





Santa Hat Mini Quilt

You will need

- 6" x 17" fusible web, cut into (1) 2" x 8" strip and (15) 2" squares
- (15) 2" squares of assorted hat fabrics (red)
- (1) 2" x 8" strip of cuff fabric (white)
- (15) buttons approx. 1/3"
- (1) FQ main fabric
- (1) FQ backing fabric
- 15" x 16" piece of batting
- 60" ribbon trim approx. 1/2" wide, cut into (4) 15" lengths

To Make the Hats

 Using the hat templates, trace one hat triangle onto each of the 2" fusible web squares. Fuse one square to the wrong side of each red hat fabric square. Cut out each hat along the traced lines on the fusible web. Gently peel the paper backing away. Set the hats aside.

- Using the cuff template, trace 15 cuffs onto the 2" strip of fusible web. Fuse the strip to the wrong side of the cuff fabric. Cut out the 15 cuffs and peel the paper backing away.
- Using the layout on page 2, position & center the triangles onto the main fabric. Fuse in place.
 Machine stitch the sides of the hat (no need to stitch the bottom edge - it will be covered with the cuff.
- Position the cuffs, fuse and machine stitch in place.

To Assemble the Quilt

- Lay the hats panel onto the batting. Quilt as desired.
- Apply the ribbon trim around the hats, leaving 1/2" space between the edges of the design and the edge of the ribbon. Either fuse or stitch in place.
- Trim the quilt on all sides with 1-1/2" border from the outer edge of the ribbon, approx. 13-1/4" x 14-1/2", depending on the width of the ribbon.
- Trim the backing piece to the same size as the front.
 With right sides together, lay the quilted front and back with right sides together. Sew around the edge, leaving a 4" opening along the bottom edge.
- Turn the quilt right side out, press, & stitch the opening closed.
- Glue or stitch a button onto each hat.
