I think the Oxford Sausage is still fairly highly rated. Finally, probably the most famous of our exports is the chunky, dark, gorgeous Oxford Marmalade. This comes from the Cooper family who made their marmalade in the middle 1800s. Frank Cooper frequently visited Seville to inspect his very important ingredient and their delightful product continues to sell around the world today. Annual Parish Meeting: This was held on Friday 20th April with approximately 15 members of the public attending. Bob Marley, Chief Executive of Oxford Garden & Shopping Village (formerly Yarnton Nurseries) gave a very informative presentation about recent and forthcoming changes to the business which has recently celebrated 50 years. Many thanks to Bob for giving up his time to attend the meeting.

The Receipts and Payments Account for year ended 31st March 2018 showed a balance carried forward of £72,767, a decrease of £2,431. Accounts are available on the village website and will be available for viewing in the Parish Office in June/July. We are required to submit the Annual Return to the appointed External Auditor by 10th July 2018.

Cherwell District Council: At the election on 3rd May Alaric Rose was elected to Cherwell District Council for the Kidlington West ward to serve along with current councillors Alan Mackenzie-Wintle and Sandra Rhodes. We sincerely thank Nigel Simpson for his valuable contribution to the Parish Council and residents during the last two years.

OurBusBartons bus: Please note that passengers using this bus, which operates on Tuesdays, can use local authority concessionary passes. The bus now stops in Yarnton and Kidlington twice on Tuesday, offering more flexibility.

Damaged Bins: Cherwell District Council will repair damaged bins free of charge. If a bin cannot be repaired they will replace it for free. Bins or caddies that are lost or stolen will be replaced free of charge. Call 01295 227003 to report damaged or missing bins.

Public Access Defibrillators: Defibrillators in the village are located at: Yarnton Village Hall, The Paddocks, OX5 1TE (front of building near front door), Westlake Pharmacy, 75 Spencer Avenue, OX5 1NQ (on side wall), Yarnton Garden Centre, Sandy Lane, OX5 1PA (on right hand side of driveway into garden centre), 1 Park Close (in porch), and Rutten Lane Park (front of pavilion). If you find someone that you think may have had a cardiac arrest phone 999 as usual. The operator will tell you the location of the nearest defibrillator and will stay on the phone to help you if needed whilst paramedics are on their way to you. The defibrillator is useable by any member of the public and gives clear instructions to you.

Yarnton Village Website/Noticeboards: The Parish Council notice boards and village website <u>www.yarnton-village.org.uk</u> are where the Parish Council gives up-to-date information on things which are notified at short notices as well as publicising items of importance, so we would actively encourage you to regularly check the notice boards and the website. When possible items of importance will also be posted on Spotted Kidlington/Yarnton and Yarnton Community pages of Facebook. Yarnton Community page has been set up on Facebook to publicise local news and let village organisations publicise events and news.

Compostable Caddy Bin Liners/Dog bags: Caddy bin liners can still be purchased from the Parish Council Office in the Village Hall on Mondays and Thursdays between 9 a.m. and 11 a.m., or will be delivered by arrangement if more convenient and not possible to collect. The price is £3 (three pounds) per roll of 40 liners. Telephone 378476. Dog bags are available free of charge at the same times.

Bottle Banks: The bottle banks are located in the layby in Cassington Road (opposite Cresswell Road). If the banks are full please take your bottles home, don't leave them or any other rubbish at the sides of the bin – this constitutes fly-tipping.

Flytipping: (*From CDC website*) Flytipping can be dangerous. You can report incidents of fly tipping within Cherwell District online by following the links on their website. Cherwell District Council are responsible for acting on reports of fly tipping to both remove the waste which is on public land and to locate and prosecute the offenders. Where the waste is hazardous the council has a responsibility to ensure public safety until such time as the waste can be removed. It would be helpful with the investigation if the person making the report could leave contact details, so that we are able to confirm location of the fly tip and obtain any further information relating to the incident. Investigations are carried out to obtain any evidence that may help in identifying the offender. Arrangements are then made to clear the waste from public or council land. If the tip is on private land, then the land owner will be responsible for having the waste removed. If a potential fly tip has been found, it would be helpful to report the incident to us as soon as is possible so that any evidence that might still be in place can be obtained.

Dog Fouling: It is an offence not to pick up after your dog, but it is also very offensive to members of the public to see dog bags dumped in hedges. PLEASE PICK UP DOG MESS IN A BAG AND DEPOSIT IN AN APPROPRIATE PLACE, preferably in one of the 12 dog bins located around the village, but they can also be put into your household green bin if that's preferable to you. If you notice a full dog bin please report to Cherwell District Council <u>www.cherwell.gov.uk/info/193/dogs/396/dog-bins</u>, Phone: 01295 227007 or email <u>customer.service@cherwell-dc.gov.uk</u>

Fixmystreet website: www.fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk is an easy to use website designed to help Oxfordshire residents to report, view, or discuss local highway faults directly and quickly to Oxfordshire County Council by simply locating them on a map. You can report faults linked to amenities or problems that are broken or dirty, damaged or dumped, or need fixing, cleaning or clearing such as: abandoned vehicles, dog fouling, flyposting or graffiti, flytipping or litter, unlit lampposts and potholes. Please make use of this website if you think anything in the village needs reporting, as by using the website you can see if it has already been reported and any update applicable.

Thames Valley Police, Cherwell and West Oxon. Kidlington Neighbourhood Team Report – April 2018

In June 2017, Thames Valley Police underwent a restructuring of frontline Policing. Each Local Policing Area (LPA) now comprises:

- 1. Emergency Response Teams attending 999 calls and more urgent incidents, dealing with initial enquiries.
- 2. Investigation hubs made up of case investigators, PCs and Detectives dealing with volume crime, taking ownership of investigations, dealing with prisoners and case files.
- 3. Neighbourhood teams broken down into geographical teams consisting of a neighbourhood supervisor and community support officers engaging with our areas, offering crime prevention and gathering intelligence and a problem solving team of officers looking at reducing demand and vulnerability.

We still have various departments - Roads Policing, Force CID, Armed Response, Dog and Mounted sections, Domestic Abuse and Child Abuse to name a few.

Kidlington Neighbourhood team has been joined with Woodstock and Eynsham Neighbourhood teams and comprises 2 parttime Sergeants, a PC Neigbourhood Supervisor, 5 Police Community Support Officers and 4 PC Problem Solving Officers. At the end of this month, we have a new Community Support Officer starting. The team can be contacted via email – <u>KidlingtonNHPT@thamesvalley.pnn.police.uk</u>

The Cherwell and West Oxon Local Policing Area priorities are-

Dwelling Burglaries - the latter half of last year saw a significant increase in domestic burglaries throughout the LPA. Kidlington did not escape this trend and we too suffered a spike in burglary, particularly organised groups coming from out of our Force area. The main target for these offenders is jewellery. Whilst there has been a decline in the last couple of months, the geographical locality of our area means we are vulnerable, due to the major road networks easily accessible from Kidlington.

Child Sexual Exploitation - the various high profile cases of organised groups of males taking advantage of young persons is something that has highlighted this worrying crime. The Neighbourhood Team has been involved for a number of years, working closely with Children's Homes. A member of the team is a dedicated point of contact with each residential children's home, and the team follows up reports of missing children where there is any suggestion of vulnerability. We work closely with the Multi Agency Support Hub MASH, made up of Police, Social Services, NHS, Probation and Councils, sharing information to safeguard using each organisation's areas of expertise.

Domestic Abuse - all domestic incidents are thoroughly investigated and reviewed by the MASH team. These can be classified as either a crime, or a crime-related incident, where no criminal offences have been committed. This is still an area of particular concern to Police and partner agencies as it often takes place behind closed doors.

County Drug lines and Child drug exploitation - County lines are operated by individuals or groups who use mobile phone 'lines' to extend their drug dealing business into new locations outside their home, usually urban areas and often centred around good transport links. A 'county line' enterprise almost always involves exploitation of vulnerable people. This can involve both children and adults who require safeguarding. We are aware of 'lines' operating in Banbury, Bicester and Witney and there are links to our area as well.

We need your help to address all of these areas and to work with us to safeguard our communities. We welcome anyone interested in making a positive contribution to making Kidlington a safer place to live and work.

Together we will look at what issues are impacting on the area and how both the Police and our partner agencies can problem solve together with the support of the local community. *PCSO Hayley Keeping, C6906, Kidlington*
