Correspondence: All correspondence by letter or email to the Parish Council must include the sender's name and address. The Parish Council will not be able to discuss anonymous correspondence received without these details.

Public Access Defibrillators: Defibrillators in the village are located at: Yarnton Village Hall, The Paddocks, OX5 1TE (front of building near front door), Westlake Pharmacy, 75 Spencer Avenue, OX5 1NQ (on side wall), Yarnton Garden Centre, Sandy Lane, OX5 1PA (on right hand side of driveway into garden centre), 1 Park Close (in porch), and Rutten Lane Park (front of pavilion). If you find someone that you think may have had a cardiac arrest phone 999 as usual. The operator will tell you the location of the nearest defibrillator and will stay on the phone to help you if needed whilst paramedics are on their way to you. The defibrillator is useable by any member of the public and gives clear instructions to you.

Burial Ground: The extension to the burial ground is currently being designed. In preparation for the use of the extension, the bins located behind the fence will be taken away in the near future and will be replaced with wheelie bins located at the bottom of the bridle path.

Annual Parish Meeting: This was held on Friday 21st April, with over 30 members of the public attending. Michael Gibbard gave an informative presentation about Cherwell District Council's need to provide 4400 homes to meet Oxford City's unmet housing needs, showing sites that had been suggested locally and explaining details of Yarnton Parish Council's objections. CDC's proposals would go to their Executive Committee on 22nd May; further consultation will follow before the proposals go to the Government Planning Inspector in the summer.

Details of a new once-weekly bus service were explained, which was scheduled to start on Tuesday 18th May.

The Receipts and Payments Account for year ended 31st March 2017 showed a balance carried forward of £75197, an increase of £772. Accounts are available on the village website and will be available for viewing in the Parish office in June. We are required to submit the Annual Return to the appointed External Auditor by 4th July 2017.

Yarnton Village Website/Noticeboards: The Parish Council notice boards and village website <u>www.yarnton-village.org.uk</u> are where the Parish Council gives up-to-date information on things which are notified at short notices as well as publicising items of importance, so we would actively encourage you to regularly check the notice boards and the website. When possible

items of importance will also be posted on Spotted Kidlington/Yarnton and Yarnton Community pages of Facebook. Yarnton Community page has been set up on Facebook to publicise local news and let village organisations publicise events and news. **Notices around the village:** Notices advertising events are frequently posted on street lights, bus stops, etc. Whilst this is strictly 'flytipping' unless you own the property, the Parish Council accepts this is a useful way of advertising events but would request that the posters are removed within 2 or 3 days of the event happening, please.

Dog Fouling: It is an offence not to pick up after your dog, but it is also very offensive to members of the public to see dog bags dumped in hedges. PLEASE PICK UP DOG MESS IN A BAG AND DEPOSIT IN AN APPROPRIATE PLACE, preferably in one of the 12 dog bins located around the village, but they can also be put into your household green bin if that's preferable to you. **Yarnton Care Committee:** The Care Committee was set up in 1974 to give help where needed to residents of Yarnton. Services provided focus predominantly on older residents and/or those less mobile.

Compostable Caddy Bin Liners: Caddy bin liners can still be purchased from the Parish Council Office in the Village Hall on Mondays and Thursdays between 9 a.m. and 11 a.m., or will be delivered by arrangement if more convenient and not possible to collect. The price is £3 (three pounds) per roll of 40 liners. Telephone 378476. Dog bags are available free of charge at the same times.

Fixmystreet website: <u>www.fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk</u> is an easy to use website designed to help Oxfordshire residents to report, view, or discuss local highway faults directly and quickly to Oxfordshire County Council by simply locating them on a map. You can report faults linked to amenities or problems that are broken or dirty, damaged or dumped, or need fixing, cleaning or clearing such as: abandoned vehicles, dog fouling, flyposting or graffiti, flytipping or litter, unlit lampposts and potholes. Please make use of this website if you think anything in the village needs reporting, as by using the website you can see if it has already been reported and any update applicable.

Flytipping: *(From CDC website)* Flytipping can be dangerous. You can report incidents of fly tipping within Cherwell District online by following the links on their website. Cherwell District Council are responsible for acting on reports of fly tipping to both remove the waste which is on public land and to locate and prosecute the offenders. Where the waste is hazardous the council has a responsibility to ensure public safety until such time as the waste can be removed. It would be helpful with the investigation if the person making the report could leave contact details, so that we are able to confirm location of the fly tip and obtain any further information relating to the incident. Investigations are carried out to obtain any evidence that may help in identifying the offender. Arrangements are then made to clear the waste from public or council land. If the tip is on private land, then the land owner will be responsible for having the waste removed. If a potential fly tip has been found, it would be helpful to report the incident to us as soon as is possible so that any evidence that might still be in place can be obtained.

Send down your Holy Spirit....'

These were the words I heard almost 10 years ago as I was ordained priest in Durham Cathedral. It was quite a day. It happened to be the hottest day of the year, and the sun was blazing. As we lined up outside the Cathedral, having spent a year as a Deacon, our hearts were racing. What would it feel like to be made a priest? How would life be different? Would we be able to live up to the great expectations put upon us at ordination?

The answer is, it felt amazing. A wonderful feeling of completeness and stillness, and life WAS different. As to whether I have lived up to the great expectations of ordination, the answer is of course yes, and no. We all fail and get it wrong, but we also get quite a lot right too, by the grace of God.

Quite often, folk ask what the job of a priest is all about. Occasionally, you get the odd joker who says 'what's it like to work one day a week?' If only! Generally, my life as a priest is a great gift to me and hopefully to others. At the beginning of the ordination service, the bishop uses these words of introduction, which go some way to describing what our job is all about:

'God calls his people to follow Christ, and forms us into a royal priesthood, a holy nation, to declare the wonderful deeds of him who has called us out of darkness into his marvellous light.

The Church is the Body of Christ, the people of God and the dwelling-place of the Holy Spirit. In baptism the whole Church is summoned to witness to God's love and to work for the coming of his kingdom.

To serve this royal priesthood, God has given particular ministries. Priests are ordained to lead God's people in the offering of praise and the proclamation of the gospel. They share with the Bishop in the oversight of the Church, delighting in its beauty and rejoicing in its well-being. They are to set the example of the Good Shepherd always before them as the pattern of their calling. With the Bishop and their fellow presbyters, they are to sustain the community of the faithful by the ministry of word and sacrament, that we all may grow into the fullness of Christ and be a living sacrifice acceptable to God.'

So, no pressure. I am to be part of the Body of Christ, I am to lead the people of God, with the help of the bishop. I am to set a good example and help to sustain the community of the faithful and be a living sacrifice. Yikes! And yet, we do all of this not in our own power or even by our own will, but through the gifts of the Holy Spirit. That gives me some comfort.

Ordination is something we celebrate at this time of year, and as we approach Pentecost. We think of how the lives of all those who witnessed the miraculous pouring out of the Spirit were changed forever. But we sometimes focus on the more dramatic gifts. We think about the speaking in tongues, the ministries of healing and so on. We often forget that the Holy Spirit was left to us to be a comfort, an inspiration and a catalyst for change and renewal. This might not seem as exciting, but is an essential part of what my job is all about. On 25th June at 7 p.m, we are celebrating this pouring out of the Holy Spirit at St. Bartholomew's Church. It will be my tenth anniversary of ordination. You are all invited.

Trials and Tribulations

This article kind of wrote itself once I'd had an email through from a regular reader asking an age-old question about bird song recognition, that being 'how can one tell the difference between a Blackcap's call and a Garden Warbler's call?'

Tough one that, and it's not easy - even the most experienced birdwatcher can find this a challenge, with many birds identified as a Blackcap later turning out to be a Garden Warbler, and many a Garden Warbler transpiring to be a Blackcap. It's kind of down to experience, but that's not failsafe either. A good tip is that Blackcap hit higher notes and often deeper notes, whereas Garden Warblers don't have as wide a range of notes. But there are regular exceptions to the rule.

So' good luck with that one' is all I can say. It does raise the point again though, as to whether the not knowing what it is aspect affects the enjoyment of the wildlife in our gardens.

We get so busy identifying, categorising and understanding, that we often forget to just 'be', and just enjoy nature for what it is, in all its glory. Nature has many answers to the trials and tribulations we all encounter through life. To understand it is good, but is that really important at the end of the day?
