Special Fork Answers What to Cook for Dinner

Free Mobile Website works with iPhone, Android Phones and Blackberry

It's 4 p.m. Do you know what to cook for dinner? Special Fork, a new free mobile recipe website, gives tasty answers via the iPhone, Android phones, Blackberry and all other smartphones. All recipes are professionally developed and take 30 minutes or less of prep time. Just open your Internet browser and go to www.specialfork.com.

Special Fork's goal is to deliver a recipe, customized to the user's preference, in 60 seconds from start of search. Each search generates a preview page with multiple recipes that show prep time, cook time, level of difficulty and any special equipment requirements. This enables users to skim the information to decide whether to select the recipe for review or move on to the next selection.

Additional Special Fork Features

Once a recipe is chosen, it can be emailed to the user's home computer or shared with others via Twitter and Facebook. And it's easy to generate a shopping list for the recipe on the mobile phone with one click of a button. If the person who selects the recipes isn't the shopper, the list can be emailed to whoever buys the groceries.

Special Fork also provides a two-tiered recipe box to hold the user's go-to recipes in one section and recipes the user would like to try later in another section. This feature encourages browsing recipes during leisure time, since appealing recipes can be saved and easily accessed to cook another day.

Special Fork posts a new daily food blog Monday through Friday. The site also features how-to videos, and selection and storage information for meats, produce and grocery items.

While Special Fork was designed as a mobile website to be the on-the-go answer to what's for dinner, a conventional site is also available. When the consumer goes to www.specialfork.com, the server will deliver the appropriate site – mobile or conventional – by recognizing whether the consumer is using a smartphone or regular computer. The site can also be accessed on the iPad.

Since Special Fork is a mobile website and not an app, it integrates all information so recipes saved in a recipe box on a Blackberry will be viewable on the iPad, iPhone or Android phone, and on the consumer's home or office computer.
