Dr. Iwan Hughes

Many people will have been saddened to hear of the death of Dr. Hughes in October, at the age of 88. He was a GP in Yarnton for many years and, as his son said to the Oxford Times, always endeavoured to put his patients' welfare at the heart of his practice. While serving as a GP he attended an aircraft crash at Kidlington Airport in 1968, helping to rescue the pilot from the wreckage.

Following his retirement Dr. Hughes moved to Cassington, but officially opened the new surgery in Yarnton in 2005. He will be gratefully remembered by many in the village.





Cherwell District Council

Many of us are familiar with the recycling of waste from our blue and brown bins, but not all of us know what happens to our green bin waste after it is collected. Cherwell sends all the rubbish from our green bins to the Energy Recovery Facility at Ardley, where it is burnt to produce energy. A range of complex processes carefully removes harmful gasses and other toxins from our waste, meaning that all we see coming from the facility's chimneys is steam and cleaned gasses.

The 'bottom ash' is recycled, while the 'fly ash', which used to go to landfill, is now transformed into building materials, meaning the entire process sends nothing to landfill. The heat generated by burning waste is converted to electricity, which is fed into the National Grid.

Christmas presents are meant for your family and friends. Make sure you do not leave them on view at ground floor level for the opportunist thief. Burglaries generally will increase either side of the festive season. Think about post coding laptops, cycles, etc. **Online and telephone scams** will increase in the run up to Christmas; unbelievable offers should always be treated with caution.

Personal attack alarms are very reassuring for young people travelling on their own, particularly during the hours of darkness. I have a limited number available 'free of charge' for school/college age young people. The alarms can also be purchased relatively cheaply £5-£6 each from <u>www.redlinesecurity.co.uk</u>. For the owners of smart phones there is now a free app available via; <u>www.straight-pr.co.uk</u> which is linked to The Hollie Gazzard Trust.


What's Christmas without Yarnton Band?

How does the Autumn and Winter Wildlife Garden make me feel, and why?

The world seems to be closing in a little since the clocks went back an hour in October; the nights are drawing in, we are consolidating, and stocking up for Christmas and the New Year. What is actually going on though? In general I think we are cosying up, or as the Danes would say 'We are experiencing the Hygge effect'. What is Hygge? Well, it's more of an experience and a feeling of cosyness and togetherness with those around us and the environment we are in.

The Autumn colours of reds and yellows are warming colours like a woollen blanket or a log fire. We are hunter gatherers genetically, so we naturally stock up and hunker down for the coming Winter. The wildlife in your garden is doing a lot of the same thing.

Newts are hiding away under the leaf litter now, and actually there is a whole world of life going on under the leaves in Autumn and Winter, as it can be a couple of degrees warmer under them. So don't rake up every leaf you see as that is sheltering wildlife trying to enjoy the Hygge effect too.

Butterflies like to stock up too, so a sweet boost will help them no end, and some need the energy to see them into hibernation too. A squashed banana and apples ferment and ooze in the sunshine; Red Admiral, Painted Lady and Comma butterflies should find it. When they do, they're likely to stay for hours and then return day after day, so again don't tidy all the rotting fruit away.

Enjoy the last few milder days out in the garden, but also give yourself chance to enjoy snuggling up indoors and recharging your batteries. It's not by accident that we feel like hibernating to at this time of year. Go with it and enjoy it. It's all part of the natural cycle of wildlife gardeners everywhere.



The Key Medical Practice Pressures on Primary Care This Winter

You may be aware that primary care nationwide is under considerable pressure at present. The increasing needs of our population, together with the large numbers of GPs who have left the profession in recent years, has led to a situation that is of serious concern to our NHS commissioners. The closure of North Bicester Surgery and the difficulties faced by Kennington Health Centre and Horsefair Surgery in Banbury illustrate the intensity and scale of the problem.

Despite this, the partners of The Key Medical Practice are determined to continue providing the best possible service for all patients, and our staff are working extremely hard to ensure the care we provide is safe and effective.

We understand that the effects of these pressures can be frustrating, but it is essential that we can rely on your support during this time. There is much you can do to help:

- Keep yourself as well as possible through exercise, reducing your alcohol intake, stopping smoking and eating well. - Consider seeking advice from a pharmacist for the treatment of self-limiting infections such as the common cold before you contact the practice.
- Let the practice know as soon as possible if you need to cancel an appointment, so it can be used for another patient.

- Consider expressing your concerns about the pressure on primary care to your local MP.
