



Yarnton Gardening Club



Recent flooding: The recent flooding in several parts of the village has highlighted to YPC several issues within the village. One major cause for concern is the main Pumping Station in Merton Way which frequently fails in heavy rain, causing sewerage water to flood houses close by. We have been in contact several times with Thames Water expressing our concern that the 2 pumps in the pumping station are inadequate for the amount of houses now in the village. We have just heard from Thames Water that they intend to take action to resolve the issue, although as yet they are unsure what or when the work will be done.

We do have to take into account the high risk of flooding in Yarnton, especially as we are situated on flood plain close to the Oxford canal and River Thames, both of which are likely to burst their banks during heavy storms or long periods of wet weather, leading to the overflow often reaching the village. Also Spring Hill causes water to flow rapidly down Cassington Road into the village adding to the problems. This water is then filling drains and sewers adding to the rain falling directly onto the village.

Further building projects simply cover land which would soak up some of the rain, so the recent flooding should indicate to the District and County Councils that Yarnton is no longer a suitable area to build new homes, and we should raise strong objections should attempts be made to do this. The Parish Council's major objective must also be a complete rework of the existing sewers and drainage system. We must put pressure on Thames Water to ensure that the pumping stations are in good working order at all times. We are continually being told that pumps are not operating properly and Thames Water must introduce a plan which corrects this abysmal situation.

Cherwell District Council Housing Scheme: Cherwell D.C. is currently reviewing its Allocation Scheme in line with the changes brought about by the Localism Act, the newly issued Central Government Code of Guidance, and changes within Cherwell, such as the Build! Self build programme. The proposals include the following changes:

- Restricting access to the Housing Register to applicants with a local connection to Cherwell, who are in housing need and do not have sufficient financial resources to find their own housing solution.
- Changes to the size of property and number of bedrooms a household is eligible to qualify for, to fit the incoming benefit rules and central government guidance.
- Changes to the number of offers a statutorily homeless applicant can receive.

Oxfordshire Youth Bus: The Youth Facilities Bus visits Yarnton Park from **6 p.m. to 7.30 p.m.** each Wednesday throughout the winter months. At a time when youth provision is being reduced across the county Yarnton residents are fortunate to have such a facility available for young people. The bus is in great demand is proving very popular.

Entry to Primary or Infant school – September 2013: If your child was born on or between 1st September 2008 and 31st August 2009, you need to apply for a primary school place now. You must still apply even if your child already attends a nursery attached to the school. Parents/Carers <u>must</u> apply by **15**th **January 2013**, online at



Oxfordshire Community Woodfuel Programme Buying woodfuel, plus a directory of woodfuel suppliers

The Oxfordshire Community Woodfuel Programme is a new initiative run by the Trust for Oxfordshire's Environment and several partner organisations. It aims to help local communities to:

- Connect with their local environment and local energy supply, and understand the productive nature of woodlands
- Increase their supply and demand for woodfuel
- In doing so, reduce their carbon footprints, improve their biodiversity, and reduce their 'fuel miles'

I am the programme manager and hope to send you regular briefings. This first note is about buying woodfuel, for anyone with a wood burning stove or fireplace. Please help your wallet, your flue, and your local woodfuel merchants by being an informed buyer.

The environmental advantages of using woodfuel decrease the further the wood has to travel. So aim to **get your wood locally** - from your community woodland or local woodland owners: look in shop windows or notice boards, or try www.sylva.org.uk/myforest/,

www.woodfueldirectory.org and www.coppice-products.co.uk. Unless stated otherwise, wood from garage forecourts or supermarkets is unlikely to be local. Kiln dried wood has been – as the name implies – heated up to drive off water. This heating process uses energy, and also reduces the environmental advantage of burning wood.

Logs are generally sold by the load, but there is no specification of what a 'load' is. **Rules of thumb for purchasing logs** include:

- Buy logs that have been dried for at least one year under cover, otherwise you may well get logs with a high moisture content, and spend much of the wood energy just turning this into steam. The ends of dry wood often look greying and old, with radial lines of splitting. Alternatively, buy freshly cut logs, which will be cheaper, and dry them yourselves for a year under cover.
- When completely dry, all wood produces roughly the same amount of energy per weight. However hardwood (e.g. ash, hazel, fruit tree) logs weigh more than softwood (pine) logs, and so produce more energy per log. This means that a tonne of hardwood logs will take up less space than a tonne of softwood logs, and fewer 'top ups' of hardwood logs will be needed to keep a log stove running for a given time. So be clear about whether you are getting hardwood or softwood.
- Make sure that the logs are cut short enough to fit into your stove.
- Any logs that have a diameter of more than 10cm (8 inches) should be split.
- Look for certificates like HETAS and Woodsure, which guarantee wood quality.

The Oxfordshire Community Woodfuel Programme is working on developing a specification for firewood, including what a 'load' means, and what moisture content the wood should have. Watch this space! You could consider **buying woodfuel as a group**. It is easier and cheaper for a supplier to serve one large customer than many small customers, so a community woodfuel buying scheme may get a better price because of these economies of scale. The Oxfordshire Rural Community Council runs a community oil buying scheme, and may be able to provide advice on setting up a similar scheme for logs: contact them at oil@oxonrcc.org.uk. Finally, we **encourage woodfuel suppliers to register** with websites so that people can more easily find their local suppliers. The main free sites are www.sylva.org.uk/myforest/, www.woodfueldirectory.org and www.coppice-products.co.uk.

Keeping room for woodlouse in our gardens

My scribblings this month have been inspired by a sighting I just had, out there in my own garden, of a woodlouse going about his business in my compost heap. Believe it or not, there are 37 species of woodlouse in Britain, and although some are only 10mm long, the Sea Slater type can be up to 30mm in length. The hard shell of a woodlouse can be grey, pinky brown, white and yellow or even just white. They have seven pairs of legs and rather interesting antennae. Some species of woodlouse are widely seen, others may only be seen by the coast or in southern counties of Britain.

To keep them in our gardens we need to provide damp places, especially during daytime hours. Leaving a pile of leaves, having grassland of different lengths, deadwood in a woodland, or even a compost heap in our gardens, are often all we need to do. There is even a type of woodlouse that lives within ant nests, so don't be too keen on destroying every ant nest you see.

Mainly, woodlouse eat plant material that is already rotting; only very occasionally will they attack young seedlings. They are one of the key creatures in recycling the nutrients from our plants back into the soil. So when you see these little beasts running around your garden, don't recoil in horror, they are our friends and only a pest if you choose a mindset that sees them in that way.


