Littlemarsh Pavilion: At the time of going to press, although the pavilion will not be fully completed, the official opening is planned for the night of the Annual Firework Display, 9th November 2013 with the opening at 7 p.m. Confirmation of this will be placed on the Parish Council noticeboards and the village website nearer the date.

Trees along the A44 Service Road: We were informed by Oxfordshire County Council that some trees along the A44 Service Road would have to be felled as they had destroyed the drainpipes, and this was the cause of the flooding at Yarnton Roundabout earlier this year. The work started towards the end of September. All residents affected were informed by the Parish Council by way of letters and a meeting arranged for representatives of OCC to explain the reason for the work.

Entry to Primary School: If your child was born on or between 1st September 2009 and 31st August 2010, you need to apply for a primary school place now. You must still apply even if your child already attends a nursery attached to the school. Closing date is 15th January 2014. Apply online at www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/admissions or on paper (forms available from the County Council website or a local school).

Grants: Village organisations are reminded that applications for a grant from the Parish Council must be received in writing to the Clerk by 31st December 2013, and cannot be considered after that date. Applicants must explain why they are making the request, specify the sum they are applying for, enclose their latest statement of accounts, and also confirm that any grant awarded last year was used in the manner applied for. Successful applicants will receive the grant in April 2014.

Compostable Caddy Bin Liners: Caddy bin liners can still be purchased from the Parish Council Office in the Village Hall on Mondays and Thursdays between 9 a.m. and 11 a.m., or will be delivered by arrangement if more convenient and not possible to collect. Dogs: We are still receiving complaints of dog mess around the village, although the problem has decreased in recent months. Would dog walkers please remember that when walking along the bridle path near the burial ground, dogs should remain on leads until well past the burial ground. Bags of dog mess tied to a fence are almost as offensive as the mess itself. Please dispose in the proper way. Dog waste bags are available free of charge from the Parish Office.



What seems like many years ago, I was a rather serious student, working hard for my degree in theology, and hoping one day to be ordained. I went to all my lectures, read the books I had to, and had long tedious conversations about the finer points of worship and liturgy with my tutors. Eventually, of course, I was ordained, and here I am several years later.

Thinking back to those days, it is hard to recognise that person. I had no idea of what it would be like to run a parish (never mind two!), to deal with conflict and change, to try to lead a church into growth, to be 'all things to all people' as vicars are often seen. Sometimes the prospect of keeping two listed ancient buildings open and fit for purpose is a daunting one. It is now getting colder, and it's time to switch on the heating. You can hear clergy sigh across the country. Gas bills, oil bills, and the threat of ice freezing the water pipes. This month's letter is really cheerful isn't it.....?

Actually, it is. In the two wonderful villages I work and worship in, we have buildings that are a joy to be in. The comments book in St. Bartholomew's speaks for many. 'Thank-you for letting us come into your beautiful building' and 'what a peaceful calm place this is' are a couple from the last few weeks. If you want to know more, read the new book on Oxfordshire churches advertised in the porch where we are said to have 'the best collection of stained glass in the county'. I agree.

Being part of church, looking after a church, coming to church can sometimes be hard work, but to see how it affects the lives of our residents is humbling. You might be an occasional visitor, perhaps you come in to sit quietly; I know lots of you do. You might come to light a candle and say a prayer. However you use the church, remember, as we do at this time of year, all those who have worked so hard to keep it open, and those who do the same today.

We move into autumn, the leaves have fallen, the apples have been eaten or made into cider, and the year starts its closing performance. The church, however, continues. We move from harvest to Remembrance. Last year, the church was packed, and we expect the same this year. We remember, we give thanks, we celebrate, and we participate. All the elements that make up a lively, vital community. I look forward to seeing you there.
