

#### Morris Motors Band 1961, Yarnton Band 2019

In 1959 our band started and our conductor for the past twenty-one years, Guy James was born. Two years later, in 1961 Lord Nuffield had a coach built for his famous works band and he insisted on an extra large boot for the band's instruments; the bus seen above has been restored by the Bus Museum at Long Hanborough.

In April 2019 Guy celebrated his 60<sup>th</sup> birthday and the family booked a private gathering at the Bus Museum, but unbeknown to him the Morris Motors Band bus headed for Yarnton to collect members of the band, and later in the day we played for him amidst the historic vehicles. One of our young members (who loves buses and can name them all!) Ciaran Bird, conducted and we started with Easter March composed by Guy for the band in January 2005. Sadly the Morris Motors Band folded many years ago but we like to think that Lord Nuffield would be delighted with our band using his bus.

Recent exam successes for our younger players are Daniel Taylor (cornet) Grade 6 with merit and Amelia Sherratt (tenor horn) Grade 4 – congratulations to them both.

New music currently being rehearsed includes a selection from 'The Greatest Showman', '500 Miles' and George Gershwin's 'I got rhythm'. You can hear us playing them at Ducklington Big Lunch on 2<sup>nd</sup> June at 1.30 p.m., Ramsden Fete on 8<sup>th</sup> June at 2.15 p.m., Kidlington Churches' Fun Day in the afternoon of 9<sup>th</sup> June, William Fletcher School Fete on 28<sup>th</sup> June at 6.30 p.m. and at Kidlington Parish Church Fete on 29<sup>th</sup> June at 1.40 p.m.

#### **Thy Kingdom Come**

Thy Kingdom Come has become a global movement of prayer that takes place in the ten days prior to the Christian celebration of Pentecost, which falls on 9<sup>th</sup> June this year. This has become a period when churches of different traditions have come together to dedicate themselves to prayer. It picks up on a tradition that goes right back to the beginning of the church. In the *Acts of the Apostles* in the Bible we read that Mary, the mother of Jesus, and his disciples, were present as Jesus ascended to heaven forty days after his resurrection on the first Easter Sunday. The disciples and Mary returned to Jerusalem and devoted themselves to prayer. On the day of Pentecost, fifty days after Easter Sunday, God's Holy Spirit was poured

out on those who gathered. Thereafter the ten days prior to Pentecost became a special time of prayer, for the fresh outpouring of the Spirit of God. Christians understand the Spirit of God to be the Spirit of Love, a gift to be received, which gives the strength to live a life of self giving love, seen perfectly only in Jesus.

Dogs in Rutten Lane Park: Recently we have received reports of dogs being taken into the Park despite notices on all entrances saying 'No Dogs Allowed'. It would be appreciated if all owners could respect this rule please to avoid dog mess in the park potentially causing unpleasantness and health and safety risk to all users of the park, including children in the play area and boys' football teams.

Dog Fouling: It is an offence not to pick up after your dog, but it is also very offensive to members of the public to see dog bags dumped on the ground and in hedges. PLEASE PICK UP DOG MESS IN A BAG AND DEPOSIT IN AN APPROPRIATE PLACE, preferably in one of the 12 dog bins located around the village, but they can also be put into your household green bin if that's preferable to you. If you find someone that you think may have had a cardiac arrest phone 999 as usual. The operator will tell you the location of the nearest defibrillator and will stay on the phone to help you if needed whilst paramedics are on their way to you. The defibrillator is useable by any member of the public and gives clear instructions to you.

The price is £3 (three pounds) per roll of 40 liners. Telephone 378476.

Flytipping: (From CDC website) Flytipping can be dangerous. You can report incidents of fly tipping within Cherwell District online by following the links on their website. Cherwell District Council are responsible for acting on reports of fly tipping to both remove the waste which is on public land and to locate and prosecute the offenders. Where the waste is hazardous the council has a responsibility to ensure public safety until such time as the waste can be removed. It would be helpful with the investigation if the person making the report could leave contact details, so that we are able to confirm location of the fly tip and obtain any further information relating to the incident. Investigations are carried out to obtain any evidence that may help in identifying the offender. Arrangements are then made to clear the waste from public or council land. If the tip is on private land, then the land owner will be responsible for having the waste removed. If a potential fly tip has been found, it would be helpful to report the incident to us as soon as is possible so that any evidence that might still be in place can be obtained.

**Fixmystreet website:** www.fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk is an easy to use website designed to help Oxfordshire residents to report, view, or discuss local highway faults directly and quickly to Oxfordshire County Council by simply locating them on a map. You can report faults linked to amenities or problems that are broken or dirty, damaged or dumped, or need fixing, cleaning or clearing such as: abandoned vehicles, dog fouling, flyposting or graffiti, flytipping or litter, unlit lampposts and potholes. Please make use of this website if you think anything in the village needs reporting, as by using the website you can see if it has already been reported and any update applicable.

**Damaged Bins:** Cherwell District Council will repair damaged bins free of charge. If a bin cannot be repaired they will replace it for free. Bins or caddies that are lost or stolen will be replaced free of charge. Call 01295 227003 to report damaged or missing bins.

#### **Macular Society, Kidlington**


Instead of our normal meeting on Tuesday  $25^{th}$  June, we are holding a coffee morning in order to try and raise some money towards the Macular Society's research programme.


