I took a walk around my local streets the other day, showing a guest around to get a feel of where I live. We rely on plants for our own health on many levels, but do plants rely on us?

Long after our species has disappeared from planet earth, those plants will continue, unabashed very often. Let's appreciate them, in all their variations in our own towns and villages, and not just in the rain forests of the world. Happy Gardening.

Our new Rector has started!

Revd. Oliver Petter was installed as Rector of the Benefice of Yarnton with Begbroke and Shipton-on-Cherwell on Monday 23rd July.

Oliver was born in Reading, and has had a lifelong love of Oxford, where he grew up. Having spent most of the last decade in London, he is excited to be moving back to Oxfordshire and to be living in Yarnton.

He studied Modern Languages at St. Edmund Hall, Oxford (2001-5), before spending the following year working for Creation Theatre. He then moved to London to continue to explore a sense of calling, working for the charity Crisis and subsequently in marketing. Following work as the Verger at Temple Church, London from early 2008 until 2011, he trained for the Priesthood at St. Stephen's House from 2011-2014, a highlight of which was spending six weeks in the Anglican church in Rio de Janeiro. Oliver then served his curacy in the Parish of Old St. Pancras, a vibrant Team Ministry situated around Camden and King's Cross, from 2014-17. From 2017-18 he served as Chaplain Missioner at Pusey House, and as an Assistant Priest in the Parish of St. Barnabas, Jericho.

Oliver comes from a family of musicians, and loves music of many kinds, and particularly enjoys singing. He has been involved in organising the annual Oxford Bach Ensemble fundraising concerts since 2006. He is also a keen drummer, and spent plenty of time playing for different bands in earlier years. Oliver enjoys following several sports, has a particular enthusiasm for all forms of cricket and a long-standing affection for Oxford United football club. He loves walking and running in the countryside, and has a growing interest in gardening.

Oliver is thrilled to be coming to the Benefice and to begin serving the people of Yarnton, Begbroke and Shipton-on-Cherwell.



Summer 2018 got off to a sizzling start at our lecture on 5th June, with Mary McIntyre, FRAS, giving members a quickfire presentation on the history of astronomy. In just over an hour she whisked an appreciative audience from the 'big bang' of 13.8 billion years ago, via snapshots of the classical astronomers - Galileo, Tycho Brahe, Copernicus and the rest – to issues currently debated, such as the role of comets, and today's astrophotography ('the greatest innovation since the telescope'). She finished with a slew of recent photos of the moon and other heavenly bodies. taken from the speaker's own back garden.

Meanwhile, the Branch's doughty interest groups continue to flourish: both the Books and Playreading Groups, for example, working through a catholic selection of works by British authors and playwrights (some playreaders also had a crack at the French dramatist Jean Anouilh, admittedly in translation).



News from Cherwell Community Archaeology

Object biography: The Pen Knife:

Originally this is exactly what the pen knife was used for – sharpening, cleaning and cutting a feather quill to make a pen. The original 18th century pen knife would have had a *fixed blade, not the flexible two-bladed affair which is available today.



The pen knife found in test pit 007 in The Moors is a modern knife, almost certainly pre-war as it was found in the plough soil in the bottom layer (context 1003) and was among the last items found by one of our members on the Sunday morning of the $17^{\rm th}$ June. We speculated for a while on how this item came to be on what was or would have been farm land. I have now been reliably informed that most farm workers would have carried a small pen knife, mostly for cutting bailing twine or clearing the mud from horses' hooves – so one farm worker in Kidlington would have been a bit peeved to find he had lost his knife – good for us though.

Until this time much of what was found was as expected, except for the odd piece of pottery, which may be older than the house. Any pottery found dating from a period prior to context 1003 is likely to have been brought in with top soil after the house was finished.

The house was built post WW2, and a lot of what was found was builders 'mess,' broken glass, brick, nails and plastic. We did have another exciting find which will make it onto the Artefact of the Month on our 'new' website, https://cherwellcommunityarchaeology.weebly.com/ well worth a visit if you are interested in the archaeology of the local area and to see what we are up to in the coming months.



OurBusBartons bus: Please note that passengers using this bus, which operates on Tuesdays, can use local authority concessionary passes. The bus stops in Yarnton and Kidlington twice on Tuesday.

Damaged Bins: Cherwell District Council will repair damaged bins free of charge. If a bin cannot be repaired they will replace it for free. Bins or caddies that are lost or stolen will be replaced free of charge. Call 01295 227003 to report damaged or missing bins.

Bottle Banks: The bottle banks are located in the layby in Cassington Road (opposite Cresswell Road). If the banks are full please take your bottles home, don't leave them or any other rubbish at the sides of the bin – this constitutes fly-tipping. **Public Access Defibrillators:** Defibrillators in the village are located at: Yarnton Village Hall, The Paddocks, OX5 1TE (front of building near front door), Westlake Pharmacy, 75 Spencer Avenue, OX5 1NQ (on side wall), Yarnton Garden Centre, Sandy Lane, OX5 1PA (on right hand side of driveway into garden centre), 1 Park Close (in porch), and Rutten Lane Park (front of pavilion). If you find someone that you think may have had a cardiac arrest phone 999 as usual. The operator will tell you the location of the nearest defibrillator and will stay on the phone to help you if needed whilst paramedics are on their way to you. The defibrillator is useable by any member of the public and gives clear instructions to you.

Yarnton Village Website/Noticeboards: The Parish Council notice boards and village website www.yarnton-village.org.uk are where the Parish Council gives up-to-date information on things which are notified at short notices as well as publicising items of importance, so we would actively encourage you to regularly check the notice boards and the website. When possible items of importance will also be posted on Spotted Kidlington/Yarnton and Yarnton Community pages of Facebook. Yarnton Community page is on Facebook to publicise local news and let village organisations publicise events and news.

Flytipping: (From CDC website) Flytipping can be dangerous. You can report incidents of fly tipping within Cherwell District online by following the links on their website. Cherwell District Council are responsible for acting on reports of fly tipping to both remove the waste which is on public land and to locate and prosecute the offenders. Where the waste is hazardous the council has a responsibility to ensure public safety until such time as the waste can be removed. It would be helpful with the investigation if the person making the report could leave contact details, so that we are able to confirm location of the fly tip and obtain any further information relating to the incident. Investigations are carried out to obtain any evidence that may help in identifying the offender. Arrangements are then made to clear the waste from public or council land. If the tip is on private land, then the land owner will be responsible for having the waste removed. If a potential fly tip has been found, it would be helpful to report the incident to us as soon as is possible so that any evidence that might still be in place can be obtained.

Dog Fouling: It is an offence not to pick up after your dog, but it is also very offensive to members of the public to see dog bags dumped on the ground and in hedges. PLEASE PICK UP DOG MESS IN A BAG AND DEPOSIT IN AN APPROPRIATE PLACE, preferably in one of the 12 dog bins located around the village, but they can also be put into your household green bin if that's preferable to you. If you notice a full dog bin please report to Cherwell District Council

You can report faults linked to amenities or problems that are broken or dirty, damaged or dumped, or need fixing, cleaning or clearing such as: abandoned vehicles, dog fouling, flyposting or graffiti, flytipping or litter, unlit lampposts and potholes. Please make use of this website if you think anything in the village needs reporting, as by using the website you can see if it has already been reported and any update applicable.



Neighbourhood Watch

I was very sad to hear of the passing of Peter Luke who for many years had been a Neighbourhood Watch Street Coordinator for Rutten Lane. His commitment to NHW was greatly appreciated.

Online shopping, whilst being convenient, is also vulnerable to criminal activity. Always ensure you have the correct web address, it is a secure page, and do not click on links or attachments within unsolicited emails. 65% of Action Fraud reports during the 2016 Christmas period were linked to online auction sites.

Thames Valley Police monthly update for June

Yarnton had 51 incidents reported in June.

Abandoned Calls: 2 incidents. This is where someone has accidently called us or hoax call.

Suspicious Activity: 1 incident. Possible drug dealing in Hayday Close. The address in question was served a drugs warrant. **Shoplifting/bilking:** 2 incidents. This involved an item of clothing from a shop at Yarnton Nurseries and someone making off without payment at the BP garage.

Traffic: 7 incidents. This includes erratic driving and dangerous driving where someone was hanging out of the car. Broken down vehicle, road traffic collision - damage only, drunk and in charge and abandoned vehicles. We keep getting a few calls regarding unknown people parking on the slip road on the Woodstock Road and residents complaining that they shouldn't park there because they don't live there, and it also makes it a struggle for the bin men. There are no restrictions or issues regarding parking there. It might be an inconvenience - however it is not a police issue.

Public welfare/safety: 7 incidents. This involved a male acting oddly, suspicious call pretending to be from BT asking for card details, vehicle being recognised from TV alert. Also there has been the issue of the male offering his Oakland Trees services. A TV alert was sent out by police to inform locals of this individual and to call police if he targets you or is seen the area. We have had a couple of calls regarding this male. Please just spread the word that residents should not take door-to-door services from a male offering tree cutting or treatment services. He normally drives a pick-up truck and hands out leaflets advertising his company called Oakland Tree services. The male is known to police for fraud and was followed by Watchdog who found out he takes advantage of the elderly and the vulnerable. If you call 101 regarding this male please bear in mind we might not be able to get out to the area every time depending on how busy we are with higher priority calls. There was also a concerning report where a white car approached a boy in Yarnton and the driver tried talking to him. Not much was said, however it was very random and inappropriate.

Burglary: 1 incident. Residents of a house in The Paddocks had their back window smashed. The house was turned upside down. Still ongoing.

Anti-social behaviour: 12 incidents. Youths causing problems for a certain resident in the Cresswell Close area. Youths are being a nuisance, abusive and harassing this individual. Ongoing issue being dealt with. Issue with youths smoking Cannabis and kids throwing bricks at a house. Vandalising guttering to garages in Hayday Close. There are some ongoing issues with ASB which we are aware of and are trying to deal with in the best way possible.

Theft from vehicle: 2 incidents. Road blocker stolen and stolen number plates.

Criminal damage: 1 incident. Vehicle tyres slashed believed to link to ongoing ASB issue.

Other incidents that can't be discussed: 15 incidents.

This is what has been happening in the last month. Obviously we also had the issue of the unauthorised encampment in Kidlington. We understand a lot of the residents and community were disheartened with the approach from police. However there is a process we have to follow. We understand that the padlock was broken off by them and they created a bit of mess. However this was not enough for us to issue a section 61. Council were dealing with it and I believe the council were there at 6 a.m. when they had left to start cleaning it up ready for the public to use again. *PCSO Hayley Keeping, C6906, Kidlington*
