Nathan will be licensed at a special service at St Bartholomew's, Yarnton, on Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> October at 7.30pm. Please be praying for Nathan as he prepares to come and live and work with us.

Meanwhile, he has been kind enough to write something about his life:

I was born in Rochdale, but moved to Yorkshire when I was 10 days old. You decide whether I am a Lancashire or Yorkshireman. It has been a subject of debate in my family for many years! After school and A levels, I went to Oxford Brookes to study English and Education Studies, with a view to becoming a teacher. I eventually decided that was not for me, and went into publishing, just down the road from here, near Oxford Airport. I enjoyed my time with Elsevier, and who would have thought that I would eventually become its Parish Priest as it is within the boundary of Begbroke. God moves in mysterious ways.

After a time with another company based in London, I was persuaded to go to chapel in Oxford for the Easter Service. For some reason, everything clicked into place. My church upbringing, my desire to worship, and a need to be with other Christians all came flooding back, and my journey towards ordination began.

I eventually returned to Oxford and studied for the priesthood at St Stephen's House, and was ordained in Durham Cathedral to serve the parish of Holy Trinity, Hartlepool. I had a good three years, and then moved to Birmingham as Vicar of St Luke's, Kingstanding. I have enjoyed being part of a team, especially developing our ministry to young people. Our Messy Church is into its second year and growing, as are other new ways of connecting with the people of the parish.



On a personal note, my interests are varied. I am passionate about animals, and currently have two very grumpy hens (who may or may not be moving with me!) and a rather attention seeking Labrador called Oscar. I enjoy collecting antiques, and love spending time rummaging through junk shops. As yet, I have not managed to spot any priceless artefacts, but I will let you know if I do. I am interested in rural and environmental issues, and in many ways this informs my approach to spirituality and prayer. I am also studying for a Doctorate, examining how the Eucharist can transform the mission of the church.

I am really looking forward to working within the Blenheim Team and getting to know you all. It seems to me that good and exciting things are happening here, and I am thrilled to be part of what you are doing now, and what we will be doing in the future. My prayers are with Adrian and all the team, lay and ordained, as we serve God in this beautiful corner of England.

KIDLINGTON 01865 374444 **Ensuring Tree Safety:** Mature trees in the landscape are objects of beauty and great assets to our natural environment. Our roadsides, recreation grounds, play areas and public open spaces are greatly enhanced and improved by trees, which blossom in spring, give leaf colour in autumn and architectural drama in winter, not to mention the wildlife they attract. However, if a tree should fail, the results can be catastrophic to life and property. Tree owners such as parish and town councils, have a legal duty of care to take all reasonable measures to ensure that trees are maintained in as safe a condition as possible. In practice, this is generally achieved by regular inspections. Professional visual tree inspections focus on trees in locations where they might pose a hazard to people or property. The arboriculturalist looks for symptoms of stress or sources of failure, such as dead wood, decay fungi, structural faults and changes in crown vigour, and then makes recommendations regarding the future maintenance of the tree.

**Metal Theft Costs Soar:** (Extract from Clerks and Councillors Issue 82). The problem of metal thefts is costing local authorities millions of pounds each year, according to new research by the **Local Government Association** (LGA). The LGA conducted a survey of 157 councils across England and Wales and found that the cost of metal theft had risen by an estimated 26 per cent in a single year, soaring to £4.6 million in 2011. This amount could keep 20 libraries open or employ 260 care workers for the elderly, said the association. It warned that the financial burden was likely to get worse unless the government introduced new legislation to regulate the scrap metal industry. Cllr. Mehboob Khan, chair of the LGA's Safer and Stronger Communities Board, said: 'Government missed an opportunity by not including a change in legislation in the recent Queen's Speech. It is vital that local authorities get stronger powers to make it more difficult for thieves to dispose of stolen metal.

Councils want to see an annually renewable licence for scrap metal dealers, which could be reviewed at the instigation of the police or licensing authority and, if necessary, revoked. The LGA has called for an overhaul of the Scrap Metal Dealers Act 1964, which requires councils to register dealers, without the ability to refuse the application. Along with a tougher licensing regime, it believes that this will make it more difficult for scrap dealers to handle stolen metal.

# Can Man and Wildlife live side by side? - our findings

Can man and wildlife live side by side? That's what I said in my last article that I would be exploring in June. My company was Sponsoring the Sunningwell Festival, which had its main stage constructed within the village pond. We recorded some material for our wildlife radio programme 'Going Wild with Wildlife' on Radio Cherwell, which explored whether man and wildlife could actually live side by side if they wanted to. As I said in my last article. I feel that although gardens and streets are manmade, so is the countryside. What we see as countryside is a product of thousands of years of farming and management. Having said that, if we manage it wisely, wildlife will still come. Our findings were that the festival didn't have too much of a detrimental effect on the wildlife, perhaps in some areas it had a positive effect. Mallards happily raised two young, and festival goers could almost see the juveniles grow day by day. The moorhens also continued to raise their young, often spending much of their time under the stage. Bats too had a feeding frenzy during the performances. Lights attracted moths which the bats happily hoovered up. At times, it was raining moth wings as the bats discarded what they didn't eat.

Lots of erosion occurred on the grass areas around the pond. The bare earth is now great for basking dragonflies, ground nesting bees and house martins, who need wet mud to build and repair their nests. Plus the cutting back of some of the undergrowth so the stage could be constructed, in a roundabout way may help provide growth of different ages, which in turn may attract more wildlife than you might do if you had growth of all the same age and stage. For example, grass of differing lengths is great for hedgehogs, as they have a wider range of food available to them.

It was interesting to hear what people assume wildlife gardening means during our involvement. Some feel it's doing nothing and letting the wildlife fend for itself, others think it's just about wildflowers and never weeding. Our job was to educate people into realising it's more about growing lots of different things and just not letting anything dominate. 
