, Kaiser Permanente partnered with Sharefest Community Development, Inc to commemorate the 10th anniversary of 9/11. Nearly 150 volunteers - comprised largely of employees from the Kaiser Permanente South Bay Medical Center and their families - participated in the event which took place at Normont Elementary School, where Tracy Joseph is the principal. The day kicked off with welcoming words and very quickly shifted into high gear with volunteers breaking up into two teams for the days activities: restoring the playground area and painting two large murals. The murals, designed by Vanesa Andrade, capture the restoring power of communities that overcome tragedy by working together.
