




Shrove Tuesday – 13th February.

Sit, Rest and Learn

I'm writing this particular piece sitting in the cafe above and overlooking the main concourse at Manchester Piccadilly train station. Not far above me is the roof, on which I can see feral pigeons and plenty of moss. I wonder how many of the commuters below are even aware there is still nature around, even amongst what may appear to be an urban wilderness? Barren of nature. Nature is often all around us. Yes, it's struggling, but as I've said many times, our ability seems to be receding with regard to sensing it, experiencing it, appreciating it. Sometimes we just need to sit, rest, observe and learn. Tomorrow, when you are out in the midst of somewhere that seems barren of wildlife, take a few moments. Sit, rest, watch and learn.

You may be out in the street, shopping centre, car park, or even in your own garden. Believe me; perceived barren spots for wildlife are often far from it. In gardens, many think the barren areas are behind the shed, under some conifer trees, or in the middle of a scorching hot lawn. The list can be endless.

I'd suggest though, there are very few barren sections in any garden. Wildlife is very adaptable; we just need to take time to see it. Try sitting for a while, quietly, still. You'll soon start to notice all sorts of little movements from the ecosystems around you. Watch, see what is happening to the wildlife there. What is it doing? How is it using the area in front of you? The answers are there, before you; you don't need me sitting next to you, giving a running commentary.

By simply watching what's going on, we can all learn what habitats and gardening techniques we could incorporate in any given environment to give nature a helping hand. It's the same wildlife that we are perhaps overlooking on a daily basis?

Sometimes, all we need to do is, sit and rest for a while. Answers and solutions often come in that silence. Happy Gardening.


