#### William Fletcher Primary School Article 12 Committee

By the time the May edition of Yarnton Village News is printed and distributed, we should have advertised for the new Rector, with a closing date late in May. Interviews are scheduled to take place in mid-June. Please pray for all those involved in the selection process, not just from Yarnton but from the parishes of Begbroke and Shipton-on-Cherwell with whom this post will be shared, and also those in the diocese who share in the process and support us through it.

At the end of April, we held our annual meeting to review the life of the church during 2017 and to elect new representatives to the Church Council. Our thanks go to all those who have taken an active part in the life of the church. A particular thanks should go to John Appleton who is stepping down as Churchwarden (not his first stint, either!). We welcome those who have joined the Church Council at the Annual Meeting and those continuing in this ministry. We also are grateful for those who keep the church running in a number of ways that are not so visible, especially during the vacancy.

#### **Ascension and Pentecost**

May sees both Ascension Day (Thursday 10<sup>th</sup>) and the Day of Pentecost (Sunday 20<sup>th</sup>). Since the late fourth century, on the fortieth day of Easter the Church celebrates Christ's ascension to heaven. This marks the end of his earthly ministry and the Feast of the Ascension is therefore closely connected with the theme of mission.

The season of Easter is celebrated for fifty days, culminating in the Day of Pentecost. Matthew's Gospel ends with Jesus's final words to his disciples, that they should go to all nations and make disciples, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit (Matthew 28.19-20). In John's Gospel, Jesus instructed his followers to pray for the coming of the Holy Spirit (John 14.15-17). The feast of Pentecost celebrates the account of the Holy Spirit coming on the disciples empowering them for mission (Acts 2.1-47). Ascension and Pentecost are closely linked. The Church is now to be the new body of Christ, filled with his life through the gift of the Holy Spirit.

#### The Reverend Eric Craig

The Reverend Eric Craig, former Rector of Yarnton, Begbroke and Shipton on Cherwell 1987 - 2004, passed away on  $28^{th}$  January this year and a service of thanksgiving for his life was held at Holy Trinity Church, Witney on  $23^{rd}$  February. His ashes are now interred in Yarnton Burial Ground.



#### WW1 Soldier remembered

On Friday 23rd March 2018 a quarter peal of 1320 All Saints Place Doubles was rung at St. Bartholomew's by ringers from the Woodstock Witney Branch. This was in honour of Pvt. William James Cox who was killed on 24th March 1918 aged 28 while on active service with the Royal Warwickshire Regiment 2nd/7th Battalion. William Cox was a Yarnton ringer and the son of Thomas and Rachel Cox of The College, Yarnton. At the time of the 1911 census he was working with his father who was a grocer and coal dealer. He enlisted in Oxford, initially in the Oxfordshire & Buckinghamshire Light Infantry and is commemorated at Pozieres Memorial, France. We wonder if his family remains in Yarnton.

#### **Artweeks in Yarnton**

Andrew specializes in inscribed commemorative pots and has recently been making bowls to celebrate the eightieth birthday of the Yarnton W.I. later this year.

Artweeks lasts three weeks and extends throughout Oxfordshire with exhibitors in the North and West in the first week, 5<sup>th</sup> May to 13<sup>th</sup> May; Oxford City in the second week, 12<sup>th</sup> May to 20<sup>th</sup> May; and South Oxfordshire in the third week, 19<sup>th</sup> May to 27<sup>th</sup> May. #### Householders warned about leaving waste next to recycling points

A fly-tipper has paid a £150 fine after dumping household waste next to a recycling point in Yarnton.

After a local resident reported the fly-tip at the Cassington Road recycling point to Cherwell District Council, environmental enforcement officers discovered items identifying the address where the waste had come from. and the householder accepted the fine.

Ed Potter, Cherwell's Assistant Director for Environmental Services, said: 'If a recycling bank is full, it is very important that people take waste home or to the tip. Even if you have good intentions and leave recycling bagged up nicely next to the correct bin, it acts as a signal to others that waste can be left there. In this case the waste was a mixture of materials and very little of it could have been recycled in the banks it was left next to.'






