the gift, the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes lying in a lowly manger.

This was no ordinary babe. Verily man, verily God, Mary held within her arms her own savior, the Creator of all worlds. Is not the gift unspeakable?

Every gift has its price. The unspeakable gift cost the Father an unspeakable price: His only begotten Son. It came from the heart of a loving God. Who could comprehend it? Even in its price, the gift was unspeakable.

But the gift was not appreciated. As a babe it was hunted by kings and soldiers. As a man, the gift was rejected by his own. The gift was spat upon, ridiculed, beaten, despised, rejected and ultimately crucified. But this did not diminish the value of the gift. It only added to its beauty. Is not this unspeakable?

The gift was not without significance. Amidst the proclamation of the majestic event, the purpose of the gift was disclosed by the angelic chorus, "A Saviour, which is Christ the Lord". Sin is addressed here! The purpose: A Saviour. God has come to us, in human form, to save sinners. There was really no other way. The law couldn't do it; the priests could not do it; the tabernacle could not do it; the god of the temple could not do it; the blood of bulls and goats could not do it; their religion could not do it; but the gift, He will do it. Unspeakable!

It is certain that the gift was not offered to man. It was man that crucified the gift. Therefore, we are most thankful the gift was not entrusted to man. As with the types and shadows of the gift in the Old Testament, so

we observe with the gift. The wave offering, the heave offering, the bull and the goat, were they not all offered to God for a particular people? After all, they sought Jehovah's approval and acceptance, not man's. And did not these offerings, when accepted by Jehovah, sanctify the exact people for whom they were offered? Therefore, the gift was offered to God for man, not to man for man. Paul said it like this, "And walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and hath given himself for us an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweetsmelling savour" – Ephesians 5:2......for us....to God. That was the order of the gift. It should be observed as such today.

If accepted by the Father, the purpose of he gift would be achieved. The people for whom He died would be sanctified, set apart, His blood atoning for their sin. And behold, we now see the gift through the eye of faith. He has risen from the grave. The angels are present once again to speak concerning the gift, "he is not here: for he is risen, as he said. Come, see the place where the Lord lay" – Mathew 28:6. We see the gift stand before the Father with His garments dipped in blood saying, "Behold, I and the children which God has given me". The purpose of the gift unfolds as His victory is certain. But our question today is this: "Was the gift offered for you?" If it was, you may say with us, "Thanks be to God for His unspeakable gift."

"Too often, idolatry is the pursuit of something that is otherwise good. That's what makes idolatry so tricky. Idolatry is enslavement to something we love. We love our spouse, our kids, our job, our health, our hobbies...all of which is perfectly fine" (Resisting Idols by Mark Driscoll). I like the way this man widened my perception of idolatry. Very few of us have golden calves, totem poles, or statues in our homes and church buildings, but we have idols.

Let's say a person defines Hell as being poor. His/her idol might be work, money, or budgeting. Work and money become this person's functional savior, saving them from their Hell. Let's say another person defines Hell as being unattractive. Their idol might be makeup, clothing, exercise and/or diet. When fear of our "hells" cause us to choose saviors other than God, we become idolaters. And the thing we chose is our idol.

Consider King Saul. What was his idol? Saul had many shortcomings but graven images, groves, and Baal were not among them. But Saul had an idol. What was it? To answer this question we must address Saul's greatest fear. Saul feared losing prominence. Maintaining prestige was behind many of Saul's irrational behaviors (I Sa 15:28-30, 18:7-11, 19:8-10, 20:30-33, 22:13-16). Status was Saul's functional savior; it was his idol.

What advice might help such a man? I suspect Saul would have been a whole lot better off if he could have ever grabbed hold of the concept: I am not important, except for who I am in the Lord. Saul would have cast down his idol the moment he realized that his status in the Lord was the only status that mattered. And thus it is with us. May Jesus become our functional savior, in all areas of our lives.
