Parish Councillors: An election will take place on 2nd May 2019 for 10 Parish Council seats, one more than currently due to the growth of the village since 1987 when the last increase was made. All existing Parish Councillors have to be re-elected if they wish to continue and won't all wish to, so please don't be complacent and think 'There are enough people already, I won't bothe'! We anticipate forms for people to nominate themselves will be available from Cherwell District Council towards the end of March with the closing date for applications being 3rd April. If you think that you might be interested in becoming a Parish Councillor, please contact us on the details above or come to our monthly meeting to find out what's involved. If you want to ensure you don't miss out on receiving a nomination form, please let the Parish Clerk know that you're interested and we will make sure you receive a form when they're available.

Annual Parish Meeting: This will be held on THURSDAY 25th April in the Village Hall starting at 7.30 p.m. Details of guest speaker will follow in April village news. All residents are very welcome to attend.

Parish Precepts 2019: The budget meeting was held on 16th January, when decisions were made on the expenditure and grants for the forthcoming financial year commencing 1st April 2019. The budget total for the precept was £91,194 which resulted in a sum of £78.54 for a Band D property, an increase of £6.37 from the previous year. Grants to local organisations were discussed and the following were successful:

Playing Fields:	£17,500 towards running costs at Littlemarsh and Yarnton Park
Village Hall:	£5,000 towards improving the entrance lobby
Scouts:	£309 to pay for purchase of two pop-up gazebos
Lunch Club	£250 to replace hostess trolley
Netball club	£600 towards cost of setting up a Youth Netball Club
Care Committee	£250 towards annual running costs

OurBusBartons

Begbroke & YarntonGreen Belt Campaign (BYG) £2,000 towards costs of running their bus service to include Yarnton and Kidlington. £4,000 towards cost of transport planning legal expertise ahead of CDC Local Plan Partial Review 'Examination in Public'.

As BYG required money urgently to pay for lawyers before the 'Examination in Public', YPC took the exceptional decision to pay their grant of £4,000 immediately. All other grants will be paid as usual at the start of the new financial year in April 2019. **Graffiti:** Recently there has been an increase in graffiti in the Kidlington/Yarnton area. If you see any please report it to Cherwell DC www.cherwell.gov.uk/info/195/street-cleansing/414/graffiti.

OurBusBartons bus: Please note that passengers using this bus, which operates on Tuesdays, can use local authority concessionary passes. The bus stops in Yarnton and Kidlington twice on Tuesday.

Bottle Banks: The bottle banks are located in the layby in Cassington Road (opposite Cresswell Road). If the banks are full please take your bottles home, don't leave them or any other rubbish at the sides of the bin – this constitutes fly-tipping. A litter bin has now been placed near the bottle banks for normal rubbish (carrier bags, etc.).

Public Access Defibrillators: Defibrillators in the village are located at: Yarnton Village Hall, The Paddocks, OX5 1TE (front of building near front door), Westlake Pharmacy, 75 Spencer Avenue, OX5 1NQ (on side wall), Yarnton Garden Centre, Sandy Lane, OX5 1PA (on right hand side of driveway into garden centre), 1 Park Close (in porch), and Rutten Lane Park (front of pavilion). If you find someone that you think may have had a cardiac arrest phone 999 as usual. The operator will tell you the location of the nearest defibrillator and will stay on the phone to help you if needed whilst paramedics are on their way to you. The defibrillator is useable by any member of the public and gives clear instructions to you.

Yarnton Village Website/Noticeboards: The Parish Council notice boards and village website <u>www.yarnton-village.org.uk</u> are where the Parish Council gives up-to-date information on things which are notified at short notices as well as publicising items of importance, so we would actively encourage you to regularly check the notice boards and the website. When possible items of importance will also be posted on Spotted Kidlington/Yarnton and Yarnton Community pages of Facebook. Yarnton Community page is on Facebook to publicise local news and let village organisations publicise events and news.

Shopping Bus: A fortnightly minibus to Kidlington on a Friday morning 9.45 a.m. – 12.15 p.m. Door-to-door service with help to carry the shopping. £2 per person. Contact Fred Jones, tel. 373871.

Lunch Club: Every Wednesday in the Village Hall 12.30 p.m. – 2.30 p.m. A two-course meal with tea or coffee for just £4. Free transport available for people with limited mobility. A companionable meal in friendly atmosphere. Contact David Poulton, tel. 374158.

Compostable Caddy Bin Liners/Dog bags: Caddy bin liners can still be purchased from the Parish Council Office in the Village Hall on Mondays and Thursdays between 9 a.m. and 11 a.m., or will be delivered by arrangement if more convenient and not possible to collect. The price is £3 (three pounds) per roll of 40 liners. Telephone 378476.

Flytipping: (From CDC website) Flytipping can be dangerous. You can report incidents of fly tipping within Cherwell District online by following the links on their website. Cherwell District Council are responsible for acting on reports of fly tipping to both remove the waste which is on public land and to locate and prosecute the offenders. Where the waste is hazardous the council has a responsibility to ensure public safety until such time as the waste can be removed. It would be helpful with the investigation if the person making the report could leave contact details, so that we are able to confirm location of the fly tip and obtain any further information relating to the incident. Investigations are carried out to obtain any evidence that may help in identifying the offender. Arrangements are then made to clear the waste from public or council land. If the tip is on private land, then the land owner will be responsible for having the waste removed. If a potential fly tip has been found, it would be helpful to report the incident to us as soon as is possible so that any evidence that might still be in place can be obtained.

Dog Fouling: It is an offence not to pick up after your dog, but it is also very offensive to members of the public to see dog bags dumped on the ground and in hedges. PLEASE PICK UP DOG MESS IN A BAG AND DEPOSIT IN AN APPROPRIATE PLACE, preferably in one of the 12 dog bins located around the village, but they can also be put into your household green bin if that's preferable to you. If you notice a full dog bin please report to Cherwell District Council

Fixmystreet website: www.fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk is an easy to use website designed to help Oxfordshire residents to report, view, or discuss local highway faults directly and quickly to Oxfordshire County Council by simply locating them on a map. You can report faults linked to amenities or problems that are broken or dirty, damaged or dumped, or need fixing, cleaning or clearing such as: abandoned vehicles, dog fouling, flyposting or graffiti, flytipping or litter, unlit lampposts and potholes. Neighbourhood Watch

Thefts of handbags and purses have surged across the county, and there have been a number of such incidents in the Kidlington shopping area. Handbags left open, sometimes unattended, on shopping trolleys are easy pickings. Queuing at stalls to be served provides opportunity for pickpockets to dip into bags and pockets. The police offer the usual advice but it's usually common sense and being aware that such incidents do occur in shopping outlets.

Theft of heating oil is rare in this area, but a recent incident nearby highlights the possibility. For those who have oil fired central heating the police advise the following: apply a tank lock, if possible camouflage the tank, install censor lights and use a fuel alarm.

Recent scams include HM Revenue and Customs Alert and TV Licensing emails, both of which are intent on obtaining personal information and bank details. For how to stay safe online, visit <u>www.cyberaware.gov.uk</u>

Theft of expensive cars is prevalent nationwide and a recent incident occurred in Yarnton. These vehicles will often be stolen to order and will have been observed by the offenders prior to the theft. Similar incidents have taken place previously across the Oxfordshire area as a result of a burglary where only the car keys were stolen. Good advice: do not leave keys on the hall table or on view

Wednesday 6th March marks the start of **Lent**, the traditional period of preparation leading up to the celebration of Easter, reflecting the 40 days and nights that Jesus spent in the wilderness before his public ministry began. Lent is a time when many people, not just churchgoers, give things up as a discipline. Giving things up has certainly become more popular in recent years. Outside of Lent, January has become a season for this, with over 4 million people signing up for 'Dry January' this year and 'Veganuary' gaining prominence too.

Lent has always been the special time of fasting for Christians. But why is this the case? Temporarily giving up some of the things we like to eat and drink, has been understood to help focus us on a life lived for God. It also enters those who fast into solidarity with the huge number of people across the world who are hungry throughout the year.

Lent is not about giving up things just for the sake of it. For Christians it is primarily about making space to turn towards God, who turns towards us in Jesus Christ, and allows his love to heal us. In the book of Genesis, God asks Adam, 'Where are you?' Adam has turned away from God and hidden. For Christians, Lent is about looking at the ways we hide from God, who is the source of life and love, and how we distract ourselves and hide from all that makes us fully human. That love and abundant life of God is most fully revealed at the end of Lent, as Jesus goes to the cross, but then is raised from death on Easter Sunday, the victory of love over death and darkness. And when we celebrate Easter, it will certainly be a time to feast!

To mark the start of Lent, on **Ash Wednesday**, **6**th **March** there will be a Eucharist in St. Bartholomew's, with the Imposition of Ashes* at 9.30 a.m., as well as at St. Michael's, Begbroke at 7 p.m. (**Imposition of Ashes is when a sign of the cross is made on the forehead as a reminder of our mortality and our trust in God and his love for us.)*

The third of our new **monthly gatherings** in the **Village Hall** takes place on **Sunday 10th March at 3 p.m**. These are for all ages, using crafts and creative activities to explore the themes of Lent, ending with a short time of prayer and reflection. This month we are delighted that Andrew Hazelden - Yarnton's resident potter - will join us for a live demonstration! Tea, coffee and cake are served, and all are welcome. Children must be accompanied by an adult.

Our **Lent discussion group** will meet on Wednesday evenings at 7.30 p.m. in the Vicarage, beginning on Wednesday 13th March. All are welcome! Please check the website for further details.

Our **History Project group** met for the first time at the end of January, and began to gather together the documents, articles and pamphlets relating to the church. We plan to produce a new booklet detailing the church's history and role in the village, as well as a young person's guide and a history for the website.
