You are eligible if you are:

- over 65 and have never had a pneumo vaccine
- have a long-term health condition

Please call reception on 01865 379345 to check your eligibility and to book an appointment with a nurse. (Pneumococcal vaccine is a once only vaccination.)



REF: BUDGENS SERVICE ROAD

The huge popularity of the services provided at the Budgens site on the service road has brought with it major concerns in the community. Almost since the opening, Yarnton Parish Council has received complaints from village residents about the number of accidents, 'near misses' and 'standing still' queues in the service road and A44. Confusion caused by vehicles parked either side of the service road is exacerbated by vehicles from the A44 entering and exiting the garage, rejoining the A44, heading toward The Garth, and vehicles from the The Garth direction wishing to enter the garage site. Despite a number of attempts by the Parish Council to alleviate the situation by use of yellow lines, together with police and County Council highways team involvement, the situation is no better; in fact it's worse.


In an attempt to reduce the danger to pedestrians, cyclists and vehicle drivers alike the Parish Council is investigating the possibility of making the service road between the exit from the A44 to The Garth a one-way only route. In short, this would mean no right turn out of The Garth and no straight ahead from the north direction of the service road. The Parish Council is aware that this proposal is quite a major change for access into the garage site for vehicle owners, and is only made following consultation with Fraser (Budgens), Oxfordshire Council Highways and Thames Valley Police.

Yarnton Parish Council would like to assess the views of residents as to the proposal, and to this end invite residents to attend drop-in sessions at the Village Hall on Tuesday 4th October 6 p.m. – 8 p.m. and Monday 10th October 1 p.m. – 3 p.m., where it will be possible to view enlarged diagrams of the proposal and to talk to Parish Councillors, who will answer any questions the residents may have. Residents are also invited to attend the Parish Office on Monday and Thursday mornings for the same purpose. The opinions of residents could be critical to the outcome of the proposal, and this is your opportunity to express yours. Please take this opportunity to express your opinion either by emailing <u>yarntonparishcouncil@gmail.com</u> or writing to Yarnton Parish Council, Yarnton Village Hall, The Paddocks, giving your name and address please. Alternatively a simple questionnaire is available from the Parish Council office which can be returned to the Parish Council by either of the above methods. A copy of the questionnaire can be emailed to you if you prefer. 5th September 2016.

On a slightly drizzly Saturday afternoon the ribbon was officially cut, a plaque unveiled, and the doors to the new Yarnton Preschool building were finally opened to new and familiar faces, friends and supporters young and old!

The Grand Opening took place on Saturday 3rd September, and the rain did nothing to dampen spirits as the Pre-school staff and committee were joined by current, new and past children and their parents, plus some grandparents! We were also joined by staff who had served as far back as the 1980s, who shared their memories of working at Pre-school, along with some fantastic pictures documenting their time in the old building. Representatives from Oxfordshire County Council and Yarnton Parish Council, who have supported us in the lead up and move to the new building, also joined the celebrations. After a busy summer getting the new building ready - including a considerable amount of time building furniture, getting resources ready and watering the new lawn! - it was great to see so many people, especially the children, enjoying the bright and open space. They even managed to make full use of the new garden space despite, or maybe even because of, the rain that set in towards the end of the afternoon. The children, and a number of the grown ups too, were also entertained by local musician Nick Cope, who played an extensive set of very amusing and catchy children's songs!

Getting back into the old routine.

This is a phrase you hear quite a lot, especially after the holidays. The summer may have been one filled with time away, picnics and treats and time spent with family. It may have been a time to kick back and relax, or to tackle some job that you've been putting off for a long time. I guess we all experience it in a different way. Quite often, and especially at the school gates, I hear parents saying things are getting back to normal. We almost look forward to the little things that punctuate and regulate our days and our weeks. We may have a morning routine, getting the kids ready for school, walking the dog or doing household chores. We often have a set way of doing things. I like routine. I know that makes me sound boring and unadventurous, but I really do like it! I need a daily pattern to make sure that everything gets done, and I enjoy going through the 'tick list' in my head each day. I feel as if I have achieved something real, something accountable.

One routine that keeps me going is daily prayer. You might be the same. For some, this might be a quick one-liner to God saying something like 'keep me safe this day', or 'look after mum'. Prayer might be something we think about only when things are desperate and we are the end of our resources.

As priests, we make vows, quite a few of them. One that we make, in front of a lawyer before ordination, is to pray for those in our charge and for the world, and to 'meet God daily in prayer'. It sounds rather daunting, doesn't it, to meet God each day, to talk to Him and to make Him part of your routine.

At Yarnton and Begbroke Churches, we are starting to get others involved in this practice of daily prayer. As you might guess, as the Church of England, we have a new book for this purpose. It is newly published and it offers a simple way of meeting God each and every day. It is something that Woodstock have also done, and is working well.

Each morning just after 9 a.m. and at 5 p.m., someone in church is praying. Maybe that surprises you? Many people come in simply to wonder at the stained glass or look at the memorials. Each day, in the morning and in the evening, someone at St. Bartholomew's Church is praying. For you. You might think that a bit presumptuous. Why would I want anyone else to pray for me? Well, sometimes we don't want to pray, or we forget how to pray. At other times, we are too angry either with others, ourselves or with God. That's when we do it for you. If you would like to join us, do come along. It doesn't matter whether you come every day or just occasionally, someone will be there regardless.



I have preached on many occasions about regular prayer and its benefits. I guess you would expect this, as it is such an integral part of the Christian life. However, some research suggests that even clergy are spending much less time in personal prayer than they used to.

As I have mentioned before, my aunt, a great character and strong believer had a magnet on her fridge which said 'Seven days without prayer makes one weak'. Yes, a slightly cheesy saying, but one which is worth bearing in mind. May God bless us as we get 'back to normal' and as we continue our journey through 2016. *Fr. Nathan*

Health benefits from playing with Yarnton Band

Can your health improve from playing with our Band? According to the BBC it can, and they have produced an online guide detailing the health benefits of playing a musical instrument, <u>bbc.co.uk/guides/z3y3hv4</u>.

Some years ago when we lived in Leicestershire a local brass band player was a young girl who had suffered from severe asthma. Her GP advised her to play a brass instrument in order to help with breathing and it worked; the girl became a fine euphonium player. That GP was wise and his advice has recently been confirmed.

The BBC iWonder guide features research from a Japanese university that found playing a musical instrument can have health benefits. Research carried out on older adults taking drumming lessons found that they had higher than average white blood cell counts, which are vital for effective immune system responses. *Sorry, we only have a couple of percussionists, but playing other instruments in the band could also improve your health.* The guide is part of the BBC's Get Playing campaign, encouraging everyone to experience the joy of playing music.

Dr. Victoria Williamson writes: 'One theory as to why this might happen is that engaging with music influences bodily functions like breathing and blood flow. Better regulation of these systems in turn might lower the chances of harmful activity within the body's sympathetic nervous system, sometimes known as our stress response or "fight or flight". The guide also reveals why playing an instrument has a positive impact on the brain and body, and examines how hand-eye coordination improves, along with fine hearing skills which can help people track voices in noisy spaces.

I now look forward to our local Medical Practice giving out prescriptions stating 'Join Yarnton Band', and then maybe playing 'The Great Escape', 'A Trumpeter's Lullaby' and a few hymn tunes will improve your health! *Peter Hewis*.




