#### Yarnton Walkers - Update

It has been some time since we last updated the villagers regarding our application to Oxfordshire County Council regarding the closure of the footpaths at the back of the Manor.

The whole footpath issue in this country is complex and recently we have been made aware that the Government are planning more changes. The result of these proposals will be to try and make it a lot easier to bring the issue to the County Council and more importantly to speed up the process from taking years to taking months for the County Council to make a decision on the issue. In view of this we are currently seeking legal advice to ensure that our application has all its ducks in a row. As we are sure a lot of you have noticed, it was disappointing to see that the farmer who leases the fields at the back of the Red

As we are sure a lot of you have noticed, it was disappointing to see that the farmer who leases the helds at the back of the Red Lion and the Manor, not only decided to plough up our former footpaths around the edges, but also to plough up the Public Footpaths crossing the fields. We did query this with Oxfordshire County Council and were advised that the ploughing of public rights of way is allowed where it is not convenient to leave the footpaths unploughed. However this is provided that the said footpaths are made good after the ploughing. We are examining whether this has been done.

Please keep a look out for notification of our next public meeting which we expect to call in January.

In the meantime a very Happy New Year to our 150 supporters in the village.

I can't quite believe it's over. All the preparation, all the planning, all the waiting and the worrying. A big thank-you to everyone who made Advent and Christmas so memorable at St. Bartholomew's. We had a wonderful time and are glad that you could be with us.

Now another year starts. It all happens again, and we have a chance to get it right, to do it better, to improve on 2015. That's how the newspapers and magazine articles see New Year. Don't worry about last year, this year we will achieve!

I want to tell you about something that is happening to your church. You might think that it doesn't affect you, as you may not be a regular member of our congregation. Please keep reading, you may change your mind. In 2015, changes in the way our church buildings are financed, and our clergy paid for, came into effect, leaving us in a precarious position. To cut a very long story short, we are simply not bringing in enough money to pay our way. Our outgoings and costs are much more than our income.

I want to dispel some common myths I often hear when talking about church finances.:

1. 'The Church', whatever we mean by this, is not rich. Whilst the national church has assets and owns land, the local church survives on contributions from its parishioners. In other words, we are largely financed by the money that goes into the plate. You should see our bank balance. It's not pretty.

2. We receive no money whatsoever from the government. Even though we are the national church, no income comes to us from taxes or other revenue.

3. Many in our community simply presume that St. Bartholomew's will be there forever; baptising, celebrating, remembering and saying goodbye on behalf of our loved ones. Unless we act very soon, YOUR village church will not be. We will be closed.



At the moment, we are engaging in a new Mission Action Planning initiative with the Diocese of Oxford. We have ambitious plans to save our church, and to expand our reach. We want to adapt our buildings in the long term, so we can make it 'fit for purpose'. We are a Grade 1 listed building. Our stained glass is renowned and beautiful. The writer Simon Jenkins raves about it; four pages in his book on Oxfordshire Churches are dedicated to our St. Bartholomew's. We have a great asset. Our walls need re-pointing. The chapel roof needs renewing. The plaster needs replacing. Did you know that we don't even have running water?

We need to really focus on two things: growing our congregation and increasing our income. This is no mean feat when incomes are stretched and money is scarce.

I would like you all to start thinking about what the church means to you. Perhaps you have relatives buried in the churchyard. Perhaps you were baptised here, or used to sing in the famous choir of the 1970s, or went to Sunday School in the Parish Room (owned by the Manor for many years).

Would it matter to you if it closed?

Would you simply go elsewhere for worship, weddings, baptisms, funerals, Remembrance Sunday, etc? Would it have any effect on village life and Church Lane?

Now, I wish as much as anyone that a simple solution would simply fall into place, but I don't think it's going to. Unless a very wealthy benefactor turns up, we are ALL going to have to pull together to secure a future for OUR wonderful church. Over the coming weeks and months, you will hear more of our plans, and you will no doubt hear me talking about it at every opportunity. I love our church, a church that is growing numerically, spiritually and confidently. This can be encouraged to flourish and grow, safeguarding our congregation AND our building.

#### **S3 Bus Service**

The following message was received via the website concerning the S3 service to and from Yarnton: 'I was wondering if we could raise the issue of S3 bus service being very irregular – some of us have had to wait for up to 40 minutes at Gloucester Green for buses on weekends. I totally acknowledge that the work on the two roundabouts leads to delays in routes - would it then not be useful for the S3 service to have more buses on this route so that people use the bus service rather than their cars (some of us would prefer that if the service was regular and was until late at night). My request is that through Yarnton newsletter villagers propose to Stagecoach that S3 run every ten minutes until 11 p.m. during evenings and weekends. There is definitely demand for the service at late evenings, as is evident at bus stops, especially Gloucester Green. There are a lot of new people who have recently moved into Yarnton and use the bus for getting to work it would be great if we all had the opportunity to enjoy our dinners/evenings in Oxford city centre and be able to take the bus back into Yarnton, especially on Sunday.' Editorial comment: I think we are fortunate in having buses every 20 minutes during the day on weekdays, but do agree that the frequency in the evenings and weekends is not that great. However, every 10 minutes seems very ambitious and uneconomical for the bus company. What do other villagers think?
