At the time of writing, we have just celebrated Candlemass. This might be a festival you remember from years ago, when congregations of a Catholic persuasion would process in the streets carrying candles, usually followed by a parish buffet as way of celebration. This festival recalls the presentation of Christ to Simeon in the temple, and uses a well known part of scripture. It is where we get the wonderful words that we still use at Evensong throughout the country each and every day in our cathedrals and churches: 'Lord, let your servant depart in peace'. All Simeon wanted was to live long enough to see the Christ. He had been expecting this amazing event all his life, which he spent in the service of God and others. Worship was his world. It was in his blood.

When thinking about Candlemass, I started thinking about all the things I want to do in my life, all the things I would like to achieve. When I was younger, I guess I was more focused on what we might call ambition. I had a career before ordination and was quite quickly offered promotion. This is of course flattering and affirming and helps to boost one's feelings of self worth and value. I felt as if I was 'on my way'. Now things are rather different. If you want to be a 'high flyer', then getting ordained and working as a Parish Priest is not really going to get you very far. For me, priorities had changed. Forever. Whilst my friends and colleagues have gone on to do great things in their chosen careers, some of them at director level, I have chosen a different path, a different way.

The whole of Simeon's life was about God. He devoted every waking moment to Him. I wish I could do the same. I wish I had the discipline and the strength to be as faithful, as committed. The thing is, life gets in the way. We all have busy lives, whether we are working, retired, single or part of a large family. We are all rushing around to get things done. This is the modern way, it seems.

Whilst we can't necessarily devote our whole life to one particular cause, I wonder whether we can re-prioritise? January was a month full of promises and resolutions. Did anyone give up drinking, or perhaps stop eating meat, two campaigns that I was very much aware of? Did we manage to stick to it in February? Sometimes I think it's good to simply let go of all the trying, all the resolutions, all the planning and promising, and simply see what might happen next. It's not easy to let go of systems that shape and dominate our lives. What about simply being open to what might happen next?

Simeon had no idea when he was going to meet Jesus. He had no rota, no timetable, no way of knowing. He simply got on with life, safe in the knowledge that God was with him and all would be well. I wish I could be more like that.

Candlemass is over. Lent and then Easter are stretching out ahead of us. We have a busy and rather wonderful time coming up. We all know that something good is worth waiting for, and it is like this with Easter. We must go on a journey before the celebrations. Try to resist the hot cross buns in the shops, the shelves in the supermarkets heaving with chocolate. We watch and wait, like old Simeon, for the time of celebration and new life.

Memorial Stone: Following the article in February Village News about a memorial stone, views/comments (whether you support or object) would still be appreciated to Lynne at the Parish Council either in writing or by email clerk@phonecoop.coop. At the time of going to press only 5 comments have been received.

Dog Fouling: If you allow a dog in your charge to foul any area to which the public has access you are committing an offence. Town and Parish Councils provide bins in parks and other public areas for the use of dog owners. Cherwell District Council is responsible for monitoring dog fouling, the issue of fixed penalty notices and for initiating court proceedings against offenders. By law dog owners must pick up any mess made by their dogs. If owners do not clear up behind their dog and evidence is available, CDC will investigate and prosecute them. The penalty for not clearing up behind your dog is up to £1,000 if taken to court, but there is also provision for a fixed penalty scheme with a fine of £50 in England. 
Peter's roots are in Horwich, Lancashire. He trained as a Unitarian Minister in Manchester, and after working in Bethnal Green and Hinckley in Leicestershire he became Chaplain, Bursar and Tutor in Ministerial Training at Harris Manchester College in Oxford. The work in Oxford also included being Minister to the Unitarian congregation that meets in the College every Sunday, and on his retirement the College made him an Emeritus Chaplain and Fellow.

Peter learnt to play the cornet as a teenager and his first band was Blackrod Band, followed by the Bolton Artillery (TA) Band. On National Service he joined the Band of the $2^{\rm nd}$ Bn. Parachute Regiment and switched from cornet to French horn, also being the Band Secretary for two years. In 1961 he left the army and bought a secondhand French horn for £40, which he played for his own pleasure for a time.

A few years ago, a love of brass bands led him to invite Yarnton Band to play carols outside his house for his neighbours in Little Blenheim, and they now raise around $\pounds 100$ each year. That carolling visit led to him joining us as the oldest member of the band, after hardly touching an instrument for 53 years!



Bringing to people's attention through their senses and experiencing more fully what is really in front of them, in that moment, is a real de-stressing skill and perfect for keeping balance in all our lives.

The emphasis is so much on the thoughts being the thing to address in finding balance, but what is really happening physically in the human body and mind when we enjoy the nature around us? We know getting out and connecting with nature is good for us, but what is going on? We recognize that tingly feeling when we are out in the thick of Mother Nature, but what is really happening, what is it that causes that tingly feeling? I am hoping to run a series of nature sensory workshops with Oxford University students, and also help develop a full study within the University itself to try and collect data exploring what physically happens to our bodies when out in nature. I suspect a lot of what's going on is the electrical impulses given and received by the brain during our countryside wanders. Is it all to do with the nervous system though? Is it that we breathe more deeply when out in nature, meaning we have more oxygen in our system so our bodies can actually function properly?

Is what's going on in our bodies different at differing stages in life, say, toddler, teenager, adult, and pensioner? If we understand what's going on when we are out in nature, are we able to sustain that process when we return to the hustle and bustle that can be life?

Next time you are out in the wildlife garden, observe yourself. What's happening in your mind and in your body too? It's something we take for granted but is worth exploring, I think.

I talk about not just looking, but seeing. Not just touching, but feeling. Not just listening but hearing too. That's not enough though, I'm coming to realise. To get the whole experience from a wildlife garden, we need to understand too. Happy Gardening.



S3 Bus Service

These are the final comments which we will be publishing on this topic. If there are any developments concerning the various routes and timetables, we will let you know.

I read with interest the letters printed in last month's edition concerning the S3 Bus Service.

One lady mentioned Green Lane as an example of a lack of alternative connections within our village and surrounding area. Much of Yarnton's day-to-day business is served by Kidlington's amenities, but apart from driving the one and a half miles it is frustrating that no other practical, safe or reliable means to get there exists. From Yarnton centre and south the most direct route to Kidlington is indeed through Green Lane (to the right of The Turnpike), but most will know that crossing the A44 by foot or bike at this point is terrifically dangerous. It seems that the 'solution' to keeping us safe at this dangerous crossing is to allow Green Lane to become overgrown and impassable, thereby discouraging most pedestrians or cyclists from ever considering the route. Transport policy should prioritise pedestrians, then cyclists, then public transport and then private vehicles. Making a safe and convenient crossing of the A44 at The Turnpike and reclaiming the Green Lane for pedestrians and cyclists should be a priority whether or not this impacts traffic flow on the A44.

Access to the new railway station from Yarnton is a similar story. Frieze Way is a dual carriageway with no provision made for pedestrians or cyclists; how can that be? There is plenty of room to accommodate a segregated footpath/cycle lane and this would make the route to Oxford Parkway more accessible without a car. Our roads won't cope with the growing number of vehicles population growth will bring. Spending comparatively small sums to link up alternative connections like those above will give us options and help unburden the load from the busy roads.

Name and email address supplied Editor's comment. I see from the Parish Council's December Minutes (available on the village website) that they may look into trying to obtain funding to improve Green Lane and make a route accessible to Kidlington.

Just to add to the discussion on Bus timetables we who live on the old bus route are the ones who now have to trek to Rutten Lane to get a bus into town. This was not so bad when we were young, but now there are some of us who find it too far to walk The Garth. With the new houses on the other side of the main road I am sure that there are others who would welcome a bus that travelled along the A44. I haven't been into Oxford for a few years. My only option is to park off road in the Paddocks??? Perhaps once an hour between 10 o'clock and 3 o'clock. Some might even leave their cars at home and use the bus. Please give it a thought.
