If you have, you would have been as annoyed as I was when I went for an appointment the other day and saw this notice on the door:

'In July there were 36 missed appointments, either with the doctor or nurse, where the patient had not rung in advance to cancel. This equates to 6 hours of wasted surgery time'

That's 36 appointments which could have been used by someone else!

Why can't people be more considerate and have the courtesy to ring and cancel, so that someone else can take their place?

If you make a dental or optician's appointment and don't give 24 hours notice of cancellation you are charged a fee. If that happened at the surgery, people might think twice about just not turning up.



Thames Valley Police September update

As always we have been busy in Kidlington and surrounding areas.

Operation Jawbone ran on Thursday 11th September. The operation works to tackle rural crime, and due to the success it had the first time around, it was decided that it should run for a second time. The operation was conducted by officers from 9 a.m. - 3.30 p.m. and there were some excellent outcomes; a person was found to be collecting scrap metal without a licence, and this was reported to West Oxon District Council. We also stopped vehicles which didn't have insurance and fixed penalty notices were issued.

We would also like to let residents know about the new Speed Watch campaign. Those who are concerned about speeding in their local area should be aware of the Speed Indicator Device which will help them to measure the speed of vehicles passing through their area. To be part of the campaign, you will need to approach your village councillor; PCSOs will then be able to provide training to volunteers to show them how to use the device. Residents in Hampton Poyle recently used the device and were able to use the equipment to notify the police about any vehicles which were speeding in the area. This was very helpful and should contribute to educate drivers about speeding and how it can impact a community. PC Tracey Hogan

Vertical habitats

Vertical habitats are a neglected consideration of wildlife gardening. It can be a brick wall, a fence; or the side of a timber shed. These habitats can be very varied, providing shady, damp sites or dry and sunny; micro-habitats will be common. They provide food and shelter for many species with very different needs. Cracks in sunny walls provide shelter for invertebrates; surfaces of brick provide basking places for butterflies; old masonry provides opportunities for harvestmen, and solitary bees. Climbing shrubs provide nest sites for robins and habitats for spiders; and flowering shrubs supply nectar for hoverflies, moths and butterflies. If you have a cold north and northeast facing brick or masonry wall, it is possible to cultivate shrubs and climbers which provide nectar, food and shelter for insects, birds and small mammals year round. Once mature, nest boxes can be sited within shrubs. So there you go, have a look around your garden - habitats are not just down there below knee level. Happy Gardening.

Holy Cross Day 2014. Today in the church, we remember Holy Cross Day. Today is a day of mixed emotions, and mixed metaphors. We know that the cross is a symbol of Christ, a symbol of pain and suffering, but also a symbol of new life and redemption. We see the cross everywhere. Take a look around your parish church. I have counted several this morning. They are depicted on the wall in the nave wall paintings, although most of it is covered up with whitewash. They are on the two altars, and a large brass cross sits in its stand near the back of church in front of the organ. You can also see it around the necks of many people in the village, church-goers or not. It also seems that it is a trendy thing to keep in your pocket or at your bedside, and many of the prisoners I used to visit in Birmingham would try anything to get hold of a rosary, not because they wanted to pray, but because they were bargaining tools and could be swapped for cigarettes, drink and drugs. The cross has become not only a symbol, but a commodity, a badge of honour and a symbol of controversy. You may remember a few years ago, a female flight attendant almost losing her job because she insisted on wearing a cross for work, and it had 'offended' another member of staff. This, typically, became big news, and became the topic of debate on many a chat show, and filled many column inches in the papers. We use the cross as a sort of talisman, a kind of trinket that we think will keep us safe, or ward off bad things that may happen to us.

In so many ways, we try to shape the cross, rather than the cross shaping us. Think about that for a moment. How can we be shaped by the cross?

Well, not only is it an image, it is also a reality. This instrument of torture was used to slowly kill those who went against the authorities, including some Christians. In recent years, it became a symbol of emancipation, but also of oppression for black workers in America plagued by the those white-hood wearing racists who burned wooden crosses in the gardens of those they wanted to terrify.

We are shaped by the cross, if we but allow ourselves to be, in many ways.

When a parishioner lies dying in a hospital bed, we often bring along a holding cross. A simple wooden cross made into a comfortable shape to hold in the palm of your hand. Even those who find it hard to move, who can barely hear or open their eyes, can hold it and it brings comfort. They are truly holding on to the cross, and letting it shape them. We are shaped by the cross when terrible things happen that are out of our control. We feel battered and bruised, and sometimes can only cling on and hope. There is a wonderful image of Pope John Paul in his later years clinging on to the silver cross in what looks to be a ferocious gale. His eyes are almost closed against the wind, and his robes billow in the breeze, but he clings on in defiance. The imagery is strong and has been reproduced so many times. We are also shaped by holding the cross aloft, when we sing the wonderful hymn 'Lift high the cross', a song of triumph and of hope. When we process into church carrying it, we are saying that we are cross-shaped people.

When we come together in a service, God forgives us our sins, and we know this as a reality when the priest makes the sign of the cross, and we perhaps do the same to show we have set aside those things that were weighing us down, and at the end of a service when we ask God to bless us and send us out into the world. The cross is a sign of power and strength.

Yesterday, I attended the induction of a friend of mine who has been made one of the canons at Chester Cathedral. The building looked amazing, the choir was splendid and the whole thing went off very well. The one thing that struck me was the wooden carved image of Christ on the cross surrounded by the disciples and his mother. This stands facing the nave high up just below the organ loft. Right in the middle of all that beauty, right in the middle of that wonderful celebration, we see Jesus lifted high for us. We cannot forget what has been done on our behalf. We cannot skirt round the issue, and simply admire the rest of the building, as thousands of tourists do each and every day. There in the middle is the cross.

Today is a special day. We remember the beginning of the Great War. We prepare for the changing of the seasons, for Harvest and then for Remembrance. We look forward, but always remember to look back to pause and to say thank-you. Without the cross, we are nothing. Without Jesus, we are nothing. Without that ultimate sacrifice, the winds of life and the trials of the world would swamp us. We need to cling on in faith and ask that the cross will shape us and mould us.

Almighty God, who in the passion of your blessed Son made an instrument of painful death to be for us the means of life and peace: Grant us so to glory in the cross of Christ that we may gladly suffer for his sake; who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.




