### 1066: A Medieval Mosaic Exhibition

1066: A Medieval Mosaic is a Guinness World Recordwinning exhibition which has toured a number of locations in the UK before arriving at Soldiers of Oxfordshire Museum (SOFO Museum), Woodstock. The museum is in the grounds of the Oxfordshire Museum, 14 Park Street, Woodstock, OX20 1SW.

The mosaic took its creator Michael A. Linton 33 years to complete after he started work on the piece in 1979. Made from 33 million individual pieces of spring steel, the mosaic now measures 64 metres long and weighs 350kg. This earned 1066: A Medieval Mosaic the title of the world's largest steel mosaic and a place in the Guinness Book of World Records.

The mosaic re-creates the entirety of the original Bayeux Tapestry, including the depiction of the Battle of Hastings, but also expands on it with additional historic scenes. In 2005 Michael added an 8 metre 'Finale Section' which depicts events leading up to the crowning of William the Conqueror on Christmas Day 1066.

In 2012, a further 22 metre section was added to cover the Battle of Fulford and the Battle of Stamford Bridge. These added scenes bring this re-creation close to twice the length of the real Bayeux Tapestry.

To coincide with arrival of the mosaic, SOFO Museum will also hold a mini-exhibition of objects that tell the story of WW2 as the Bayeux tapestry does for the Norman Conquest. Visitors will be able to see these objects on display until February 2019.

1066: A Medieval Mosaic will be on display until 1<sup>st</sup> February 2019, throughout the museum's regular opening hours, and is included in the admission price.

SOFO Museum is open Tuesday – Friday 10a.m. to 5 p.m., Saturdays 11 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Sundays 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. Changes to regular opening times are always added to the museum website.

One of the privileges of being a vicar is having the chance to get to meet so many people in a local area, and to feel a part of a wider community. Having moved into Yarnton in early July I've been grateful to have these opportunities here, and quickly to feel connected within the neighbourhood. Getting to know people in the local area is a big part of feeling at home, and of being able to flourish. While we have many blessings in modern day Britain, one of the current challenges, which comes up in conversation time and again is that of loneliness and isolation, of not feeling part of a wider community or feeling at home. There was an important church report published earlier this year based on a survey carried out this time last year, where clergy across the country were asked to report what the 'major' and 'significant' problems were in their parishes. Top of this list was loneliness, which 76% of clergy reported as a major problem in their local communities. This was a worrying increase of 18% from a figure of 58% in a survey asking the same questions back in 2011. (Mental health was the next key concern, which increased from 40% in 2011 to 60% in 2017.) The government is well aware of the problem too. It committed to trying to alleviate the problems of loneliness and social isolation at the start of this year, having accepted a series of recommendations from the Jo Cox committee on loneliness. Research shows that more than 9 million people in this country often or always feel lonely; around 200,000 people have not had a conversation with a friend or relative in more than a month; and 85% of disabled young people (aged 18-35) feel lonely. £20 million of funding has since been pledged to support charities and community groups to bring people together. This will surely do a great deal of good, but the efforts of individuals to reach out to and look after their neighbours, and to support and enjoy long-running community groups and organisations will be equally important. How many much valued groups have been kept going through thick and thin by the dedication of one or two volunteers, and been of huge benefit to others!

Having lived in Yarnton for two months, it has been clear that there are very many community groups and organisations meeting regularly and there is a noticeable sense of community spirit and goodwill, and very many people doing a great deal for the good of their neighbours. I counted 20 community groups and organisations meeting at least monthly in Yarnton in the September edition of Yarnton Village News, and I'm sure there are others too. In an age where we know that loneliness and isolation are an often hidden problem in so many areas, how important these groups are. This week members of two organisations have told me they are hoping to draw new members in. The autumn is certainly a good time to join new groups! The church understands itself to be a community that exists to serve God and to serve others. St. Paul speaks of the church as the Body of Christ, where each member is like a different part of the body, and each has an important and literally vital role, even where they appear to be the weaker parts of the body. Together they represent Jesus Christ in the world. It's a good image to show the role that each person has to play in any community simply by belonging, and how much each person matters. At St. Bartholomew's we give thanks for all the community groups existing in our village, and for all those dedicated to serving the common good, and will be praying for them as they carry on their vital work. *Oliver*

**Damaged Bins:** Cherwell District Council will repair damaged bins free of charge. If a bin cannot be repaired they will replace it for free. Bins or caddies that are lost or stolen will be replaced free of charge. Call 01295 227003 to report damaged or missing bins.

**Bottle Banks:** The bottle banks are located in the layby in Cassington Road (opposite Cresswell Road). If the banks are full please take your bottles home, don't leave them or any other rubbish at the sides of the bin – this constitutes fly-tipping. **Public Access Defibrillators:** Defibrillators in the village are located at: Yarnton Village Hall, The Paddocks, OX5 1TE (front of building near front door), Westlake Pharmacy, 75 Spencer Avenue, OX5 1NQ (on side wall), Yarnton Garden Centre, Sandy Lane, OX5 1PA (on right hand side of driveway into garden centre), 1 Park Close (in porch), and Rutten Lane Park (front of pavilion). If you find someone that you think may have had a cardiac arrest phone 999 as usual. The operator will tell you the location of the nearest defibrillator and will stay on the phone to help you if needed whilst paramedics are on their way to you. The defibrillator is useable by any member of the public and gives clear instructions to you.

**Yarnton Village Website/Noticeboards:** The Parish Council notice boards and village website <u>www.yarnton-village.org.uk</u> are where the Parish Council gives up-to-date information on things which are notified at short notices as well as publicising items of importance, so we would actively encourage you to regularly check the notice boards and the website. When possible items of importance will also be posted on Spotted Kidlington/Yarnton and Yarnton Community pages of Facebook. Yarnton Community page is on Facebook to publicise local news and let village organisations publicise events and news.

**Flytipping:** (From CDC website) Flytipping can be dangerous. You can report incidents of fly tipping within Cherwell District online by following the links on their website. Cherwell District Council are responsible for acting on reports of fly tipping to both remove the waste which is on public land and to locate and prosecute the offenders. Where the waste is hazardous the council has a responsibility to ensure public safety until such time as the waste can be removed. It would be helpful with the investigation if the person making the report could leave contact details, so that we are able to confirm location of the fly tip and obtain any further information relating to the incident. Investigations are carried out to obtain any evidence that may help in identifying the offender. Arrangements are then made to clear the waste from public or council land. If the tip is on private land, then the land owner will be responsible for having the waste removed. If a potential fly tip has been found, it would be helpful to report the incident to us as soon as is possible so that any evidence that might still be in place can be obtained.

**Dog Fouling:** It is an offence not to pick up after your dog, but it is also very offensive to members of the public to see dog bags dumped on the ground and in hedges. PLEASE PICK UP DOG MESS IN A BAG AND DEPOSIT IN AN APPROPRIATE PLACE, preferably in one of the 12 dog bins located around the village, but they can also be put into your household green bin if that's preferable to you. If you notice a full dog bin please report to Cherwell District Council

You can report faults linked to amenities or problems that are broken or dirty, damaged or dumped, or need fixing, cleaning or clearing such as: abandoned vehicles, dog fouling, flyposting or graffiti, flytipping or litter, unlit lampposts and potholes.
