## How can you host a Horse Sense to You workshop?

First, you choose which program you'd like to host (or call us to talk through your ideas for customization!). Then, contact us about the dates you'd like to reserve. Once we've agreed on a date that works, send in your deposit and the workshop will be listed on the Horse Sense calendar!

## What does hosting a Horse Sense to you workshop entail?

As a host, you get a free registration(s) in exchange for managing the event details for the workshop.

These details include:

- *Securing the facility for the workshop*
- *Handling registration logistics and participant questions/needs. Horse Sense will get you a link for online payment, and then we'll connect with you as registrations come in*
- *Providing necessary arena props/training materials (folders/AV material, horses, cones, poles, etc.)*
- *Providing snacks and meals. For lunches you can ask participants to bring a sack lunch, or you can provide that, as you wish. For snacks we ask that you provide water and fresh fruit throughout the day for participants & facilitators*
- *Handling appropriate releases required by the facility*
- *Handling check-in and participation orientation at facility*
- *Marketing the event will be shared between Horse Sense and the host*

## Participant Requirements

When 9 people register and pay to attend the **Horse Sense to You** workshop, then the host site will receive one free registration. If 19 people register and pay, the host site will receive two free registrations. We request that registration be limited 25 attendees, to ensure an optimal educational experience for everyone.

## Facility Requirements

The facility for these workshops must be able to offer adequate parking for the Horse Sense staff and workshop participants. For any classroom sections of trainings we will need a comfortable place to seat at least 27 people and a place for everyone to use the restroom. For the experiential segments, we will require a safe location to work with horses in small groups & a place for everyone to use the restroom.

## Horse Requirements

We can play with just about any herd, but ask that stallions & mares in heat not be part of the herd we present with. We like to have at least 4 horses available at any time, in good general health. Please feel free to connect with us directly with any questions you have about the suitability of your herd!

## How Much Does Horse Sense to You Cost?

## Holding Dates and Security Deposit

There is a **\$500 deposit** needed to hold any workshop date(s). Once the deposit has been received, your dates will be confirmed and placed on our calendar and on our website. This deposit is fully refundable with at least 30 days notice from scheduled event. Less than 30 days from the event, the deposit is non-refundable.

## **Adding on Consultations to the Workshop**

If you have programs or individuals who wish it, you can always add an extra day or half-day on to your workshop for private 1-on-1 consultations, either for business planning or for assessing your herd/facilities. Three (3) consults of at least 1 hour each are needed to fill a 1/2 day; 6 consults of at least 1 hour each are needed to fill a full day.
