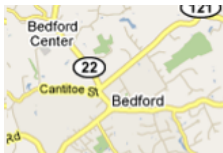

Black history beyond February
 Schools incorporate dance, poetry, movies, books and discussions

 Most of us know the highlights of Black history as they unfold in the pages of textbooks. But in Westchester County schools, the story of the African American experience is being taught in a more holistic way. From dance to poetry to movies to books, educators are finding creative ways to engage students in the rich and varied contributions of Black Americans to the past and present.

At the University of the Sacred Heart in Yonkers, students are studying the life of Frederick Douglass, a prominent abolitionist and orator. In the classroom, students are reading his autobiography, "Life in the Lowly Cabin," and watching the movie "Frederick Douglass." They are also participating in a play that depicts his life.

In the same way, students at the University of the Sacred Heart are learning about the life of Harriet Tubman, a brave slave who escaped and then helped other slaves to freedom. They are reading her story, watching a video, and participating in a role-play.

At the University of the Sacred Heart, students are also learning about the life of Martin Luther King Jr., a leader in the civil rights movement. They are reading his "I Have a Dream" speech, watching a video, and participating in a role-play.

These are just a few of the ways that Westchester County schools are incorporating Black history into their curriculum. By using a variety of methods, educators are helping students to gain a deeper understanding of the African American experience and its impact on the world.
