### News from William Fletcher School

Before the Easter holidays our children in Year 4 visited **Hooke Court** in Dorset for a three day residential trip. They took part in a wide range of activities, including den building, a night time walk in the woods, learning about Viking life and making Viking long boats which they sailed on the Hooke Court Moat. On this trip the children really developed their independence skills. Our staff gave their time generously in supervising the children on the trip.

During March all the children took part in **Science week** at school. The older children had to solve a crime using forensic science, whilst the younger children explored and 'dug' for fossils (see photos). Throughout the week we carried out science investigations where younger and older children have worked together. Their investigations ranged from exploring how physical activities change their pulse rate to exploring colour. We have had parents working with groups of children; this has included learning about muscles and bones, the chemical elements and the periodic table. Our final workshop involved children learning how science can help diagnose illnesses. We have also worked this week with a scientist from Earth Watch, investigating and finding out about earthworms and their importance in our ecosystem. Many thanks to everybody who has supported our school Science Week.

During the Spring term our children took part in a **Partnership Science Competition** to design a marble maze. Many of our children's designs impressed the judges and these children were invited to Woodstock to take part in a science workshop. Congratulations to three of our children in year 5, who were overall winners from the partnership.

Thank you to everyone who supported **Red Nose Day** on 23<sup>rd</sup> March. It was great to see so many of the children dressed in red, and many with their red noses. In total we raised £230 for Comic Relief.

Our children in years 5 and 6 took part in the **Partnership Rugby Tournament** held at The Marlborough Secondary School. This year such was the enthusiasm for rugby that we were able to send three teams to compete. All 3 teams played well, one of the teams coming 3<sup>rd</sup> in the competition.

Thanks so much to our staff for the excellent Literacy evening that they provided for parents, carers and children during March.

Every week in our Monday morning assembly we celebrate the class whose attendance the previous week was the highest in the school. The class is awarded the **Attendance Teddy Bear** which they look after for the week. Good attendance at school is vital for all of our children, and we would like to thank our parents and carers for their continued support in ensuring that our children have good attendance.

**Public Access Defibrillators:** Following a generous donation from an anonymous donor and a grant from SSE, it has been possible to purchase a defibrillator and cabinet for Park Close. This is located outside the guest house next to 1 Park Close. The other defibrillators in the village are located at Yarnton Village Hall, The Paddocks, OX5 1TE (front of building near front door), Westlake Pharmacy, 75 Spencer Avenue, OX5 1NQ (on side wall), Yarnton Garden Centre, Sandy Lane, OX5 1PA (on right hand side of driveway into garden centre) and Rutten Lane Park (front of pavilion). If you find someone that you think may have had a cardiac arrest phone 999 as usual. The operator will tell you the location of the nearest defibrillator and will stay on the phone to help you if needed whilst paramedics are on their way to you. The defibrillator is useable by any member of the public and gives clear instructions to you.

#### The Merry Month of May

May is traditionally a month of celebration. You may know that William Fletcher School in Yarnton makes quite a deal of it and have Maypole dancing and all sorts of activities to celebrate the month. It is a great reason for a party and to have some fun, and we can do this in many ways.

When I was an undergraduate 23 years ago we would gather on Magdalen Bridge as the choir sang Madrigals from the top of the tower. Then, the most hardy of students would throw themselves off the bridge into the cold water beneath. This practice has now been stopped and the river is fenced off to curtail over enthusiastic revellers. I was never one of them, preferring to retire to a nice café for breakfast instead.

In ancient times May was a month in which to celebrate nature. It was a festival called Floralia, a celebration of flora and fauna. The festival, along with many others, was later Christianised and made into a celebration of Our Lady, hence the tradition of crowning a May Queen, who would dress in white and have a crown placed on her head. We have occasionally celebrated this tradition in Yarnton as we will do this year (with a modern twist).

May is a time of abundance and great colour. At the time of writing, the garden is just getting going again, with camellias, magnolias, cherry blossom and all manner of bulbs in full flower. It is a wonderful time of year. It is as if nature is spilling over, producing so much beauty, fragrance and food (particularly for birds and insects) in celebration of warmer weather. May is a time of giving thanks and of getting down to work. Lent and Easter give way to a long round of sunshine (we hope), days of gardening and starting projects outside. It is also a time for us to crack on with projects at work and at church. This year will see the start of our renovation of the chancel in Yarnton and the beginning of the process of providing toilets and running water at Begbroke. It is a time to press on and achieve.

These months ahead are, for me, ones of simple pleasures. Just being able to sit in the garden to drink a coffee, or have friends here for a BBQ is such a joy. Being able to harvest home grown veg and see the borders blooming is a real treat. This time of year is a time to feel truly grateful for all we have, for good neighbours, for our safe and secure homes, for our communities in which we live. I hope and pray that we can all stop to appreciate the great and the simple things that make living in our villages such a joy and a pleasure.

#### Salute to Yarnton

There can't be many village bands that have a march written for them but *Salute to Yarnton* is the name of a march written by Roy Newsome and thought to be for the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the band. For some time, 1975-81, the conductor of our band was David Williams, Principal Horn player with the Stanshawe Sun Life Band. Roy Newsome, who was also a fine organist, conducted Stanshawe Band near Bristol, and either David or the Band President Walter Oldfield commissioned Roy to write the march.

Another local composer Jim Alder wrote several pieces for brass bands including ours in Yarnton, and three of his titles in our library are *Joyous Youth, Thames Valley* and *Autumn Leaves* (not the song we all know!). Jim also wrote music with the titles *Anzio, The Tasmanian* and *Julius Caesar*. During the Second World War Jim served with a radar unit in North Africa, Sicily and Italy. He was often in dangerous situations, but was also able to experience Italian opera in Naples, Florence and Gradisca. Jim worked until his retirement in the Morris Motors trim shop department. From Australia Audrey Willett writes: 'Jim loved to take the baton at a practice and I remember speaking to him when the numbers in our band were low. He said he would do a hymn tune for us. He also had a daughter who played with the Ivy Benson All Girls' Band.'

### **Bulky Waste Collection Service**

For just £16 residents can arrange to have up to three items of furniture, large electrical or white goods collected by crews from outside their front door. Collections are arranged in advance and customers are then asked to leave the items outside and accessible on the agreed date. For more information, tel. 01295 227003 or visit <u>www.cherwell.gov.uk/bulky waste</u>. **Home and Garden Waste** 

The Home and Garden Waste scheme provides a cheap alternative to hiring a skip, as it allows residents to hire a large, lockable wheeled bin with a capacity of 1100 litres. Bins can be hired for people tidying out lofts or garages, undertaking a renovation, or clearing rubbish ahead of a house move. Electrical items cannot be included. The bins can be used to accommodate garden waste such as prunings, twigs and grass cuttings. However, stone, bricks, rubble and logs cannot be placed in the bin, as the contents will need to be recycled into compost. Each bin costs £50 per order to hire for two or four weeks, and this includes the loan of an additional blue recycling bin for household recycling such as plastics, paper and cardboard. Home and garden waste should not be mixed. Residents can book a bin by calling 01295 221916 or by emailing homeandgardensservice@cherwell-dc.gov.uk

### Small electrical recycling

Residents are reminded that small electrical items that fit into a standard size carrier bag can be recycled free using Cherwell's kerbside collection service. Products such as kettles, toasters or hair straighteners can be placed inside a bag and left on top of any coloured bin on collection day for the crews to take away.

### Interesting walls extended

On Sunday 19th March a group of us assembled in the car park of Kidlington Football Club to record the walls discovered when the club excavated the 'ditch' next to the old Wharf. The plan was to photograph and draw a scale drawing so that this wall, built by the canal builders, could be added to the Grade Two Listed bridge 228. Needless to say, although some us wore wellies, waders would have been of more use as the amount of water in the ditch was more than anticipated. It was also slippery and the sides steep; we also did not have a grid needed for drawing to scale. We were not able to draw, but we did dig and extend the wall. It is now about 5 metres long and at least 3 layers deep. At least one level of stone was below the water, so not visible or able to be recorded. We will have to go back - this time with a grid and hopefully when the water level has gone down.

We apologised to the rather large frog who was rudely awoken by our digging. We recorded and measured where we could. We wondered if there had ever been a well, or water tap on the wharf. We did look but were beaten back by the brambles.

Do let us know if you have memories of the Kidlington Wharf as it was built by the canal builders and in use up until the 1950s.
