What is ISO 14001?

- International standard that establishes consensus minimum standards for an Environmental Management System (EMS).
 - <http://www.iso.org/iso/home.htm>
 - Consists of policies, practices, resources and structure used to implement the organization's environmental policy
 - Elements range from
 - Simple systems that respond to environmental permit conditions, to
 - More robust systems, such as Intel's design for environment process, that go beyond compliance to achieve pollution prevention and excellence

ISO 14001 Registration – Why?

- Customer requests
- Supplier selection criteria
- Key credential of environmental leadership
- Widespread industry adoption of ISO 14001

ISO 14001 Registration – Results

- Intel started company wide registration process in 2001
- 16 manufacturing sites worldwide are included in the registration
 - NSAI certificate 14.0246 A-P (July 2002-2008)
