KEYNOTE PRESENTER:

Christiana Bratiotis, Ph.D., MSW completed her Doctor of Philosophy at Boston University in the Interdisciplinary Social Work and Sociology program. Upon completion of her doctoral studies, Dr. Bratiotis was awarded a three year post-doctoral research fellowship at Boston University School of Social Work, where she served as director of the Hoarding Research Project.

Dr. Bratiotis is currently an Assistant Professor at University of British Columbia where she teaches graduate level practice courses and undergraduate social analysis.

Dr. Bratiotis' primary area of research is the formation and operation of multi-disciplinary community interventions for hoarding, including the formation and operation of hoarding task forces highlighted in her book titled "The Hoarding Handbook: A Guide for Human Service Professionals" released by Oxford University Press. Her work has been highlighted by media outlets including the New York Times, Boston Globe, and Chicago Tribune.

CONFERENCE OBJECTIVES

- Recognize mental health diagnostic criteria for hoarding disorder and co-occurring mental health conditions
