Damaged Bins: Cherwell District will repair damaged bins free of charge. If a bin cannot be repaired they will replace it for free. Bins or caddies that are lost or stolen will be replaced free of charge. Call 01295 227003 to report damaged or missing bins.

Bottle Banks: The bottle banks are located in the layby in Cassington Road (opposite Cresswell Road). If the banks are full please take your bottles home, don't leave them or any other rubbish at the sides of the bin – this constitutes fly-tipping.

**Public Access Defibrillators:** Defibrillators in the village are located at: Yarnton Village Hall, The Paddocks, OX5 1TE (front of building near front door), Westlake Pharmacy, 75 Spencer Avenue, OX5 1NQ (on side wall), Yarnton Garden Centre, Sandy Lane, OX5 1PA (on right hand side of driveway into garden centre), 1 Park Close (in porch), and Rutten Lane Park (front of pavilion). If you find someone that you think may have had a cardiac arrest phone 999 as usual. The operator will tell you the location of the nearest defibrillator and will stay on the phone to help you if needed whilst paramedics are on their way to you. The defibrillator is useable by any member of the public and gives clear instructions to you.

**Yarnton Village Website/Noticeboards:** The Parish Council notice boards and village website <u>www.yarnton-village.org.uk</u> are where the Parish Council gives up-to-date information on things which are notified at short notices as well as publicising items of importance, so we would actively encourage you to regularly check the notice boards and the website. When possible items of importance will also be posted on Spotted Kidlington/Yarnton and Yarnton Community pages of Facebook. Yarnton Community page has been set up on Facebook to publicise local news and let village organisations publicise events and news. **Public Footpaths:** The Parish Council has been approached by the local farming community to request that persons using public footpaths remain only on the designated routes defined by yellow arrows. They welcome walkers to the open countryside but request that dogs be kept under close control or on a lead, and that crops are not walked on. It should be appreciated that the crops being grown are for human consumption, such as wheat for making bread and cooking oils.

**Volunteering in your community:** Several local organisations are in need of additional volunteers to be able to continue into the future. Please see separate article within this issue for contact details for these organisations and consider giving some of your time to help.

**Flytipping:** (*From CDC website*) Flytipping can be dangerous. You can report incidents of fly tipping within Cherwell District online by following the links on their website. Cherwell District Council are responsible for acting on reports of fly tipping to both remove the waste which is on public land and to locate and prosecute the offenders. Where the waste is hazardous the council has a responsibility to ensure public safety until such time as the waste can be removed. It would be helpful with the investigation if the person making the report could leave contact details, so that we are able to confirm location of the fly tip and obtain any further information relating to the incident. Investigations are carried out to obtain any evidence that may help in identifying the offender. Arrangements are then made to clear the waste from public or council land. If the tip is on private land, then the land owner will be responsible for having the waste removed. If a potential fly tip has been found, it would be helpful to report the incident to us as soon as is possible so that any evidence that might still be in place can be obtained. **Dog Fouling:** It is an offence not to pick up after your dog, but it is also very offensive to members of the public to see dog bags dumped in hedges. PLEASE PICK UP DOG MESS IN A BAG AND DEPOSIT IN AN APPROPRIATE PLACE, preferably in one of the 12 dog bins located around the village, but they can also be put into your household green bin if that's preferable to you. If you notice a full dog bin please report to Cherwell District Council www.cherwell.gov.uk/info/193/dogs/396/dog-bins, Phone: 01295 227007 or email <u>customer.service@cherwell-dc.gov.uk</u>

**Fixmystreet website:** <u>www.fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk</u> is an easy to use website designed to help Oxfordshire residents to report, view, or discuss local highway faults directly and quickly to Oxfordshire County Council by simply locating them on a map. You can report faults linked to amenities or problems that are broken or dirty, damaged or dumped, or need fixing, cleaning or clearing such as: abandoned vehicles, dog fouling, flyposting or graffiti, flytipping or litter, unlit lampposts and potholes. Please make use of this website if you think anything in the village needs reporting, as by using the website you can see if it has already been reported and any update applicable.

**Compostable Caddy Bin Liners/Dog bags:** Caddy bin liners can still be purchased from the Parish Council Office in the Village Hall on Mondays and Thursdays between 9 a.m. and 11 a.m., or will be delivered by arrangement if more convenient and not possible to collect. The price is £3 (three pounds) per roll of 40 liners. Telephone 378476. Dog bags are available free of charge at the same times.

Matt Wheeler from Thames Valley Police came to talk to us in January about every scam you can think of, and of course we have all been bothered by such callers and annoyances. There can be the endless telephone calls we receive, or on the doorstep where these people offer goods or services we really don't want or need. They are known to target older, vulnerable people and they generally work in organised groups, sometimes posing as a legal company, but leave no paperwork or contact details in their pursuit of the vulnerable who will buy from them. They can be very charming and persuasive and so we are told to be especially aware that these ruthless callers will offer a free inspection of your property. They will initially quote a fairly cheap price until the work has been carried out, but this will then lead to a much higher demand for payment for work that possibly didn't need carrying out in the first place.

There are many ways these scammers operate, and the effects of being scammed can be very serious and can lead to lack of confidence, depression and illness.

The golden rules in dealing with such scams are:

Do I really need this? Get 3 quotations and don't be rushed into any deal, and finally say to yourself - if it's out of the blue then it's not for you (me).







#### **Exposure to Nature**

Time spent in gardens, parks and countryside and amongst wildlife itself can help most people's mental wellbeing, according to new research. Research carried out by King's College London, J&L Gibbons, who are landscape architects, and art foundation Nomad Projects claims that if we experience an interaction with nature it will improve our mental wellbeing. The research found 'significant immediate' benefits associated with trees, the sky and birdsong. It's claimed the benefits lasted for several hours.

Businesses and companies are starting to improve staff wellbeing via access to outdoor spaces and interactions with nature.

The research maybe suggests that nature could be especially beneficial to those individuals who are at risk of poor mental health. It's a low-cost activity, and if aimed at in urban populations it could make quite some impact, I feel.

This study shows the value of academic and nonacademic researchers coming together to make tangible real-world benefits. The paper, entitled *Urban Mind: Using Smartphone Technologies to investigate the impact of Nature on Mental Wellbeing in Real Time* has been published in the journal BioScience.

I'm sure we could have all told them that stepping out into our own gardens or local park has measurable and immeasurable benefits, but at least they are now listening. Don't underestimate the impact on our minds and bodies from time we spend out there in the wildlife garden.

Wildlife gardens give us so much in return for our care and time. Happy Gardening.




